Brea has long been known as a "City of Art" thanks to our nationally-renowned Art in Public Places collection, a performing arts theatre and a multi-media fine arts gallery. City officials underscored the importance of cultural arts back in 1980 by naming the new city hall, The Brea Civic & Cultural Center.

In fact, Brea's love of arts is even older than that. In 1918, the Brea PTA sponsored an "Old Masters Art Show." Students in period costumes posed in a life-size gilded frame to portray famous paintings. Sound familiar? These productions predated Laguna's "Pageant of the Masters" by over a decade! A robust cultural climate was part of the city since its early oil town roots.

Today, you are invited to Experience Brea Arts. Throughout the year, various events and festivals, workshops, demonstrations, exhibitions, and live theatre performances are offered, providing something for everyone.

Final Brea Trail Segment Begins Construction



Construction recently began on the final segment of The Tracks at Brea Trail. Soon the community will be enjoying a continuous 4-miles of linear park.

Segment 4, located between State College Boulevard and Birch Street, will add 0.7 miles to the trail and is expected to open in early 2018. Construction consists of a separate pedestrian path and paved bike trail, seating, butterfly garden, drinking fountain, and landscaping.

Two other portions of the trail continue under construction. Segment 2, located between the Brea Canyon Channel and Brea Boulevard, just north of Downtown Brea, adds 0.3 miles to the trail. This section opens later this year with dual paths and a seating plaza, as well as stairs linking it to completed Segment 1, which is behind downtown and links into Arovista Park.

Open since March 2016, Segment 3 is the 0.8 mile section between Brea Boulevard and State College Boulevard. Restroom and fitness equipment will be added this fall. While Segment 3 will remain open during construction, Segments 2, 4 and 6 remain closed to the public during construction. Fortunately, most of this work takes place off of major streets, so there are only mini-

mal, brief traffic interruptions to allow for deliveries.

Segment 6 is also under construction, located between Kraemer Boulevard and Valencia Avenue, adjacent to the Loftus Channel. This 0.9 mile segment will also have a separate pedestrian path and bike trail. It is targeted to open this fall.



Private Development Paces Brea's Growth

In addition to a busy slate of public works projects, the private sector is driving a lot of construction activity around town. Here is a snapshot of those projects.

• Hines Brea

Place — A mixed use development slated for the State College Boulevard and Birch Street area is undergoing the construction permit process.

This project will have two buildings wrapping interior parking garages, with the north building in a 3-story design and the south building in a 4/5 story design, for a total of 653 new apartment homes. The development will also bring a new hotel and office space to the area.

- **La Floresta** — Remaining areas are closer to buildout. Construction on the Pearl Apartment building is expected to finish by the end of 2017. Buena Vida active adult community is in various stages of plan check and construction. This building will be stacked condominiums along Rose Drive on the north part of the community. Still to be built are additional single family residences and an active adult recreation center.



- **Downtown Improv** — An expanded Improv is underway, transforming the former Old Navy building into a new entertainment venue. That building will undergo a complete re-façade plus interior renovations to include a 450+ seat auditorium and two restaurant spaces.

- **Central Park Village** — On the northwest side, the skeleton of a new

three-story medical building is rising with an adjacent parking structure due for completion in early 2018. Construction of 81 townhomes along the back side of this development is wrapping up and work on apartments will commence soon.

- **CVS** — Design is underway for conversion of the former Wells Fargo bank at Lambert Road and Brea Boulevard into a new CVS Pharmacy with an elevated architectural design that will also incorporate a Coffee Bean & Tea Leaf.

Construction Traffic Reflects Growing Pains

The good news: various construction improvements around town reflect great confidence in Brea's economy. The bad news: motorists' patience will be tested by temporary traffic disruptions as work is underway.

Brea's economic strength allows for critical infrastructure improvements throughout the City as part of the Seven-year Capital Improvement Program (CIP). Over the 2017-18 Fiscal Year, 21 projects totaling \$29 million have been approved. Once CIP projects are planned and designed, work is scheduled. Typically, the majority of projects are constructed during late spring, summer, and early fall months to avoid potential weather delays. However, it remains challenging to control timing due to various project delivery constraints. Currently, the City's engineers are busier than ever overseeing various factors that brought several projects into construction concurrently during this period.

Even with small projects, it is complex to handle unexpected underground obstacles and to coordinate upgrades with various utility providers. It is important to remember that such frustrations are temporary and part of a construction process. Eventually, all programmed projects reach completion and the benefits of such projects are realized over many decades. That is the goal of the CIP; deliver necessary City infrastructure from planning to reality.



The intersection at Central and Tamarack Avenues is undergoing major changes. Watch for signs!

Please slow down and be aware of current CIP Projects impacting traffic in these areas:

- **Central and Tamarack** — An added right turn lane will smooth traffic flow during peak hours. Completion is expected in late September. Neighborhood and Mariposa School traffic is being detoured via Site Drive while a small section of Tamarack is closed.
- **Birch and Flower** — Through the first semester, reconstruction of Lagos de Moreno Park requires tight traffic controls around Laurel Magnet School. Watch for directional signage, crossing guards and increased pedestrians.
- **Lambert and Kraemer** — Street resurfacing is estimated to finish in November.
- **North Brea Boulevard** — Utility undergrounding has been planned for many years by utility company partners including SCE, Crown Castle and Time Warner. After conduits, vaults and pull boxes are installed, equipment will follow and eventually the telephone poles will be removed. Completion is estimated in the first quarter of 2018.
- **Brea and Birch** — Decks are forming for a 476-stall downtown parking structure with completion slated for the first quarter of 2018. There will be impacts along South Orange and portions of Birch during this project.
- **Tracks at Brea Trail** — Construction activity is underway on various segments. Details are in the article on page 2.

