Commissioners Provide Valuable Citizen Input for Brea

The City accepts informal input at any time from residents and businesses through a number of channels. An important ongoing source of formal input is provided by citizen commissioners and committee members. Three standing commissions are especially important as a bridge between the public and elected officials, who appoint them to help represent resident interests. Additional support is also provided through the work of several specialized committees: the Investment Advisory Board, Art in Public Places and Traffic Committees.

Commissioners meet on a monthly basis while committee members may have varied meeting times depending on the issues at hand. Both types of bodies act in an advisory role to the City Council. As a public organization, the City of Brea routinely provides details on all its operations, including these groups. Thus, related meeting agendas and minutes can be found on the City website.

People who serve in these roles are unpaid volunteers. Their terms are multi-year commitments that are staggered. Four committee openings are anticipated to be filled early in 2014. Interested persons are encouraged to learn more about Commissions and Committees by visiting cityofbrea.net where you can find a link under "Your Government." If you are possibly interested in future service on a commission or committee, please download the application and place it on file at the City Clerk's office to be considered in the next round of interviews.

- **The Planning Commission** is a critical part of the development process. By State law, the five-member panel is authorized to approve proposals and issue variances. Working with the professional staff they examine permitting or code requirements related to a particular development proposal. They conduct public hearings to assure that Brea's built environment conforms to community standards. For major project proposals, the Planning Commission will study all options and take a position prior to the City Council review and approval.

- **The Parks, Recreation & Human Services Commission** works to meet community needs through programming recommendations for City facilities and parks. Brea has much to offer in response to high resident expectations. This commission helps to attract support for programs that are relevant to a high quality of life. They sometimes collaborate with outside organizations to provide additional sports, recreation and social services for residents.

Brea's New Fire Station Prioritizes Canyon Protection

Residents of Olinda Village and Hollydale in Carbon Canyon will enjoy an important neighborhood enhancement once the Brea Fire Department moves into a brand new facility. Despite a few unexpected construction complications, the project keeps moving ahead and the site is shaping up nicely. Move-in is anticipated later this spring.

The new Fire Station 4 will include a 1,800 square-foot modular building as living space paired with a separate structure to house fire apparatus. The old station served this wild land interface zone for many years out of a run-down store front location. The new facility will soon provide updated live/work space for crews and can accommodate more firefighters during high risk periods. Plus, it incorporates numerous energy saving and earth friendly features to compliment the natural environment of its setting.

Not surprisingly, emergency preparedness is a very high priority for area residents. The new station also includes space for a container that can be accessed by trained community CERT volunteers who support the safety goals of professional responders.



Award-Winning Birch Hills Apartments Welcome Residents

Another Brea workforce housing success story was dedicated in November when Birch Hills Apartments celebrated its grand opening. More than 100 guests were in attendance including many State, County and Federal Housing and Urban Development Department officials.

In recognition of outstanding results, this beautiful project garnered several prestigious awards. The City of Brea added to recognition as a Platinum-certified Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design (LEED) by presenting its "Green Life, Green Brea" sustainability award. In addition, the Orange County section of the American Planning Association presented the 2013 Outstanding Planning Project Award to commend the design quality reflected by Birch Hills. The Orange County Business Council added to honors with an award for the unique and effective partnership with Jamboree Housing, the former Brea Redevelopment Agency and Chevron, who developed the site as part of its La Floresta master plan.

The 115-unit complex is fully occupied with residents who applied and were qualified through Jamboree. This non-profit corporation is renowned for its innovative approach to building partnerships, obtaining financing and overseeing construction in a cost-effective manner that has brought over 200 high quality affordable homes into Brea. Another recent project was Bonterra in the new Blackstone neighborhood.

Tracks at Brea Trail Prepares for Site Work



A vision remains firm and behind-the-scenes effort is steady to create the future “Tracks at Brea

Trail.” The overall process has taken extra time due to many complex requirements from various jurisdictional agencies.

Approval from the Orange County Flood Control District is currently in progress for the trail segment along the Loftus Channel. Federal grants have required compliance reports for the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) and the National Historic Preservation Act (NHPA). These in-depth reports are intended to protect the environment and preserve historical and archaeological sites. Reports have now been completed and are under review by the State of California.

Once approvals are received, the City can then begin a Public Works bid process for soil remediation and trail construction. Meanwhile, a new landscape architect, award-winning David Evans and Associates, is on board designing trail segment 3.

