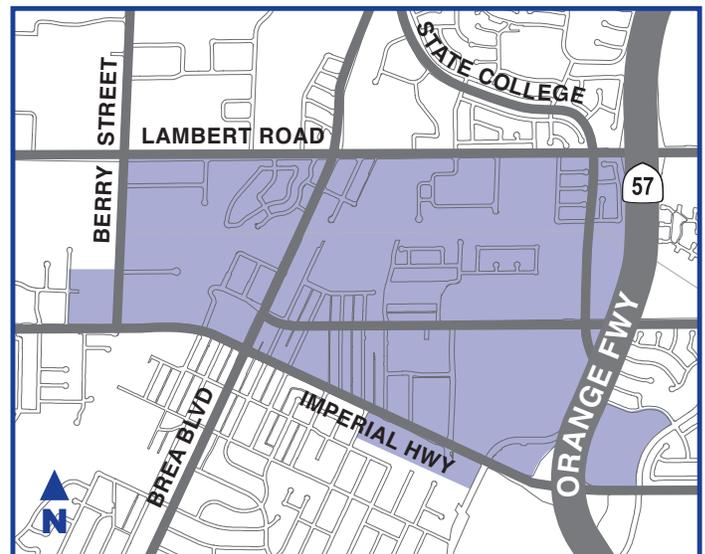
Brea Core Plan Gets Started with Community Outreach

Core area includes the commercial and industrial land south of Lambert Rd., north of Imperial Hwy., east of Berry St. and west of the 57 freeway. It does NOT include residential areas.

Take a Walk Back in Time Along The Tracks



The final segment of The Tracks at Brea 4-mile trail will be opening soon! Construction is nearly complete on the section from State College Blvd. to Birch St. Like the other parts of the trail, it features a 10' wide paved and striped bike trail and a separate decomposed granite walking path along with seating and landscaping. When this segment opens, trail users will be able to go from Valencia Ave. heading west all the way to the Brea Flood Control channel just west of Downtown or they may turn south at that point and continue along the trail as it crosses Imperial Hwy. and travels through Arovista Park.



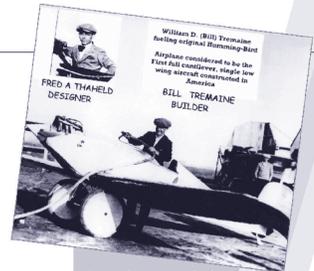
The HUMMINGBIRD

In 1926 Fred Thaheld and Bill Tremaine, two aeronautical engineers, together produced one of a kind airplane they named The Hummingbird. By combining their skills they built a tiny airplane that was America's first full-cantilevered low-wing monoplane. This unusual craft had a wingspan of only 21 feet, a length of 15 feet and weighed only 250 pounds.

Unfortunately, after a great deal of promise The Hummingbird crashed during a 1926 Air Show at Loftus Field that killed Ray Freeman, the young pilot. The team continued to design and build other airplanes including a low-wing monoplane called the Spirit of John Rogers. However, they stopped building airplanes after this plane crashed into a cliff near San Diego, killing both pilots.

Later, Fred Thaheld designed diesel engines, one of which powered M-1 tanks in World War II. His "pancake" diesel engines brought him national fame and today some of his inventions are even exhibited in the Smithsonian Institution. Among other successful endeavors, Bill Tremaine later became a Brea City Constable. His constable badge is on display in the Brea Museum located at 495 South Brea Boulevard.

If you have the opportunity, stop by Fire Station 2 just south of the trail on Brea Boulevard and read the plaque that designates the spot where once stood the garage that housed the team of Fred Thaheld and Bill Tremaine and the unique airplanes they built.

A series of signs telling stories about Brea history will soon be added to The Tracks at Brea trail. You'll see photos courtesy of the Brea Historical Society on a variety of topics including Brea's role in early aviation history with the invention of the Hummingbird airplane and the daredevil pilots in the Brea Air Club. Enjoy the drama of "the Big Game" at the Brea Bowl when Babe Ruth faced Hall of Fame pitcher Walter Johnson who grew up in Olinda. Take a peek at what Brea Downtown was like in the early 1900s and see how Brea grew from humble beginnings of oil fields and orange groves into a renowned commercial hub. You'll also learn about the Butterfly Gardens along the trail as well as low water landscaping.

