September Is National Preparedness Month



The City of Brea knows how to have fun, but it also knows when to get serious. During the month of September people will be taking National Preparedness to heart, knowing it's

much easier to relax and enjoy life after you've first taken basic steps to be safe.

City staff will refresh training and conduct a drill to improve their ability to serve the public in case of emergencies. In Brea homes, churches and businesses people are also strongly encouraged to review their own emergency plans. All are invited to take action during National Preparedness Month. Here's what you can do:

- **Get a kit, make a plan.** Visit *ReadyOC.org*. It's a one-stop shop for useful information.
- **Register at *AlertOC.com*** — This is your local emergency notification service. The annual call out test will be on September 24 at 10 a.m.
- **Attend the Wildfire Awareness Fair** — Saturday, September 14, 10 a.m.-2 p.m. at Western Hills Park, 16231 Canon Lane, Chino Hills, Presented by the Carbon Canyon Fire Safe Council 909-902-5280

- **Sign up for CERT.** Classes for the next free 20-hour course start on October 8. Details and registration form are at *cityofbrea.net*
- **Register to participate** in the statewide earthquake drill on October 17 at 10:17 a.m. Log onto *shakeout.org*


Sharing the Property Tax Pie

At this time of year, the pile of bills for homeowners includes their latest property tax statement. Depending on the value of a particular home and the length of ownership, these bills vary widely. Before you pull out the checkbook, perhaps take a moment and consider how your property tax money will be distributed once it is sent into the County of Orange.

As illustrated, schools receive the greatest portion of proceeds, followed by the county, which provides such services as flood control, libraries, transportation, vector control, harbors and beaches. On average cities get about 21% as the share returned to them. This becomes their base for providing other essentials residents need and expect from cities such as public safety, sewer and water, local roads and community parks.

Using the example here, this homeowner pays less than \$70 a month towards the cost of living in Brea. Of course, the actual value of services provided to them will far exceed this amount. The high quality of life enjoyed here would not be possible if it were not for the fact that Brea has worked hard to develop additional income streams. Diversified commerce makes the city a business hub and sales tax has grown into a larger funding source than property taxes. City leaders constantly look ahead to keep balance in new development and assure that the burden of providing new infrastructure, safety and human services can be covered.



Art Reflects Brea's Aviation History

To celebrate the vibrant history of Brea, mosaic artist Marlo Bartels was contracted by Jamboree Housing, builders of Birch Hills Affordable Apartments, to create several art pieces. The result combines color, function and a definite spark for conversation. This installation can connect newcomers with the storied past near the site.

Six tiled pictorial columns reflect oranges, lupines, and poppies signifying the beauty of Brea's natural landscape. An adjacent 25-foot seating wall carries images of some thrill-seeking pilots who once called Brea home.

Beginning in 1917 the Brea Aviation Field served as the first training ground of its kind for military pilots during World War I. Then the epicenter for traveling "barnstormers," such as the famous Eddie Rickenbacker, Brea drew pilots from far and wide to show off their flying skills to local spectators. In October 1925 the Brea Air Club sponsored Orange County's first air show with a crowd of 5,000 spectators gathered to enjoy the performances of 60 different aircrafts.

New National System: Wireless Emergency Alert

Wireless Emergency Alerts (WEA) are public safety messages delivered via cell phones. In place since 2012, these life-saving messages are geographically targeted to a region via cell tower and come directly from authorized state and local public safety agencies. There is no cost associated with these messages.

There are three types of WEA alerts:

- **Presidential** — Alerts issued by the President or a designee
- **Imminent Threat** — Alerts that include severe man-made or natural disasters, such as earthquakes or tornados, where an imminent threat to life or property exists
- **Amber Alerts** — Alerts that meet the U.S. Department of Justice's criteria to help law enforcement locate an abducted child

New cell phones have these features turned on automatically. Although users can choose to turn them off, you are strongly encouraged to leave them on in order to receive such important messages. These, combined with local systems such as AlertOC, are a vital part of emergency communications to the public.

