



## Major 57 Freeway/Lambert Road Interchange Improvement Project to Begin in July; Expected to be Completed by December 2021

A \$98 million improvement project on the 57 Freeway/Lambert Road Interchange in Brea is set to begin in July. Improvements include providing additional capacity, better traffic flow, enhanced safety, reduced congestion and delays. Additionally, the project will enable the future construction of the Northbound Truck Climbing Lane, between Lambert Road and the Orange County and Los Angeles County line.

City staff will work with Caltrans to minimize construction disruption, manage traffic and support ongoing communication throughout the project. Specifically the project includes:

- Reconfiguring ramps, including construction of a loop on-ramp at the south-east quadrant.
- Modify the northbound and southbound ramps.
- Adding 0.4 miles of auxiliary lanes on southbound mainlines.

- Widen Lambert Road and lower the street profile to provide 15-foot standard vertical clearance for the Lambert Road under-crossing.
- Widening the northbound Lambert Road under-crossing bridge to accommodate the future truck-climbing lane project.

Brea was awarded approximately \$75 million from State and Federal funds. The City has also committed about \$12 million for the project from its local mitigation funds, and was awarded over \$12 million from OCTA Measure M2 funds, now known as “OC Go” funds, for property acquisition and construction. All in, approximately 88% of the project funding comes from grants. City staff will work with Caltrans to minimize construction disruption, manage traffic and support ongoing communication throughout the project.

## Be Prepared: Register for Spring CERT Classes!

**R**aise your level of preparedness to protect our neighborhoods in the event of a natural disaster or hazard by joining the Brea CERT program! In Brea, several neighborhood teams of volunteers now provide a measure of service that improves safety for the community. The Brea Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) program educates people about disaster preparedness and trains them in basic disaster response skills, such as fire safety, light search and rescue, team organization, and disaster medical operations.



CERT training is provided using a nationally-recognized 20-hour curriculum approved by the Federal Emergency Management Agency. With training learned in the classroom during practical exercises, CERT members will be able to assist others in their neighborhood or workplace in an event when emergency responders are not immediately available to assist. In Brea, hundreds have taken the extra step to raise their level of preparedness.

The training is provided free of charge, but pre-registration is required for each class. The City of Brea works in cooperation with the cities of Placentia and Yorba Linda to provide the training. Registration for spring classes is now open and featuring a new class schedule on Fridays and Saturdays for more convenient class times! Classes begin May 31 and run until June 8. Sign up early as registration is on a first-come, first-served basis with a limited number of applicants.

## Olinda Elementary Students to Help a Friend Find his Voice

Five fifth grade students from Olinda Elementary School recently put their heads together to come up with a one-of-a-kind invention that could help their friend Justin, a non-verbal student.


Using the design process, they identified the problem, conducted research, and developed a solution that they call the “Vest Buddy.” The “Vest Buddy” is a wearable, augmented alternative- communication vest that allows students (like their friend Justin) to communicate so that he can be included in sports and playground activities. As far as the district knows, this vest is a first of its kind.

As impressive as the technology is, the reason for designing it is just as important. The project came about when their teacher, Ms. Jill Berner, asked the students if they would like to work on a “Passion Project.” Ms. Berner introduced the students to Justin, who uses an AAC (Augmentative and alternative communication) device to communicate with his parents and friends. The students learned that Justin loves playing soccer. However, when he is out on the field he cannot take his AAC device, making it difficult for him to communicate with his friends and fellow teammates.

The students immediately found the inspiration for their passion project and set out to create a wearable vest for Justin. The team went through several prototypes before getting it right—often working through recess and on weekends. Now, they have a vest that has a different phrase programmed for each button and Justin can be part of the fun.



The students recently received coverage from local media (you may have seen them on KTLA 5 with Lynette Romero) and hope to patent their idea in the near future. In an educational world where science, technology, engineering, and math are stressed, these students are proving that learning is as much about being smart and innovative as it is about being a good person.

## Construction Set to Begin for Last Phase of Central Park Village by Summer's End

Grading has begun for the last development phase of Central Park Village. By the end of summer Trumark Homes will begin constructing 62 attached three-story townhomes and a three-story building with 20 affordable residential flats. Upon completion, all units will be available for sale, and Central Park Village will be completed.

Construction for Central Park Village began in 2009 at the former Brea Community Hospital site, just south of Central Ave. and Site Dr. The mixed-use development consists of the Trumark townhomes; The Element, a community of 81 townhomes; a 39,000 square foot medical office building; Calligraphy, a 206-unit apartment building; a parking structure with 568 parking stalls; and Central Park, a public park with a splash pad, playground equipment, and art.

## Spring Showers Causes Increase in Mosquito Sources

Warmer weather on the horizon combined with recent heavy rain can create the perfect environment for mosquito breeding. The OC Mosquito and Vector Control District urges residents to regularly inspect their property for any stagnant water that can contribute to an increase in mosquitoes.

Mosquitoes can complete their life cycle from egg to adult in about a week and only need a bottle cap full of water to develop. Common sources for mosquito breeding include plant saucers, buckets, tires, pet water bowls, trash cans, and landscaping with low lying areas. Areas of collected water should be emptied or drained, containers should be tightly sealed to prevent mosquito entry, unnecessary containers should be removed from yards, and green unmaintained pools should be cleaned.

