Brea Council Establishes 2017-18 Fiscal Year Budgets

The Brea City Council passed 2017-18 Fiscal Year budgets at their meeting on June 6, 2017. A balanced budget resulted from a thorough review of internal processes and objective conservative assumptions. The General Fund budget is just over \$55 million and Brea is maintaining a healthy reserve balance of 19% of its expenditures. The Capital Improvement Projects Budget (CIP) for FY2017-18 proposes 41 projects valued at \$29 million.

The City's fiscal year runs from July 1 through June 30. City Council budget approval does not constitute a mandate to spend, but does create authority to do so for projects and purposes outlined. All spending throughout any fiscal year is done with close oversight and with regular reports coming back to the Council on actual expenditures. This disciplined approach has always served the City well, even throughout challenging times.

There are a number of projects and services that Council committed to that have impacts for this year and will continue to affect future budgets. These projects include:

- Construction of the 57 Freeway/Lambert Road Interchange
- Building a new downtown parking structure
- Enhancements to Laurel Elementary School/Lagos de Moreno Park
- Contribution toward addressing unfunded pension liabilities
- Continuing construction of Tracks at Brea Trail segments
- Commitment toward continuation of animal care services with the County of Orange and a contribution toward construction of a new animal shelter
- Next steps for Downtown/Central Brea

Council has also instructed staff to closely monitor water consumption, conservation, and expenses to ensure that rate payers are gaining the most benefit from changing conditions. In adopting updated water rates last year, the Council made a commitment to allocate

more of its water charges to fixed costs rather than commodity (usage) costs. This allocation change helps stabilize the Water Utility Fund making it less reliant on the sale of water to maintain its infrastructure.

For the Operating Budget, also known as the General Fund, sales tax continues to be most significant, making up 38% of revenues. The trend in online shopping will be closely watched as growth in this key Brea revenue source could be weakened. Increased property valuations have bolstered revenue a bit with new residences. A fee study including regional comparisons is underway with a goal of full cost recovery for services. Likewise, a utility cost audit will take place to assure efficiencies are realized across the board.


Throughout California, dramatic increases in Public Employee Retirement System (PERS) costs affect both public employees and organizational budgets. In Brea, a cost control measure for staffing is a review process for every vacancy that occurs and function consolidation whenever possible. Meanwhile, employees now cover 100% of their PERS cost share. Most public safety employees are also cost-sharing the employer's portion.

Brea's CIP Budget looks ahead over a seven-year period for infrastructure needs. Currently, 105 individual projects have been identified, which will require \$92 million to execute. With strategic planning, the Public Works Department keeps an aggressive schedule to assure that Brea continues to reflect a quality environment. Timely and coordinated streets, sewer, and water plans are a priority. Partnerships with regional and state entities also has resulted in critical grant funding to offset costs. These practices help the City prepare for the years ahead.


The Council and staff will be constantly working together to protect taxpayer interests while reaching goals.

Brea Envisions Wraps Up Research Work

Dedication and discipline brought some amazing volunteers together in service as the Brea Envisions committee. Since early 2016 they have been taking the pulse of the community to help discern a vision for the future. Their work will inform updates to important planning documents that guide City projects over the next two decades.

Outreach was ongoing through a series of public workshops, online surveys and interviews conducted at various special events. Most recently, a professional research company conducted a scientific, statistically relevant survey of Brea residents to test information received from the Brea Envisions process. The data received did align with prior work, which now becomes the basis for a final report.

The Envisions Committee developed strategic initiatives that provide values, priorities and vision of all residents in the City, not just those that actively participated in workshops, meetings and surveys. The City Council will review all these findings. Everyone can read the draft report at BreaEnvisions.net.

Coyote Precautions

Urban coyotes are a fact of life. Humans must take precautions to discourage these predators. **Never leave pet food or garbage outdoors!** Remove thick brush and fallen fruit that provide food and shelter.

Inspect Citrus Trees for Dangerous Disease

The California Department of Food and Agriculture recently detected Huanglongbing (HLB), an incurable plant disease in citrus trees in several nearby residential areas, which also puts Brea's backyard citrus trees at risk.

HLB is not harmful to humans or animals, but it kills citrus trees. There is no cure for this disease and once infected, a tree must be removed to prevent the disease



from spreading in the community. Portions of several nearby cities are under quarantine, which means citrus plants cannot be sold within that area, and citrus plants or cuttings shouldn't leave the quarantine area.

