## Brea Fire and Police Personnel Stay Prepared; Do You?

The safety of the Brea Community is the top priority for the Brea City Council. Every day, the men and women of the Brea Fire and Police Departments work 24 hours a day to protect and serve residents, visitors and the business community. In addition to emergency response, preparedness, planning, training communication, outreach and community engagement, are also vital components of an effective public safety effort.



### September is National Preparedness Month

Again this year the Brea Fire Department is highlighting September as National Preparedness Month. The 2018 theme is: "Disasters Happen. Prepare Now. Learn How." The Brea Fire Department encourages you take this opportunity to get prepared. Take time to learn lifesaving skills, such as CPR and first aid; check your insurance policies; consider costs associated with disasters and save for an emergency. 

## Community Video Partner

Become a Community Video Partner by registering your video surveillance cameras with Brea Police using our easy online form. This voluntary program will provide Brea police with an important, time-saving tool in the event of a crime. All camera locations are kept in a secure database and police will not have direct access to surveillance systems. Anyone with a home or business video surveillance is encouraged to register to help keep Brea safe.

### Commit to Preparedness with CERT

CERT classes for the fall session will start Tuesday, October 2. Community Emergency Response Team, better known as CERT, is a nationwide program to train citizen responders to offer assistance in large scale disasters or other local emergencies. In Brea, hundreds have taken the extra step to raise their level of preparedness. Several neighborhood teams of volunteers now provide a measure of service that improves safety for all.

## National Preparedness Month, Your Time to Learn and Act

**W**e never know when an emergency will strike. But, you can prepare now to help protect yourself and your family in the event of a crisis. This page includes helpful information and reminders that you can use to start planning today. Find more information at [cityofbrea.net/em](http://cityofbrea.net/em).

### Clear the Way for Safety at Home

The Brea Fire Department will be conducting weed and brush clearance inspections throughout the next few months. Inspection protects your home and our community during fire season. Please refer to the following standards:

- Areas within 100 feet of structures will be cleared of vegetation and other combustible growth.
- Areas within 10-feet of roads or highways will be cleared.
- Weed removal must be kept to a minimum of two to three inches from the soil surface. All cuttings shall be removed or disked into the ground if irrigation is provided.
- Combustible hazards, i.e.—trash, furniture and wood will be cleared as required.
- Vegetation trimmings, combustible debris and dead or dying plant material will be removed.
- Limbs on trees must be removed six feet from the ground to prevent grass fires from climbing.
- Remove portions of trees that extend within 10 feet of a chimney flue outlet.

Register with this county-wide mass notification system to be contacted via phone, email or text should an emergency threaten your Brea home or business. For those already registered, be sure to update any contact information that has changed. Go to [AlertOC.com](http://AlertOC.com).

Only those who have opted in to the system will be called during the test. Log in to add your cell phone, work phones and email. You can register everyone in the family to be sure you all stay informed during emergencies.

### National Wireless Emergency Alert Test

September 20 • 11:20 a.m.

FEMA and the FCC will conduct a nationwide test of the Emergency Alert System (EAS) and Wireless Emergency Alert. Find out more about these alerts and how they are used in an emergency at [ready.gov/alerts](http://ready.gov/alerts).

### Great California Shake Out

### Is Your Smoke Alarm Working?

A smoke alarm can provide a life-saving early warning. Brea Fire recommends that



you change the batteries on all of your alarms at least once a year. An easy way to remember is to change your batteries when you change the time this November. Always use fresh batteries. Smoke alarms work every minute of every day, so replace your alarms after 10 years.

### “Run, Hide, Fight”

Active Shooter incidents have occurred repeatedly for some time now. What can you do if you encounter this situation? While, there is no fail safe advice for every situation, Homeland Security recommends that you understand the following action steps.

**Run** — Have an escape route in mind. Leave belongings behind. Keep hands visible.

**Hide** — Stay out of view. Block entry to a hiding place. Silence cell phone.

**Fight** — If in imminent danger, a last resort is to throw items and act with physical aggression.




**Brea Line summarizes Council business.**

## July 17

### Electric Vehicle Charging Infrastructure

Council authorized the City Manager to receive up to \$56,570 from Mobile Source Air Pollution Reduction Review Committee for Electric Vehicle Charging Infrastructure Installation at the Brea Superblock I Parking Structure.

### Planned Community Zone

Council directed staff to prepare a code amendment for consideration at a later meeting after discussing updates to provisions of the Zoning Code relating to the Planned Community Zone.

### Commercial Organics Recycling Program

Council reviewed the report, selected an implementation option and directed staff to bring back formal program fee details for consideration at upcoming Council meeting.

### Madrona Project

Council adopted Resolution No. 2018-046, repealing and setting aside Resolution No. 2014-039 and Resolution No. 2014-040, concerning approval of a residential development within the area of vesting Tentative Tract Map No. VTTM15956.