Mid-Year Budget Update Presented to City Council

Managing the City's budget is an ongoing priority for City Council and staff. The City studies financial trends, projects budget shortfalls and identifies issues so that they can be dealt with proactively. Since the adoption of the current year's budget, City staff has been working to keep the budget balanced. A review of these efforts was presented to the City Council by Administrative Services Director Cindy Russell at the February 6 City Council meeting. (You can view the video at CityofBrea.net; click on Agendas & Minutes.)

Highlights of the Presentation:

- Property and sales tax are the two largest revenue sources. New housing developments and higher home valuations are resulting in an estimated \$300,000 increase in property tax revenues for this fiscal year.
- Unfortunately, sales tax is another story. A decline of approximately \$1.08 million is estimated from what was projected at budget adoption in June, 2017. The decrease is due to a change in consumer spending habits and growth in online sales. You can help counteract this new dynamic by shopping at one (or more) of Brea's various retail centers.
- The City is taking a number of steps to mitigate budget impacts for the current fiscal year as well as future years. They include:
 - 11.2 full-time equivalent positions (FTE) were eliminated through attrition, which saves approximately \$586,000 this year.
 - Reducing positions affects the delivery of services. Consequently, Departments were asked to prioritize programs and services and recommend potential cuts for City Council consideration.
 - Additionally, City Departments are evaluating their budgets to identify potential cuts to their operating budgets.
 - The cost of a Police Officer is being offset with a public safety grant from the State.
 - Work continues to mitigate pension cost increases caused by lower rate of returns and other factors, such as people are living longer, which means benefits are paid for a longer period of time.
 - All employees pay 100% of their portion of pension costs. Plus, some are sharing the cost of the employer's portion.
 - Eliminated budgeted, unnegotiated cost of living raises for FY 2017/18 and 2018/19.

There is still more work ahead to close the gap of an estimated \$233,133 shortfall for FY 2018-19. Budget figures are still preliminary as Finance continues to review budget numbers submitted by departments.

The Budget Public Hearing is scheduled for Tuesday, June 19 in the City Council Chambers at the Brea Civic & Cultural Center.

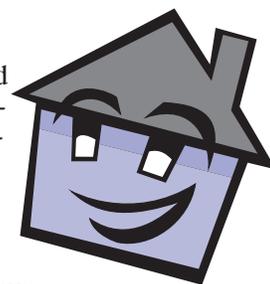

Brea Housing Rehabilitation Program

A home can be a source of pride and stability, but without good maintenance it can become a problem. Necessary repairs are sometimes unaffordable, but if eligible, local homeowners can receive financing to support their rehab work. Brea's Housing Rehabilitation Program helps assure that local housing stays in good shape by offering financial assistance for needed improvements. Federal funding is allocated through the County of Orange and can be made available to qualifying Brea homeowners. 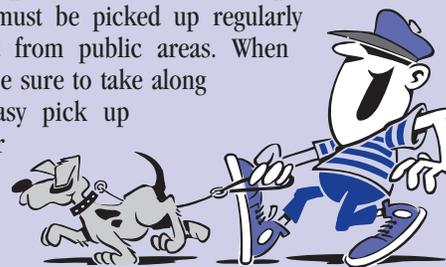

Pet ownership comes with many responsibilities. Here are a few tips and reminders.

Dogs must be kept on a leash when out in public areas.

Animal waste must be picked up regularly from the yard and from public areas. When walking your dog, be sure to take along a container for easy pick up and disposal of your pet's waste. Please place in the proper trash bin.



Spring Has Sprung! (Well Almost)

Spring officially begins March 20 this year and you're likely thinking about freshening up your landscape. Materials from your yard clean-up day can be made into mulch, benefitting many other landscapes, if disposed of properly. By putting yard waste in the brown container, you'll reduce the amount of waste in landfills while supporting a strong eco system by making organic matter available for soil and plants.

Please follow these easy guidelines:

- Place loose grass clippings, leaves, plants, weeds, brush, branches and limbs into the brown container.
- Chop and trim branches so they are no longer than two feet and four inches in diameter.
- Do not put fibrous palm fronds, cactus, Bird of Paradise, or yucca plants in the brown container, as they get tangled in the grinding equipment. These need to be put in the black trash container.