Once bids process in this system it also serves as a central reference point to view product and service specifications and submit required documents.

Where does Brea's Money Come from?

Strong revenues are crucial to city operations and careful budgeting keeps Brea within the limits of its income. The quality of infrastructure, public safety and programming is dependent on revenue reliability and growth keeping pace with the economy.

This chart lists taxes and fees generated that provide for Brea's needs. Some taxes have not been updated for several decades, but only with voter approval can changes be made.

Sales Tax — Brea receives 1% of the sales tax generated within City Limits. Variations reflect economic increases and decreases. Unlike on-site sales, tax proceeds from on-line purchases are distributed based on standing within the County Pool. As Brea's largest source of income, local shopping is encouraged.

Property Tax — Generated based on the valuation of property within the City limits. Proposition 13 limits the valuation from increasing no more than 2% annually, determined by the County Assessor. The basic levy is 1% of the assessed value; however, the City of Brea receives only 13% of that amount.

Paramedic Tax — Collected on the taxpayer property tax bill, the levy amount was last updated in 1981. It is \$0.045 per \$100 of full taxable value of properties within the City limits.

Transient Occupancy Tax — Also called Hotel Tax, the current rate in Brea is 10%, last updated in 1989.

Business License Tax — Issued to a business, trade, professional, etc. operating within City limits. Revenue is solely for municipal purposes and is not intended for regulation. This tax was last updated in 1976.





National Preparedness Month, Your Time to Learn and Act

We live in uncertain times with potential threats from both natural and man-made causes. However, by learning about possible dangers and preparing for a reasonable response, you can rest a little easier. On this page, look over the many opportunities you have to act and do more than just worry about “what if” an emergency occurs.

Brea will be participating in the countywide AlertOC test on Wednesday, October 18 after 10 a.m. Register today to be included.

Clear the Way for Safety at Home

The Brea Fire Department will be conducting weed and brush clearance inspections throughout the next few months. Inspection protects your home and our community during fire season. Please refer to the following standards:

- Areas within 100 feet of structures shall be cleared of vegetation and other combustible growth.
- Areas within 10 feet of roads or highways shall be cleared.
- Weed removal shall be to a minimum of two to three inches from the soil surface. All cuttings shall be removed or disked into the ground if irrigation is provided.
- Combustible hazards, i.e.—trash, furniture and wood shall be cleared as required.
- Vegetation trimmings, combustible debris and dead or dying plant material shall be removed.
- Limbs on trees must be removed six feet from the ground to prevent grass fires from climbing.
- Remove portions of trees that extend within 10 feet of a chimney flue outlet.

system to be contacted via phone, email or text should an emergency threaten your Brea home or business. For those already registered, be sure to update any contact information that has changed. Go to AlertOC.com.

Only those who have opted in to the system will be called during the test. Log in to add your cell phone, work phones and email. You can register everyone in the family to be sure you all stay informed during emergencies.

“Run, Hide, Fight”

In light of recent terrorist threats, interest in self-protection rises. Unfortunately, there is no fail safe advice for every situation. However, experts at Homeland Security circulate these recommendations for active shooter situations.

Run - Have an escape route in mind. Leave belongings behind. Keep hands visible.

Hide - Stay out of view. Block entry to a hiding place. Silence cell phone.

Fight - If in imminent danger, a last resort is to throw items and act with physical aggression.

Get Ready For Emergencies and Pack Your Gear!

Each household and business needs to make the effort to become prepared. Having a plan and stocking up on supplies will add to your comfort and safety during an earthquake, fire or other emergency situation. Store enough supplies for at least 72 hours. Establish your options for evacuation and family communications. Identify an out-of-state point of contact.

Supplies Checklist

Essentials:

- Water – 1 gallon per person per day
- Water purification kit
- First aid kit freshly stocked
- First aid book
- Non-perishable foods
- Can opener (non-electric)
- Blankets or sleeping bags
- Portable radio, flashlight and batteries
- Essential medications
- Extra eyeglasses and keys
- Fire extinguisher – ABC type
- Cash and change
- Pet supplies
- Baby supplies – disposable diapers, wipes, formula, clothing, etc...



Safety and Comfort:

- Sturdy shoes
- Heavy gloves for clearing debris
- Candles and matches, light sticks
- Change of clothing
- Knife or razor blades
- Garden hose for siphoning or firefighting
- Tent
- Paper, pen, stamps



Cooking:

- Plastic knives, forks, spoons
- Paper plates and cups
- Paper towels
- Heavy-duty aluminum foil
- Camping stove for outdoor cooking (always check for gas leaks first)



Sanitation:

- Large plastic trash bags for waste; to use as tarps and rain ponchos
- Large trash cans
- Bar soap and liquid detergent
- Toothpaste and toothbrushes
- Shampoo
- Toilet paper
- Household bleach
- Feminine hygiene supplies



Tools and supplies:

- Axe, shovel, broom
- Adjustable wrench for turning off gas
- Tool kit with screwdriver, pliers and hammer
- Coil of 1/2" rope
- Plastic tape, staple gun and sheeting for window coverage
- Bicycle
- Maps
