Show Spirit at Brea's May 20 Centennial Parade and Picnic!

Help make history! Bring out your family; tell your friends and neighbors to join us! On Saturday, May 20, Brea activates for a major outdoor celebration to show spirit and commemorate 100 years as a City.

The Centennial Parade steps off at 9 a.m. at the corner of Birch Street near North Associated Road. A procession of more than 90 entries heads east to the Brea Sports Park. This happy procession leads into a community Picnic from 11 a.m. to 3 p.m.

You won't want to miss the excitement of lively units including high-stepping members of the USC Trojan Marching Band, magnificent horses pulling the Wells Fargo Stagecoach, and the imaginative 501st Legion/Southern California Garrison Star Wars Group. Plus, you can greet parade grand marshals: Actress Andrea Barber, "Kimmy Gibbler" from *Full House* and *Fuller House* and baseball legends,

Brea's own Randy Jones and Charlie Hough. Admire classic cars, sports teams and representatives of founding families, youth groups and service organizations. Local schools will also be parading their creative salutes to the century.

Then, settle in for the Centennial Picnic, a festive afternoon hosted by some of the Brea Ministerial Association members. Food booths will feature treats at 1917 prices. Please bring your nickels, dimes and quarters! Live bands will take the stage throughout the afternoon while a children's area offers a petting zoo and pony rides. Other features are a classic car show plus exhibition baseball games, including re-enactment of the legendary Walter Johnson vs. Babe Ruth match-up that took place in Brea in 1924.

Brea Trail Opens in Birch Hills Golf Course

Another portion of The Tracks at Brea Trail, which travels through Birch Hills Golf Course, has now opened to the public. This 0.6 mile stretch can be accessed at Birch Street near the main entrance of the golf course by Associated Road and at Kraemer Boulevard near Orbiter Street. Be sure to look for the replica of a Pacific Red Line electric train that once ran through Brea and enjoy reading the panels that tell the story of the Red Line.



Construction is underway for two other sections of the trail. Segment 2, located between the Brea Canyon Channel and Brea Boulevard, will add 0.3 mile to the trail. In addition to the pedestrian path and paved bike trail, there will be a seating plaza as well as stairs to link to the completed Segment 1.

Segment 6 starts at Kraemer Boulevard adjacent to the Loftus Flood Control Channel and meanders to Valencia Avenue where it intersects Nasa Street. Trail users can use the signal to cross Valencia and connect with the La Floresta perimeter trail.

Amenities will also be added to Segment 3, which is a 0.8 mile section between Brea Boulevard and State College Boulevard. These will include a restroom, seating, drinking fountain, bike racks, butterfly garden and fitness equipment.

Construction on trail Segments 2, 3 and 6 is anticipated to be completed by fall 2017. All of these construction sites are closed to the public for safety. Segment 4, located between State College Boulevard and Birch Street, is currently out to bid. The City anticipates awarding a construction contract on this final segment in June of this year.

Four BOUSD Schools Recognized for High Achievement, Student Success

Brea Olinda High School and Brea Junior High are among several hundred in the state being honored with the California Gold Ribbon Schools Award for making gains in implementing the academic and performance standards set by the State Board of Education. The State Department of Education created the award to honor schools in place of the California Distinguished Schools Program, which is on hiatus while California creates new assessment, accountability and continuous improvement systems.

Each year this award rotates between elementary and secondary schools. Statewide, 477 campuses applied for the award, and 275 were selected. The procedure involved each school selecting a Model Program/Practice to highlight their excellence.

Additionally, Arovista Elementary School and Laurel Elementary Magnet School of Innovation and Career Exploration have been selected by Educational Results Partnership (ERP) and the Campaign for Business and

Education Excellence (CBEE) as two of 1,866 public schools in California to receive the title of 2016 Honor Roll school. The Honor Roll is part of a national effort to identify higher-performing schools and highlight successful practices that improve outcomes for students. Schools receiving this distinction from leaders in the California academic and business communities have demonstrated consistent high levels of student academic achievement, improvement in achievement levels over time and reduction in

achievement gaps among student populations.

Brea Olinda Unified Superintendent Dr. Brad Mason congratulated these schools saying, "We are thrilled to receive these validations that are indicative of how hard our teachers, administrators and parent community work on behalf of the students in BOUSD. Our schools are exceptional."

Water Conservation Helps Secure Supplies


In April, the Governor finally lifted emergency conditions after winter rains brought relief from years of record drought. Good habits developed under the emergency declaration were much appreciated and now are part of the California lifestyle.

Wasteful practices, such as over watering lawns or allowing runoff onto paved surfaces, are permanently prohibited statewide. Local ordinances reflect these State rules and adjust for other variable conditions.

Brea has been operating under Phase 2 of its ordinance: outdoor irrigation is permitted on Mondays and Thursdays before 10 a.m. or after 4 p.m. The City Council will be reviewing this status as summer gets underway. For more information go to CityofBrea.net/water.
