## City Faces Budget Limits; Examines Options for Service Efficiency

The Brea City Council faces difficult choices ahead as budget limitations will affect certain programs and services. Brea's professional staff is very mindful of its responsibility to be fiscally smart and forward thinking. They are charged with offsetting a projected General Fund shortfall of \$2.3 million following disappointing sales tax reports. Although budgets for Fiscal Year 2018-19 are not adopted until July, a process is underway to identify future cutbacks.

A flattening in sales tax, the biggest source of Brea's revenue, is of the greatest concern. When shopping in Brea, one cent of each dollar spent here stays local in support of public needs. Recent trends for increased online spending pushes sales tax to the State for re-distribution. A smaller amount is then returned to cities as compared to what would have been generated by on-site purchases.

Although property taxes are strong, a very small share is returned to the City. Schools receive 44% and the County 36% of this income. For Brea, receiving only 13%, this amounts to less than \$800 per household on average — far from sufficient to cover basic services.


Normal inflation for utilities, supplies and service is always anticipated on the expenditure side as budgets are prepared. However, sharp increases for benefit related obligations have put extra pressure on estimates. In particular, pension costs from the PERS retirement system were steeper than previously projected by PERS, and this is likely to continue for several years ahead.

2 People are the essential factor in order to provide programs and services. Some operations may have large costs for equipment or materials, however, personnel costs underscore every function performed for the public and these are always the largest piece of an operating budget. Therefore, in pursuit of reducing personnel costs, it is most difficult to consider which services must be sacrificed. Tough decisions are ahead in 2018.

The City of Brea practices fiscal conservatism to approve and deliver successful projects and services. Going forward, the dynamics are changing and Brea again will be preparing for adjustments.

**BOHS Students Build New Kiosk for Fullerton Arboretum**

As part of an ongoing class project, students from Brea Olinda High School’s Building Industry Technology Academy (BITA) recently designed and constructed a guidance kiosk for the Fullerton Arboretum. In December, BITA students delivered the portable, wifi-enabled kiosk to the Arboretum and a special ribbon-cutting ceremony was held to celebrate the occasion.

Seeking a way to help guide visitors through different parts of the Arboretum, Development Manager Harriet Bouldin reached out to BITA Teacher Patrick Axtell about having his students build a kiosk. The project was a collaborative effort from all four BITA elective classes. Students in BITA 1 painted parts of the kiosk, BITA 2 students built parts of the roof and installed the drywall, while BITA 3 and 4 students were focused on wiring and electricity for the structure.

Adrian Robles, senior and BITA student, stated “I’ve learned all sorts of skills from installing drywall, to constructing siding and roofing. I plan to



build houses, so this experience is definitely a stepping stone for me.”

Administrators from the District, Cal State Fullerton, Brea Olinda High School and the Regional Occupational Program (ROP) all gathered to applaud and thank students for their work on the kiosk. Upcoming projects for BITA students include rebuilding the bullpen for the baseball field and constructing an island unit cabinet for a BOHS teacher.

## November 7

### Commission Review

## November 21

### Cannabis Restrictions

## Two New Segments Extend Tracks at Brea Trail

**B**rea's Tracks is soon to extend its reach across town with the opening of additional segments. Next up is a .86 mile section beginning at Kraemer Boulevard and running east along the Loftus Flood Control Channel. The Trail takes a south turn along Surveyor Avenue before heading east again on Nasa Street to Valencia Avenue. After crossing at that signalized corner, trail users can connect into the La Floresta perimeter trail.

The original Tracks segment, which is just west of Downtown, will be connected via the quarter mile long Segment 2 over to Brea Boulevard where it joins with Segment 3. A staircase at the western end of this new section has the unique feature of a trough where bikers can place their wheels making it easier to ascend the stairs. As an alternate, trail users who are unable to do stairs may take the elevator in Downtown Parking Structure Two and ride up to the Birch Street level. From there, they can use the sidewalk for pedestrians or the street for bikes to reach





Segments 2 and 3, which are at a higher level than Segment 1.

Running from Brea Boulevard east to State College Boulevard, new amenities have been added on Segment 3. There is a seating area near the Brea Boulevard trail entry along with restrooms, a drinking fountain, bike racks and nine fitness stations. Construction continues on the new .64 mile section between State College Boulevard and Birch Street. That final segment is anticipated to open late spring to complete the 4-mile continuous trail.
