Statewide Drought Demands Water Efficiency

One story remains unchanged that is affecting everyone. All Californians are urged to take necessary actions to extend water supplies and prepare for a prolonged drought. This call for enhanced water use efficiency comes on the heels of extremely low snowpack in the Sierra Nevada Mountains, where January snow levels measured just 12 percent of average water content. This led the California Department of Water Resources to take the unprecedented step of eliminating anticipated water supply deliveries through the State Water Project.

As imported allocations had been reduced over time, water agencies in Southern California worked together diligently over a number of years to increase regional storage capacity. However, after a record dry 2013 now followed by this drought year, conditions can become dire if there is no way to replenish stored supplies that are being drawn down to meet current needs.



It is critical to conserve water used for gardening. Inefficient irrigation is obvious from overflow in storm drains. Cut back automatic sprinkler times to eliminate waste. Hand water sensitive plants.

At a minimum each household and business should be checking and promptly repairing leaks. And individuals should adjust their personal habits to eliminate waste. Learn more about how to make every drop matter by using tips available at bewaterwise.com.

Brea is a member agency to the Metropolitan Water District of Orange County, which offers a wide variety of water use efficiency programs and rebates to assist residents, businesses, and institutions in reducing their water use. Residents are en-

couraged to consider planting California Friendly plants that require very little water, install rotating sprinkler nozzles and a “smart” sprinkler timer that gives plants the appropriate amount of water. HERO Program Opens to Brea Homeowners

Brea is among the first Orange County cities to authorize a new financing program for renovation projects that can increase energy efficiency. Rather than making monthly payments, HERO (Home Energy Renovation Opportunity) allows property owners to repay over time through a voluntary annual assessment that can be added onto their property tax bill for 5, 10, 15, or 20 years depending upon the actual improvements which are being financed. This optional type of repayment method is authorized by state law. It is NOT a new tax.

HERO is intended to help lower utility bills, increase property values and make communities more sustainable. Many different home improvements may qualify. In general, eligible upgrades are installations that increase energy efficiency or conservation. Many types of clean energy upgrades might be considered: solar panels, cool roofs, window and door replacements, or irrigation and lighting control systems.

HERO offers a homeowner fixed-interest rates and flexible payment terms. Contractors who offer the HERO finance option must be certified by attending special training and be properly licensed for their specialty trade in the cities where they work. As a good practice, consumers can request competing bids from different contractors and of course, should carefully evaluate all lending choices.

- **Arbor Day** — Brea's Public Works Department will be busy for Arbor Day on April 24. Parks staff will be working with a youth group to plant some new trees.
- **Garden Friendly Workshops** — In conjunction with local water agencies, free garden friendly workshops have been scheduled to teach about drought tolerant plants and efficient irrigation systems.