Based on available grant funding, the trail is being developed in several segments. Now that redevelopment is no longer a funding option, grant writing efforts by Brea staff continue. So far, 16 grants worth over \$6.5 million have been received! Yet, still more money will be required to fund all phases of the four-mile trail. Submitted, pending grant applications could potentially yield an additional \$2.9 million for the project.


What’s next? Construction is planned to begin in 2014 between Brea Boulevard and State College (Segment 3) and also along the Loftus Channel east to Valencia Avenue (Segment 6.) As part of the reconfiguration and upgrade of Birch Hills Golf Course, Chevron is developing Segment 5 which may also open in 2014.

Register into the mass notification system to be contacted via phone, email or text should an emergency threaten your Brea home or business.

For those already registered, be sure to update any contact information that has changed. Go to alertoc.com.

Only landline phones are included automatically in this system. Log in to add your cell phone, work phones and email. You can register everyone in the family to be sure you all stay informed during emergencies.

Get Ready For Emergencies and Pack Your Gear!

Each household and business needs to make the effort to become prepared. Having a plan and stocking up on supplies will add to your comfort and safety during an earthquake, fire or other emergency situation. Store enough supplies for at least 72 hours. Establish your options for evacuation and family communications. Identify an out-of-state point of contact.

Supplies Checklist

Essentials:

- Water – 1 gallon per person per day
- Water purification kit
- First aid kit freshly stocked
- First aid book
- Non-perishable foods
- Can opener (non-electric)
- Blankets or sleeping bags
- Portable radio, flashlight and batteries
- Essential medications
- Extra eyeglasses and keys
- Fire extinguisher – ABC type
- Cash and change
- Pet supplies
- Baby supplies – disposable diapers, wipes, formula, clothing, etc...



Cooking:

- Plastic knives, forks, spoons
- Paper plates and cups
- Paper towels
- Heavy-duty aluminum foil
- Camping stove for outdoor cooking (always check for gas leaks first)



Sanitation:

- Large plastic trash bags for waste; to use as tarps and rain ponchos
- Large trash cans
- Bar soap and liquid detergent
- Toothpaste and toothbrushes
- Shampoo
- Toilet paper
- Household bleach
- Feminine hygiene supplies



Safety and Comfort:

- Sturdy shoes
- Heavy gloves for clearing debris
- Candles and matches, light sticks
- Change of clothing
- Knife or razor blades
- Garden hose for siphoning or firefighting
- Tent
- Paper, pen, stamps



Tools and supplies:

- Axe, shovel, broom
- Adjustable wrench for turning off gas
- Tool kit with screwdriver, pliers and hammer
- Coil of 1/2" rope
- Plastic tape, staple gun and sheeting for window coverage
- Bicycle
- Maps



Water Conservation Essential for Continuing Drought Conditions

According to The Weather Channel, 84 percent of California is categorized in severe drought and 2013 is the driest period on record since 1895. Several key storage reservoirs are at less than 40 percent capacity. In late November, the California Department of Water Resources (DWR) reduced allocation to only five percent for the water agencies who receive water from the State Water Project. These agencies serve 25 million people, businesses and farms. In Southern California, about 30 percent of water comes from this source.

Even if the winter forecast changes, serious supply issues remain. Reservoirs need to be replenished to replace storage that now is rapidly being drawn down. The situation underscores an urgent need to modernize the water delivery system in order to have more reliable supplies and more flexible water operations.

The City of Brea has wisely diversified its water sources to also include access to groundwater. However, it still is impacted by the drought conditions that affect the entire region. After all, rainwater is required to replenish the aquifer. Therefore, conservation has become an essential, permanent lifestyle for all.

Nearby, in Yorba Linda, the Diemer Water Treatment Facility is celebrating its 50th anniversary. Recently completed improvements valued at over \$300 million have

expanded that plant so that it can treat up to 520 million gallons daily with state-of-the-art ozonation technology. However, this is but one piece of the regional picture.

Critical actions are underway now to revamp the state's water system through the Bay Delta Conservation Plan under consideration in 2014. While that project is extremely important for stabilizing water supplies, Orange County's local resources are continuing to be expanded through new stormwater capture projects, water recycling and more. Citizens will want to support this progress.

Again, water conservation is an essential lifestyle for all Californians in their homes and businesses. Please do your part to save!

New Program Provides Custom Home Water Use Surveys for O.C. Residents



You may have heard of Energy Star homes or LEED certified homes that use very little energy; now it's time to make our homes water efficient as well! Not sure where to start? The Municipal Water District of Orange County and participating Orange County retail water agencies are now offering FREE Home Water Use Surveys to help homeowners identify ways to reduce their home's indoor and outdoor water use.

