





Holiday trees will be collected and recycled Dec. 27-Jan. 7. When disposing of holiday trees, please observe the following guidelines.

- ✓ Remove tree stand along with all decorations.
- ✓ Cut up natural trees and place in brown yard waste container.
- ✓ If tree is over 6 feet in height, it can be cut in half and placed at curbside.
- ✓ Trees in **bags** or with **flocking** are **NOT** recyclable. Cut and place in black trash container or, if extra large, schedule a bulky item pick-up.

Winter Months Demand Continued Water Conservation

California remains in drought, which is a persistent reality for six years running. According to the U.S. Drought Monitor, over 62% of the State remains in a severe to exceptional drought condition. Five years of normal to heavy rainfall is needed to replenish depleted groundwater and reservoirs.

State and regional water authorities did relax emergency related messaging that defined 2015 in hopes that consumers had adapted to a new “normal” of limited supply. Indeed, since last year many consumers did reduce water use and continue to practice efficiency.

However, without mandatory percentage cuts, far too many others fell back into old patterns. Water consumption once again increased. Should such habits persist, there are concerns about next steps. Under the original State drought declaration, still in effect, the Governor has authority to re-impose mandatory conservation with 10 days’ notice. Because long-term solutions will be complex, continued voluntary conservation is the most immediate action to take.

For Brea, Phase 2 water restrictions remain in effect. Most effectively, this includes restrictions for outdoor irrigation. From November 1 through March 31, automated outdoor irrigation can only be scheduled for Mondays. As always, never water between 10 a.m. and 4 p.m.

Brea Street Sweeping Provides Numerous Benefits

It takes only a few minutes, but your weekly street sweep provides benefits few may consider. With regular trash removal, the community not only keeps looking good, but its overall health is improved.

By keeping street trash from entering the watershed and preventing buildup of dirt and debris in the storm drain system, Brea eliminates a major source of pollutants. In addition, it prevents blockages and overflow under periodic storm conditions. The City also meets stringent requirements under the National Pollution Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) which carries heavy fines for non-compliance.

Residents assist by removing cars from the street during the posted two-hour parking restriction window for their neighborhood. Thus, quick, efficient sweeps are possible. The Public Works Department makes every effort to minimize inconvenience, but there still may be temporary situations that prevent compliance. Those with a short-term request can simply notify the Brea Police Department at 714-990-7911 at least 24 hours in advance of a scheduled sweeping to be exempted. This allows for construction, home services or delivery situations.

Those with a unique longer term situation can request a permit from Public Works. General criteria to qualify for a parking exemption includes completing a permit application, parking only in front of your own home, and paying an annual \$20 processing fee. BOUSD Students Continue to Grow and Excel

Results of the 2016 Smarter Balanced Assessment Consortium tests showed that student scores throughout the Brea Olinda Unified School District (BOUSD) showed improvement in two key areas. Now in its second year, the Smarter Balanced assessments for BOUSD in standardized tests for English language arts showed that 67 percent of BOUSD students met or exceeded standards as compared to 57 percent in Orange County and 49 percent in California. In standardized tests for mathematics, 59 percent of BOUSD students met or exceeded standards compared to 48 percent in Orange County and 37 percent in California. BOUSD’s subgroups—English learners, socioeconomically disadvantaged and Hispanic/Latino—also remain above the state and Orange County averages.

Statewide assessments provide valuable information about overall student progress and areas for improvement, but they do not provide a holistic view of student achievement. Therefore, the District evaluates students



throughout the school year to provide support to students who require additional development or enrichment. Positive growth in grade levels throughout the district is a good indication that the collaborative efforts of teachers and staff, and the dedication of Brea students, are allowing the District to move in the right direction. There is still a lot of work to be done, and

Brea’s educators will not shy away from that challenge. The District is committed to the continued growth of all Brea students to prepare them for successful futures in a 21st-century world.