What Rainy Season?

Summer Watering Schedule Begins April 1

So far this year, Orange County hasn't had much of a rainy season and experts are saying Southern California is headed back into drought mode. While the state hasn't officially declared a drought, our semi-arid Mediterranean climate means we should conserve water whenever possible. If you want a refresher, visit OCWaterSmart.com for water saving tips.

The City of Brea water ordinance was enacted in 2009 to promote water conservation. It outlines rules for using water year round. Beginning April 1, you may water your landscape on Mondays, Thursdays and Saturdays for up to 15 minutes. But, remember you don't have to water three days a week. Check CityofBrea.net for more information.

Spring is a great time to take a look at making water saving changes to your yard. There are many resources online to help you plant a California-friendly landscape and choose a smart irrigation controller that will save water and money. Development Around Town

Downtown Parking Structure



The new downtown parking structure, located on the corner of Birch St. and South Orange Ave., has been open since January. The four-level structure, which took about 441 days to build, now adds 477 parking spaces to the downtown area.

Downtown Hotel

A proposal is in for a hotel by Hampton Inn. The five-story building, located on the southeast corner of Birch St. and Brea Blvd., is currently planned to have 116 rooms, along with retail and restaurant space.



Brea Place



Located at the northern intersection of Birch St. and State College Blvd., construction has begun on Phase I of this three-phased project. Phase I is the addition of two levels to the existing parking structure. Phase II will be construction of a 425-unit apartment building near Birch St. and a 146-room hotel across State College Blvd., and the final Phase III will be construction of a 228-unit apartment building near The Tracks at Brea trail.

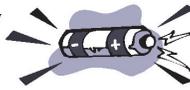

Be Ready for Emergencies, Pack Your Gear

Supplies Checklist

Essentials:

- Water – 1 gallon per person per day
- Water purification kit
- First aid kit freshly stocked
- First aid book
- Non-perishable foods
- Can opener (non-electric)
- Blankets or sleeping bags
- Portable radio, flashlight and batteries
- Essential medications
- Extra eyeglasses and keys
- Fire extinguisher – ABC type
- Cash and change
- Pet supplies
- Baby supplies – disposable diapers, wipes, formula, clothing, etc...



Safety and Comfort:

- Sturdy shoes
- Heavy gloves for clearing debris
- Candles and matches, light sticks
- Change of clothing
- Knife or razor blades
- Garden hose for siphoning or firefighting
- Tent
- Paper, pen, stamps

Cooking:

- Plastic knives, forks, spoons
- Paper plates and cups
- Paper towels
- Heavy-duty aluminum foil
- Camping stove for outdoor cooking (always check for gas leaks first)



Sanitation:

- Large plastic trash bags for waste; to use as tarps and rain ponchos
- Large trash cans
- Bar soap and liquid detergent
- Toothpaste and toothbrushes
- Shampoo
- Toilet paper
- Household bleach
- Feminine hygiene supplies



Tools and supplies:

- Axe, shovel, broom
- Adjustable wrench for turning off gas
- Tool kit with screwdriver, pliers and hammer
- Coil of 1/2" rope
- Plastic tape, staple gun and sheeting for window coverage
- Bicycle
- Maps



Lock it, take it, keep it!

Don't be an easy target for criminals. Remember to ALWAYS lock your vehicle at home, in the park, or at a shopping center. It is best to take valuables with you; but if you must leave something behind, then secure it out of view, preferably in the trunk. Be sure to do so before you arrive at a destination where you might be observed hiding something.



Certain small items like cellphones, cameras, or sunglasses, which are often left behind on quick stops will tempt thieves to break in. They're also drawn to purses and laptop computers left in view.

In Brea, 93% of reported Part 1 crimes are property crimes: burglaries, petty thefts, grand thefts or grand theft auto. Of property crimes, 52% involve vehicles that are broken into or that were left unlocked. Please don't add to the count. Always lock your vehicle!

Last and Final ROPS

The City Council adopted Resolution No. SA 2018-02 approving the last and final Recognized Obligation Payment Schedule (LFROPS) and took related actions.