The Water Smart Home Program offers single-family homeowners the opportunity to certify their house as a Water Smart Home. This FREE program includes a Home Water Survey of the property and a detailed Home Water Use report. Participants can choose an outdoor-only survey, which looks primarily at the landscape and irrigation system, or an indoor and outdoor survey, which also detects possible leaks and looks at the water-using devices inside the home.

Following completion of the survey, you will receive a personalized Home Water Use Report. If your score is high enough, your home will qualify as a "Certified" Water Smart Home. If your score indicates you're not quite there yet, the report will contain money- and water-savings recommendations and no-cost activities that can help you become more water efficient and potentially reduce your water bill. If you choose to implement any of the recommendations, it gets you closer to achieving certification status.

Brea Sixth Graders Study Sustainability

Discovery Science Center (DSC) created an Eco Challenge Partnership program to teach sixth graders about recycling and environmental sustainability. The County was able to sponsor this program for the first couple of years, but funding ran out leaving individual cities to determine their level of continued participation. Consistent with Brea's support of sustainable practices and education, a portion of its State Beverage Container Grant Program funds were designated to register Brea participants.

Of the available spots, almost all were quickly reserved! Starting in 2014, students from Fanning and Laurel Elementary Schools will participate in a fun and informative school assembly and later take a field trip to DSC for a hands-on educational experience. Expect them to return with great ideas to apply here at home!

Brea War Memorial Honorees Listed

After only one year, the Brea War Memorial has become a focal point for proud military supporters to honor family members or friends who have served the nation. The Brea Memorial encompasses a “walk of honor” made up of pavers which are inscribed with the names and branches of the military for people special to the community. Each year, more will be added in time for the Veteran’s Day tribute ceremony.

Done Using It? Be Sure to “Lose It” Properly

When people purchase an item, they rarely consider where it will go once they’re done with it. Americans are major consumers. Therefore, they require extensive waste disposal systems for handling the tons of refuse being generated annually in each household.

If you’re one of those who made a New Year’s Resolution to clean out the garage and yard or organize the home, here’s a quick primer on your disposal options.

Usable clothing and household items — Several charitable organizations pick-up donations of items still in good condition for distribution to needy persons or for re-sale at shops supporting worthy causes. Watch for notices delivered in advance of a neighborhood pick-up day or check the yellow pages to find a local thrift store where you may drop off your donations.

Large, bulky, or electronics items

— If a large item cannot be reused or recycled, you must make an appointment to arrange for haul away of broken furnishings, appliances, televisions or computers. This is free to Brea residents twice annually. (There is a Freon handling and dismantle charge for refrigerators.) Call Republic Services at 714-238-2444 to schedule. It is illegal to dump discards onto another’s property.

Curbside trash pickup — Weekly residential service incorporates three distinct waste streams.

- The brown bin is for non-bagged yard clippings that can be composted. Palm fronds, food waste, and non-organic materials should never be placed in here.
- The green bin is for recyclables such as newspapers, cardboard, glass jars, aluminum cans and plastics. Empty contents and remove lids from these materials and take

care not to pollute the load with non-recyclable materials.

- The black bin is for kitchen, bathroom, or work area wastes and other general trash. Please note that liquid cooking oils may NOT be thrown in with household disposables. A small quantity might be absorbed into paper towels or rags. However, runny liquids need to be handled separately.*

Household Hazardous Waste —

Certain waste materials require special handling by the household generating it. Orange County residents may accumulate and safely store limited quantities of various substances and periodically bring these in for free disposal at regional collection centers. Improper handling is considered a serious environmental violation, subject to a penalty. Be sure to use proper precautions for:

- Paints and solvents
- Automotive fluids and cleaning products
- Batteries, fluorescent and CFL bulbs
- Excess pesticides, herbicides or pool chemicals
- *Leftover cooking oils and grease from deep fat fryers


These materials need to be carefully handled outside of the routine disposal stream because they can be both dangerous and messy. All are considered pollutants. When properly re-directed, some substances can be recycled into other products. Brea residents should bring their hazardous wastes to the County facility at 1071 N. Blue Gum in Anaheim. Call 714-834-6752 for operating hours.

Used Motor Oils

— There are three certified centers in Brea that can accept up to five gallons of used oil for recycling. These are:

- Firestone at 891 E. Imperial
- NAPA Auto Parts at 270 N. Brea Blvd.
- Oil Can Henry’s at 230 N. Brea Blvd.


Wildcatters Dog Park Dedication
