Mid-Year Budget Update

The Brea City Council considers its financial stewardship one of its top priorities. The City evaluates financial trends, projects revenues and expenditures, and identifies potential issues so that they can be dealt with proactively. A mid-year budget review was presented by Administrative Services Director Cindy Russell at the February 5 City Council meeting. (You can view the video at cityofbrea.net/councilagenda.)

Highlights of the Presentation

- The General Fund Budget for last Fiscal Year (FY 2017/18) ended with revenues over expenditures of \$529,261 due largely to reduced spending by city departments and salary savings from vacant positions. Increased online sales continues to negatively impact sales tax revenue.
- Revenues over expenditures for the current FY 2018/19 is estimated at \$1,705,910 due primarily to the receipt of a number of one-time revenues including, a sales tax spike resulting from auto sales; delayed sales tax revenue from last fiscal year; deferred rent from Birch Hills Golf Course; a grant from CalTrans; and a reimbursement for Fire Department Strike Team Responses.
- Estimates for FY 2019/20 show a 6.5% increase in Property Tax revenues and a 3.2% drop in sales tax revenues, as compared to FY 2018/19, which included the one-time sales tax spikes previously discussed.
- As a standard practice, the City of Brea forecasts revenues and expenditures over a five-year period as a planning tool. If a deficit is forecast, City officials have time to strategically cut expenses or raise revenues to close projected deficits. City Council policy requires adoption of a balanced budget.
- Projections through FY 2023/24 show that even though both sales and property tax estimates indicate improvement, there is more work to be done to close potential future budget gaps. Potential recessionary impacts are not included in these projections. However, the City carefully watches for any indication of an economic downturn.
- As in previous years, the City Council will continue to work with City staff to develop solutions in order close any projected budget gaps.

It is anticipated that the Public Hearing for the FY 2019/20 budget will be held Tuesday, June 18 in the City Council Chambers, Level One, Brea Civic & Cultural Center.

Brea Police Chief Conklin Set to Retire May 3

Brea Police Chief Jack Conklin will retire as Chief effective May 3, 2019 following a career in police services of over 40 years. Captain John Burks, a 27-year veteran of the Brea Police Department, was selected as the new Police Chief for Brea.

Chief Jack Conklin began his career in law enforcement as a Deputy Sheriff with the Orange County Sheriff's Department in 1986. He joined the Brea Police Department in 1989 and rose through the ranks and was appointed Brea Police Chief in 2010. Under Conklin's leadership, Brea has maintained its strong reputation as a safe community serving 43,000 residents and 125,000 people, who visit Brea daily.

A firm believer that building a strong partnership with the community is critical to public safety, Conklin initiated a number of department community efforts including: Love Brea, a city-wide day of service, police department social media outreach and expanded participation at community events and on regional committees. Conklin was also instrumental in securing state funding to help address the issues of Homelessness and providing healthy alternatives for Brea's "At Risk Youth" through his participation on the North Orange County Public Safety Task Force's governing board.

Captain John Burks currently serves as the department's Uniform Division Commander overseeing operations in Patrol, Traffic, SWAT, and Communications. Burks became a Brea Police Officer in November 1991.

He rose steadily through the ranks serving in a variety of positions. Burks holds a Master's degree from Chapman University in Organizational Leadership and is a graduate of the FBI National Academy and California P.O.S.T Command College.

Call 911 When You Can Text 911 When You Can't

Text-to-911 Service Launched in Orange County

Now you can text emergencies to 911 in Brea and throughout Orange County using your cell phone. Enter 911 as the destination address in the text message followed by your location and a brief description of the emergency. While dispatchers will have a geolocation from your cell phone, they will not have your exact address, so provide specific location information whenever possible.

Brea Police Dispatch will be able to transfer text messages to all Orange County Public Safety Answering Points (PSAPs), including Orange County Fire Authority, Metro Net Fire and some surrounding counties. The dispatcher will also be able to monitor the text conversation to ensure the correct jurisdiction/agency has been reached and that there is no information pertinent to the dispatcher's own agency.