A Review of City Council Actions on Ordinances, Hearings and Contracts

**April 16**

### CAFR for Fiscal Year Ended June 30, 2018

The City's Comprehensive Annual Financial Report (CAFR) for the Fiscal Year ended June 30, 2018 and related audit reports were received and filed.

### Replacement of AT&T Copper Wire Phone Circuit Lines

Council authorized the City's Procurement & Contracts Administrator to sign an agreement and any subsequent renewals for AT&T to add Session Initiation Protocol (SIP) telephone trunk lines to replace the City's current Primary Rate Interface (PRI) physical line, at a net cost of \$6,624 per year for a three-year term. The action establishes redundant Internet access capabilities for improved Disaster Recovery by replacing the current AT&T copper wire phone circuit lines with a virtual connection.

### Annual Engineer's Report for Maintenance Districts

Council approved the Annual Engineer's Report for Landscape and Lighting Maintenance Districts Nos. 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6 and 7 and adopted the Resolutions of Intent to set a Public Hearing for each District on June 4, 2019, at 7:00 p.m.

### Public Hearing to Consider a Solid Waste Services Rate Increase

Council received public input and discussed the proposed solid waste services rate increase of 3.06% for commercial customers for an organics recycling program, as well as an amendment to the Brea Disposal contract. Motion was made to close the public hearing and continue an approval of a resolution and agreement to a later date.

## March 5

### Wildlife Management Plan — Coyotes

Council adopted an Ordinance prohibiting feeding or making food available to non-domesticated animals.

### Wildcatters Dog Park Concept Plan

Council approved concept plans and the process for prepare cost estimates and construction drawings for the Wildcatters Dog Parks.

### Orange Ave Pavement Improvements

Council authorized funding of \$90,000 from the Capital Improvement Project budget for pavement improvements on Orange Ave from Imperial Hwy to Birch St.

### Arovista Park Slope Improvements

Council adopted a Resolution to appropriate an additional \$91,859 from the Fixed Asset Replacement Fund for construction and project administration. Council also authorized the Director of Public Works to award the contract to Aramexx Group, Inc. in the amount of \$166,850 and authorized the Public Works Director or his designee to issue contract change orders up to a "not to exceed" amount of 15% of the contract.

## March 15

### Council-Executive Staff Workshop

Council and staff met to discuss the prior year's goals and current year's accomplishments; update of 2018-19 City Council Priorities; five (5) year budget projections; budget strategies; and next steps.

## March 19

### 2018 General Plan Annual Report

Assistant Planner Mares provided a presentation to Council on the development in the City, Brea Core Plan, Housing, Regional Housing Needs Allocation (RHNA) progress, community resources, and public safety.

### Traffic Diverter at Cliffwood Ave and State College Blvd

Public Works Director Olmos provided background, highlighted information from the March 7 Special Traffic Committee meeting, discussed traffic issues east bound on State College, noted that a Working Group will include residents from Country Lane HOA, and stated that more data is needed.

### Street Striping and Pavement Markings Maintenance Agreement

Council awarded the annual pavement striping maintenance contract in the amount of \$60,000 to Orange County Striping Service, Inc. for the marking and striping of streets throughout the City of Brea for a one-year period with the opportunity to renew the contract annually for four years.

### PSA Amendment for Reclaimed Water Conversion Project

Council approved an amendment to the Professional Services Agreement with Carollo Engineers to expand a feasibility study for the City Reclaimed Water Conversion Project (CIP 7932) in the amount of \$28,166 and total contract not to exceed \$67,233.

### Zoll X Series Cardiac Monitor

Council approved the purchase of five Zoll X Series Cardiac Monitors for the Fire Department in the amount of \$154,077.

## April 2

### PSA for the Design of Water and Sewer Projects

Council approved a Professional Services Agreement with Kabbara Engineering in the amount of \$231,846, plus 10% contingency, for the Design of Water and Sewer Projects at various locations. No General Fund impact.

### Projects Funded by SB: 1 — The Road Repair & Accountability Act

Council adopted a Resolution of projects to be funded by the SB1: Road Repair and Accountability Act of 2017 within Fiscal Year 2019-20. No General Fund impact.

### Contract for Water Main Replacement and Alley Rehabilitation Projects


Council adopted a Resolution to appropriate an additional \$1,350,000 from the Water Fund (Fund 420) and \$200,000 from the Measure M Fund (Fund 260) for project construction, contingency, and administration; and receive bids and awarded contract to Sully Miller Contracting Company in the amount of \$2,694,000; and authorized the Public Works Director or his designee to issue contract change orders up to a "not to exceed" amount of 10% of the contract price. No General Fund impact.

### City Council Agenda Item Requests During General Session

Council approved proposed revisions to the City Council Code of Conduct regarding future agenda item requests.

### MOU for North Orange County Service Planning Area Homelessness Outreach Efforts

Council approved the Memorandum of Understanding for the North Orange County Service Planning Area and authorized the Mayor and the City Clerk to execute the agreement on behalf of the City; and authorized the City Manager to approve non-substantive changes to the Memorandum of Understanding as needed.