### Brea Plaza Area Public Improvements

Council, by minute action, approved a First Amendment to Sublease, approved a Second Amendment to Joint Community Facilities Agreement and authorized the City Manager to execute amending documents.

### Cliffwood Pavement Rehabilitation and Waterline Replacement, and Alleyways Rehabilitation

Council approved Plans and Specifications and authorized the City Clerk to advertise and receive bids for the Cliffwood Pavement Rehabilitation and Waterline Replacement and Alleyways Rehabilitation, CIP Projects 7315, 7316, 7317, and 7461.

### 57/Lambert Road Interchange Improvement Project

Council 1) Approved the Cooperative Agreement, Project Baseline Agreement and Funding Summary between the City of Brea and Caltrans; and 2) Authorized the City Manager to execute the Cooperative Agreement and any subsequent amendments to the Cooperative Agreement, Project Baseline Agreement and/or Funding Summary upon approval as to form by the City Attorney.

### Software/Hardware Maintenance Support and Online Subscription Service Agreements

Council authorized the Purchasing Agent to approve renewal agreements with various support services providers for the life of the computer software or hardware and for online software subscription service and authorized the Purchasing Agent to issue purchase orders for the renewal agreements and subscription services that do not to exceed available budget appropriations.

### Annual Vehicles and Equipment Purchase Plan for Fiscal Year 2018-19

Council authorized the Purchasing Agent to issue purchase orders in an amount not-to-exceed \$612,550 for various City vehicles and equipment described in the Annual Vehicles and Equipment Purchase Plan for Fiscal Year 2018-19.

### Agreement with UniFirst Corporation

Council approved the agreement and authorized the City Manager to execute agreement with UniFirst Corporation to provide Public Works uniforms and related services.

### Upcoming City Council Topics July-December 2018

Council received and filed the report.

### Ladder Fire Truck Purchase

Council approved the purchase of a 1998 American LaFrance 105' Aerial Ladder Fire Truck for reserve use for \$49,999 from the City of Vernon, approved \$10,000 for repairs and upgrades and approved \$10,000 for annual maintenance costs; and authorized the City Manager to execute the agreement with the City of Vernon.

## August 21

### Public Hearing to Amend Title 20 of the Brea Zoning Ordinance

Council introduced Ordinance No. 1204, an Ordinance of the City Council of the City of Brea adopting Zoning Ordinance Amendment No. ZOA 18-01, amending definitions related to wireless facilities, prohibiting short-term rentals, and amending Title 20 the City of Brea Zoning Ordinance.

### Public Hearing for the Establishment and Adjustment of Development Related User Fees

Council continued the item to the September 18, 2018 meeting.

### Public Hearing to Increase Existing Fees for Certain City Services

Council, by motion, adopted Resolution No. 2018-048, increasing existing fees for certain City services.

### Fiscal Year 2018-2019 City Council Priorities and Project Updates

Council received and filed the report.

### Homeland Security Funds

Adopted Resolution No. 2018-049, which authorizes and designates City staff to perform as an Applicants Agent to complete and sign State and Federal documents related to homeland security, disaster response and disaster recovery.

### Local Agency Investment Fund

Council Adopted Resolution No. 2018-050, authorizing the City Treasurer and Administrative Services Director to invest monies on behalf of City of Brea in the State of California Treasurer's Office Local Agency Investment Fund (LAIF).

### Guidelines for the City of Brea's Employee Benefit Fund Pension Plan

Adopted the Investment Policy Guidelines for the City of Brea's Employee Benefit Fund Pension Plan through Public Agency Retirement Services (PARS).

### Investment in the Local Agency Investment Fund for the Successor Agency

Adopted Resolution No. SA 2018-05 authorizing the City Treasurer and Administrative Services Director to invest monies on behalf of the Successor Agency to the Brea Redevelopment Agency in the State of California Treasurer's Office Local Agency Investment Fund (LAIF).

### City of Brea/Successor Agency to the Brea Redevelopment Agency Statement of Investment Policy

Approved the City of Brea/Successor Agency to the Brea Redevelopment Agency Statement of Investment Policy.



## November Brings Change in Irrigation Schedule


Beginning November 1 through March 31, the watering schedule changes in order to comply with Brea's water conservation ordinance. Outdoor irrigation is limited to once a week on Mondays. In addition, please keep these regulations in mind

- Watering may never occur between the hours of 10 a.m. and 4 p.m.
- Sprinklers may never run for longer than 15 minutes per cycle.
- Runoff can not be allowed to flow onto paved surfaces or into the storm drains.

The Brea City Council enacted a water conservation ordinance on July 16, 2009. Continued efforts to conserve remain important in order to protect supplies. Wasteful practices are always prohibited under statewide restrictions, which have been made permanent due to California's dry Mediterranean climate.

## Wildlife and Hot Weather

During hot weather, many animals, particularly rattlesnakes, become more active looking for shelter and water. While rattlesnakes are plentiful in California, native snakes are not a cause for concern unless provoked. To report a snake on your property, contact the OC Animal Control at 714-935-6848.