Text-to-911 provides equal access to emergency services for the hearing and speech impaired community, as well as an alternate method of reporting emergencies when traditional avenues are unavailable. It is not available in all areas and while roaming.

It is important to note that calling 911 and talking to a dispatcher is still the most efficient way to report an emergency. Only use Text-to-911 in those instances when you cannot call.

WARNING: Just like calling 911, Text-to-911 is for emergencies only. Prank callers or texters can be identified and will be prosecuted.

The Future Looks Bright for New BOUSD Futures Academy Program



One of the main goals for the Brea Olinda Unified School District (BOUSD) is "Added Value Education" and "Opportunity for All" students. The District believes that every student has the ability to succeed academically, behaviorally and socially. Consequently, The Futures Academy was created. Beginning in the 2018-19 school year, it is the newest program addition to the Brea Canyon High School and Country Hills Elementary School campuses. The program offers those BOUSD students with social, emotional and behavioral needs with an alternative, quality education that emphasizes individualized instruction in a smaller, self-contained environment.

Futures Academy students, with the support of a specially-trained aide and a special education teacher, work on projects and assignments in a contemporary flexible environment. The program empowers students to develop positive social skills necessary in order to transition into a less restrictive classroom setting.

Another goal of Futures Academy is to reintegrate students who had left BOUSD into a comprehensive campus. Since its induction, there has been an increase in the number of students being served by Futures. All Secondary Futures Academy students have "mainstreamed" into at least one general education classroom on either the Brea Olinda High School or Brea Canyon High School main campus. The future sure is looking bright for this new program.

A Review of City Council Actions on Ordinances, Hearings and Contracts

Brea Line summarizes Council business.

January 15

Site Drive Engineering and Traffic Survey

City Council adopted an Ordinance amending the Brea City Code regarding prima facie speed limits upon Site Drive.

Change in Zoning Map Boundaries

City Council provided direction to initiate the review process to consider an amendment to change the boundaries of the Zoning Map from Industrial Commercial (CM) to Planned Community (PC) for property located at the southeast corner of Mercury Ln and Berry St, and additionally provided staff input regarding information it will need to consider within future project consideration. Applicant: Manley-Fanticola, LLC.

Small Cell Site Facilities

City Council adopted an Urgency Ordinance establishing regulations applicable to the location and installation of small wireless facilities in public rights of way.

Street Sweeping Enforcement

City Council passed a motion to suspend street sweeping enforcement for a period of one (1) year.

Sewer License and Maintenance Agreement

City Council approved the Sewer License and Maintenance Agreement with the Orange County Sanitation District for a Dosing Station located at 835 S. Brea Blvd.

Annual Maintenance Assessment in Landscape and Lighting Maintenance Districts

City Council adopted Resolutions authorizing the Director of Public Works to prepare and file reports relating to annual maintenance assessments in Landscape and Lighting Maintenance Districts 1 through 7.

Parcel Map Acceptance

City Council accepted the Final Parcel Map for Commercial Condominium Purposes for 1800 E. Lambert Rd.

Additional Temporary Staffing Services

City Council authorized the Purchasing Agent to issue a change order with Ledgent Finance & Accounting increasing the amount from \$49,999.51 to \$100,000.

Telephone and Voicemail System

City Council approved the agreement with InteleSysOne to furnish and install a Mitel telephone and voicemail system in an amount of \$313,005.36 and authorized the Purchasing Agent to execute renewal of support services agreements for the life of the telephone and voicemail system.

Purchasing Policy Limits Update

City Council adopted a Resolution updating the Purchasing Policy Limits for the City's Purchasing System specific to Public Works projects as provided by Assembly Bill 2249.

February 5

Recurring and Non-Recurring Fees for Small Wireless Facilities

City Council adopted a Resolution establishing fees for processing permit applications and administering permits for small wireless facilities.

