

It's Fire Season!

Brea Fire reminds residents that fire season is a year-round occurrence in Southern California. Wildland fire danger is especially high during this very dry, hot season. Get prepared!



Create defensible space

- Clear dead foliage from roof and gutters
- Install a 1/4 inch mesh chimney screen
- Trim large trees ten feet from chimneys
- Install noncombustible roof and enclose eaves
- Use extreme caution with BBQ's, smoking, or open flames

In case of evacuation:

- Create a plan with designated meeting place and common contact numbers.
- Prepare for evacuating pets. Crates and leashes are critical.

- Focus on valuables:
key documents, jewelry,
photos, etc.
