Lambert Road Construction Will Require Extra Cautious Driving

Through April of 2014, several overlapping construction projects will be undertaken along Lambert Road. Rather than scheduling multiple projects sequentially over many months, a joint approach is being used. This condenses the overall time period during which motorists will be impacted by temporary delays along Lambert. Everyone is asked to be extra alert and patient as crews are working.

Millions of dollars are being invested in the road's infrastructure and underground utilities that serve adjacent areas. The huge challenge is expediting separate construction projects while controlling disruptions to the travelling public. With coordinated scheduling, plus added Saturday work hours for contractors, the duration of inconvenience for motorists can be reduced.

Following Southern California Edison's underground installations

on western sections of Lambert over the past year, street resurfacing is needed. However, before proceeding, City engineers have looked ahead to determine what other capital improvements are also due that will be impacting Lambert. Projects for coordination include:

- Underground sewer lines must be upgraded at Lambert and Berry.
- Higher capacity storm drains need to be installed between Berry and Tamarack, and also between Cliffwood and State College.
- Traffic signal synchronization requires installation of fiber optic communications crossing in the vicinity of State College and Pointe Drive.
- Another project rehabilitates roadway from Delta Avenue to State College.
- Besides an overlay of new asphalt pavement following each of these

projects, any uplifted curb, gutter and sidewalk sections will be repaired and ADA ramps will be placed at several locations.

These all amount to major work that easily would have taken yet another year if stretched out for each individual project to occur sequentially.

Engineers and construction managers will be consolidating processes however possible. The more disruptive procedures will be scheduled between morning and afternoon peak traffic and also to avoid heavy shopping weekends near the holidays.

Despite all the coordination efforts, slow-downs are inevitable. Again, all drivers are asked to practice patience and be observant of safety signs. Please allow the contractors to remain focused and on task by offering your full cooperation.

Include Fire Safety in Celebration


As you deck the halls and break out the buffets for your guests, be sure to put fire safety into the mix. Here are reminders so that your celebration doesn't go sour.

- Carefully choose a fresh tree, and before placing into a stand, cut 2 inches from the base.
- Add water to cut trees daily.
- Locate at least three feet from any heat source like fireplace, vents and lights. Never block an exit.
- Connect no more than three strands of minis or a maximum of 50 screw-in bulbs to a singular electrical plug.
- Turn off lights before leaving home or going to bed.
- Candles and fireplaces require caution. Be sure they are tended to at all times once lit.

- ✓ Remove tree stand along with all decorations.
- ✓ Cut up natural trees and place in brown yard waste container.
- ✓ If tree is over 6 feet in height, it can be cut in half and placed at curb.
- ✓ Trees in bags or with flocking are NOT recyclable. Cut and place in black trash container or, if extra large, schedule a bulky item pick-up.

Winter Irrigation Limit Is In Effect

It's time to dial back your lawn sprinklers! From November through March, automated outdoor lawn irrigation is restricted to only one day weekly per Brea's conservation ordinance. You may hand water gardens during dry spells.



As a reminder, throughout the year, automated outdoor irrigation is always prohibited between 10 a.m. and 4 p.m. when evaporation rates are highest. Whenever you water there should never be excess flowing over curbs and into the storm drains. This is indicative of excessive water use.

The past rainy season was well below averages and projections so far are that another low year is ahead. To protect water supplies for the long term, conservation must be practiced by all. Since the largest quantities are consumed for landscaping, this is an important place to cut back.