While researchers are looking for a cure to HLB, right now the best way to protect against the disease is to stop the pest that infects citrus trees. Everyone must work together to help save our community's citrus. The Citrus Pest & Disease Prevention Program recommends the following actions:

- Inspect citrus trees regularly for signs of the Asian citrus psyllid and HLB. Report symptoms by calling 800-491-1899 and requesting a free inspection by trained agriculture officials.
- Only purchase citrus trees from local, reputable nurseries, and never bring citrus trees or plant cuttings into California from other states or countries. Do not transport citrus out of your local area.
- Cooperate with agriculture officials working throughout the state to stop the pest and disease.



Summer Signals Increased Water Awareness

Winter rains were most welcome, but now that summer is upon us, it's an important time to renew water awareness. Brea's City Council reviewed the city's supply status and has moved back to Phase 1 provisions in the conservation ordinance.

Outdoor irrigation is now permitted on Mondays, Thursdays and Saturdays

Automated systems should be adjusted accordingly. Although an additional day is now added, be aware that cycling on each station can still be no longer than 15 minutes total. To maximize absorption, many will utilize a "cycle and soak" method. That would be sequencing three times through stations on a system for five minutes each. This allows water to better percolate into the ground without runoff to surrounding pavement.

Conservation Must Continue

The State of California has placed permanent restrictions on certain water practices. Suppliers throughout the state are required to monitor uses and promote active conservation.

In Brea's public areas the City continues its past efforts with even more water efficiency measures to come. A prominent new project is for landscape improvements along the south lawn of the Brea Community Center. A project for the east side slopes several years ago is now fully mature. Even that smaller area resulted in big water savings during recent drought years.

Projects to establish California-friendly plants can extend monetary savings into the future, as well as help maintain adequate reserve supplies. This also is true for Brea's residences, apartment and commercial complexes.



What About Water? Environmental students at Brea Olinda High School wrapped up this academic year with a lunch-time expo. Displays demonstrated challenges to California's water system and reminded students of their responsibility not to pollute or waste resources. Many signed pledges to be proactive about conservation.

Construction Continues on The Tracks

Construction is progressing well on two new segments to The Tracks at Brea. Segment 6, between Kraemer Boulevard and Valencia Avenue, is expected to be completed by early fall of this year. Segment 2, which travels west from Brea Boulevard to the Brea Canyon Channel, is anticipated to be completed mid-fall.

Both segments will feature separated pedestrian paths and paved bike trails. Segment 2 will include a seating plaza and stairs to connect to the already open Segment 1. Construction will also start soon on amenities to Segment 3, which opened last year and is between Brea Boulevard and State College Boulevard. These improvements include restroom, seating area, drinking fountain, bike racks, butterfly garden and fitness equipment.



The construction contract for the trail portion between State College Boulevard and Birch Street, known as Segment 4, has just been awarded and onsite construction is expected to begin in September. When this segment is completed in 2018, Brea will have a 4-mile connected trail and linear park. Funding for construction of The Tracks at Brea is provided by State and Federal grants from agencies including the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency, National Parks Service, California Department of Parks and Recreation, Caltrans, California Transportation Commission, Strategic Growth Council, and Mobil Source Air Pollution Reduction Review Committee.

Laurel Magnet School Takes Career Exploration to a New Level

Families, community members, staff and district administrators alike gathered for a one-of-a-kind “career fair.” Students from Laurel Elementary Magnet School of Innovation and Career Exploration presented their yearlong community partner projects at the inaugural Career Exploration Showcase event.

As Brea’s only magnet school, the unique theme of innovation and career exploration allows Laurel teachers and students to seek out new strategies, approaches and systems of learning. As part of the career exploration theme, each of Laurel’s 14 classrooms partnered with a local Brea business or community partner. Unlike past partnerships where community members are asked to provide support through monetary donations, this partnership centers on intellectual capital.

Partners came from a variety of industries and meet with classes throughout the course of the school year. They present an industry problem in the form of a question. From transitional kindergarten to sixth grade, students used 21st century learning skills to answer questions like:

- “How do we tell our community about emergencies?”
- “How can we protect animals?”
- “How can we attract new guests to visit?”
- “How do we educate others about how banks work and saving money?”
- “How can we give back to the Brea Community?”
- “How do we educate our community about food waste and its impact?”
- “Can we create a drought tolerant landscape design?”
- “What roles do orthodontists play in our health?”

After many brainstorming sessions, field trips and classroom visits, students worked in collaborative groups to research and determine solutions. On June 2, Laurel’s community partners were invited back to see students’ hard work on display during a special Career Exploration Showcase. Guests could scan QR codes that led them to presentations. Final projects included marketing videos for Embassy Suites and advertisements for local organic eatery, Green Tomato Grill.