Budget Adjustments for Fiscal Year 2018-19

City Council adopted Resolutions appropriating funds to adjust the Fiscal Year 2018-19 City Operating and Capital Improvement Program Budgets.

Senior Fiscal Analyst Added to City's Position Allocation List

City Council adopted the classification specification and salary range for the position of Senior Fiscal Analyst, amended the position allocation list for FY 2018-19, and assigned the classification into the City of Brea Administrative and Professional Employees' Association Bargaining Unit for representation purposes.

PSA for Engineering Project Management Services

City Council approved a Professional Services Agreement with Interwest Consulting Group for

Engineering Project Management Services in the annual amount not-to-exceed \$150,000 for two (2) years, plus three (3) one-year extensions, pending City Council approval.

Purchase of Suppressors for Police Department Patrol Rifles

City Council approved the purchase of suppressors for the Police Department patrol rifles.

PSA for Parks, Recreation and Human Services Planning Services

City Council approved a Professional Services Agreement with LPA, Inc. for Parks, Recreation and Human Services Planning Services in the amount not-to-exceed \$50,000.

PSA for Design of Water Main Replacement Project

City Council approved a Professional Services Agreement with Civiltec Engineering, Inc. for the Design of Water Main Replacement Project at various locations in the amount of \$320,505 plus 10% contingency.

Appointments to the North Orange County Cities Joint Powers Authority Board of Directors

City Council adopted a Resolution designating Mayor Pro Tem Simonoff and Council Member Vargas to serve as Directors, and Council Member Hupp as Alternate Director in either of their absence, on the North Orange County Cities Joint Powers Authority Board of Directors and named one additional City Council Member to serve as Alternate to the NÖCCJPA Board.

Mid-Year Budget Update

City Council was presented a mid-year budget update and concurred that policy decisions will be further discussed on the City's General Fund Reserves and Section 115 Trust Account through PARS at an upcoming Budget Workshop.

Commercial Organics Recycling Program

City Council directed staff to begin the process of implementing the Mandatory Commercial Organics Recycling Program (AB 1826) and set a Public Hearing for April 16, 2019, with a 45-day noticing requirement, absent of the franchise fee, which is 3.2% of the total rate.

February 19

Wildlife Management Plan — Coyotes

City Council adopted a Coyote Management Plan and the first reading of an Ordinance prohibiting the feeding or making food available to non-domesticated animals.

Kitchen Equipment for the Brea Senior Center





Changes to Street Sweeping Service and Parking Enforcement

Street Sweeping Schedule Change

Effective March 1, 2019, Brea's Street Sweeping Program schedule will change from weekly to twice per month. The change was made in order to manage the cost of providing the service, which has been subsidized for a number of years.



Street sweeping in neighborhoods will be either the first and third weeks of the month, or the second and fourth weeks of the month. Check the new signs posted in neighborhoods, or view the map showing the new schedule at cityofbrea.net/streetsweeping.

Street Sweeping Parking Enforcement Suspended

Brea's Street Sweeping parking enforcement is suspended for an approximately one-year evaluation period. Drivers will no longer be cited for parking on the streets during street sweeper operation. However, residents are still encouraged to park vehicles off the streets on designated sweeping days for proper street cleaning.

PLEASE NOTE: This change does NOT affect overnight parking. Overnight street parking in Brea is still prohibited between the hours of 2-6 a.m.

The City of Brea and Republic Services will be giving away compost for FREE on Saturday, April 20, 2019 from 8 to 10:30 a.m., at Tri City Park, 2301 N. Kraemer Blvd., Placentia. Please bring your own containers to fill (no bags). There is a limit of 60 gallons per household, while supplies last.

Compost creates healthier soil by adding organic matter and improving soil structure. Healthy soil uses water more efficiently, allowing available water to flow toward your plants' roots, storing water in the soil longer, and reducing runoff and erosion.

To receive free compost, residents must provide proof of residency (California driver's license or utility bill).