Specialized Truck Delivers Effective Sewer Maintenance



Few like to think about the dirty work that goes on under urban streets. However, sanitation tasks related to sewer maintenance are vitally important to community health. Public Works is aided in this responsibility

by specialized equipment. None is more important than the Vactor truck.

The old Vactor of ten years and 100,000 plus miles has recently been replaced. This is a vehicle used for cleaning and maintaining the storm drains and sewer mainline portions of the city's underground infrastructure. It is the main workhorse in preventing sanitary sewer overflows and for cleaning spills and debris that have the potential of entering the city's storm drain system.

Sewer maintenance is a big job that requires a big piece of equipment. The Public Works' crew maintains 2,650 sewer manholes, 109 miles of sewer mainline, and 940 storm drain catch basins. The old truck will still be kept in reserve and can be utilized for dig outs around utilities when making water line repairs.

Flex Alerts would be issued by the State to provide early warning of possible electricity outages. You must take action if this happens.


1. Turn off unneeded lights, computers and appliances.

Sniffing Out Dog Park Details

Brea's next new park is sure to be a big hit with four-legged friends. After much anticipation, construction is now underway to build Wildcatters Dog Park at the southwest corner of Santa Fe and Valencia. This dedicated space is expected to open in January 2014 after allowing a necessary period for new plantings to establish.

Park design includes many amenities suggested by community engagement efforts in September-October 2012. These include a double-gate entry, drinking fountains for both humans and dogs, trees for shade, benches and picnic tables. Large dogs will have almost an acre of room to run (almost the size of a football field) while the small dogs can enjoy more secure play in an area just under a third of an acre.

Construction is underway to prepare for concrete walkways and installation of deposited granite areas. Fencing has been placed and additional trees will be planted to augment mature vegetation already in the area. Pet owners will soon be rewarded for their patience with the progress. 06/18/13 Recap

Vacancy Recruitment

Approved timeline for Planning Commission unscheduled vacancy recruitment process and appointed Mayor Garcia and Council Member Marick to serve on the interview panel.

Energy Award

Received the Southern California Edison Energy Leader Partnership Platinum award from Orange County Region Account Manager, Rick Raskin.

Santa Fe Speed Control

Introduced an ordinance declaring Santa Fe Road to be subject to the California Vehicle Code.

Firefighter Positions

Amended the position allocation list to remove 18 part-time reserve firefighter positions and add three full-time firefighter positions for a General Fund savings of \$101,983.

Historic Properties

Brea Boulevard Traffic Synchronization

Approved cooperative agreement with the City of Fullerton for design and construction of Brea Boulevard Traffic Signal Synchronization to enhance countywide traffic flow and reduce congestion. Estimated costs for Brea portion is \$180,200 from Measure M2 TSSP and \$69,800 from Traffic Impact fees.

Exploring Brea's New Website

The new website for the City of Brea is only a couple of months old. During development stages, a professional consultant who has worked with thousands of cities throughout the nation, noted that Brea carries a depth of content that is more typical of cities at least twice our size. Public users continue to explore improved features on *cityofbrea.net* and, behind the scenes, staff keeps working to update and improve content and functionality.

Current options make it possible to do a great number of things. Here are just two notable highlights. Both are feature "buttons" appearing across a horizontal band on the home page, or along a side column as you search inside pages.

- **Notify Me** — Select this and sign up to receive notices, either by email or text, as new items are posted in the categories offered. Receive council meeting agendas, periodic City Manager updates known as "City Focus" and the Brea Line.
- **Online Services** — This provides a shortcut so you can quickly find a number of practical city transactions; register for a class, pay a water bill, report a non-emergency crime, check on a building permit and more.

One popular carry-over from the old site is "Tell Us." This feature has become even more efficient. Comments or questions are now instantly directed to the relevant city department rather than being centrally compiled and re-routed. They are also tracked internally to assure responses have been made.

The next time you need to do city business be sure to check out the website *cityofbrea.net* to see if you can save a trip to city hall. Along the way you just may discover some other facts about all the interesting things that are happening in Brea.