February 6

Mid Year Budget Update

Council received a mid-year budget presentation and provided staff direction on whether or not to pursue next steps in the process of considering a Transient Occupancy Tax ("Hotel Tax") or Business License Tax ballot measure for November 2018.

Brea Development Fee Study

Staff sought direction from Council regarding, deposit amounts for hourly rate permits, flat rate permits, cost recovery policy and a phased implementation of new fees.

Zoning Ordinance Amendment

Council adopted Ordinance 1203 Amending Title 20, Chapter 20.00, 20.08 and all single family and multifamily zones contained in Chapters 20.20 of the Brea Zoning Ordinance to update the provisions pertaining to Accessory Dwelling Units in accordance with new state legislature. First reading, waived further reading.

Application for participation in CDBG Program

Conducted a public hearing and adopted Resolution No. 2018-010 approving the fiscal year 2018-19 and 2019-20 applications to the County of Orange for Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funding.

2018 Legislative Platform

Council adopted the City of Brea Legislative Platform for the 2018 Legislative Session.

Committee Member Recruitment Process

Council designated two (2) Council Members to serve as the Interview Committee and directed staff to schedule applicant interviews for committee openings.

CFD Annual Financial Report

The City Council received and filed the Community Facilities Districts Annual Financial Report for fiscal year ended June 30, 2016.

Measure M2 Expenditure Report

The City Council adopted Resolution 2017-071 concerning the Measure MS expenditure report for the City of Brea.

Lease and Maintenance of Digital Printing/Copying Equipment

The City Council authorized the Purchasing Agent to execute the Lease and Maintenance Agreements with the Xerox Corporation for a total of \$129,527 based on a sixty (60) month lease of digital printing/copying equipment, plus as-needed print charges of \$27,434 per year, and to issue annual purchase orders based on available budget appropriations.

Improvements for Reservoir and Tonner Pump Station

The City Council accepted improvements and approved the warranty agreements and bonds for Tract 16976 (Backbone) and Tract 16642 (PA6); and Improvements for 830 Reservoir and Tonner Pump Station in the Blackstone Development.

Agreements for Property Located at 500 S. Kraemer Blvd

The City Council accepted the final map; approved the subdivision agreement and bonds; and approved the site maintenance and restoration agreement for the property located at 500 S. Kraemer Boulevard.

PSA with Trinity Sound Company

The City Council awarded a Professional Services Agreement to Trinity Sound Company to provide the Curtis Theatre building monitor and PA system upgrade in the amount \$79,568, as well as needed repairs and maintenance service for a maximum of \$25,000 per year for up to five (5) years.

January 16

Amendment to the Brea City Code

Police Captain Burks discussed minor changes and explained that the service contract with the County of Orange requires the City to adopt municipal animal control codes that are identical to County animal control ordinances. Passed.

LLMD Annual Maintenance Assessment

The City Council adopted Resolution Nos. 2018-001 through 2018-007 ordering the Director of Public Works to prepare and file improvement, maintenance costs and assessment reports for Landscape and Lighting Maintenance Districts 1 through 7.

Orange County Federal Transportation Improvement Program

The City Council adopted Resolution No. 2018-008 certifying funding and affirming commitment to implement projects in fiscal years 2018/19-2023/24.

Purchase of Pierce Arrow XT Pumper

The City Council authorized the Purchasing Agent to issue a Purchase Order for \$669,182.37 to South Coast Fire Equipment for a Pierce Arrow XT Pumper.

Agreement with Onward Engineering

The City Council approved Amendment No. 1 to Professional Services Agreement with Onward Engineering for additional construction management and inspection services on Capital Improvement Projects.

PSA for Forensic Phlebotomy Services

The City Council approved the Professional Services Agreement with California Forensic Phlebotomy, Inc. to provide as-needed Forensic Phlebotomy Services in an amount not to exceed \$25,000 per year, and authorized the City Manager to exercise up to four (4) optional one-year extensions.

Non-Housing Bonds

City Council approved a bond proceeds funding agreement between the City of Brea and the Successor Agency to the Brea Redevelopment Agency for the 2011A Non-Housing Bonds.
