



Community Begins Conversation for Future Walking and Biking Improvements in Brea


In spring, Brea began a series of outreach events for its Connecting the Core Active Transportation Plan (ATP). Following the work of Brea Envisions, this continues a collaborative effort with the community to prepare a long-range plan for improving mobility for bicyclists, pedestrians, transit riders and motorists in the city's core. Ultimately, this effort will provide an action plan to guide future street and sidewalk improvements.

Events with feedback opportunities were held throughout the months of May and June to assess which element of active transportation is a priority — Access, Design or Safety. Over 450 responses were received, and safety was a key priority, along with Bike Improvements, Pedestrian Improvements and Slower Vehicles/Traffic Enforcement. Ultimately, all the elements work together to improve mobility and improving just one element can have a positive impact on the others.

The next phase of this effort is designing what improvements and street sections could potentially look like to aid in active transportation. A Design Workshop was held on June 19 where participants were provided with maps of Brea's Core Plan Area to draw and make note of particular areas and elements they thought could be improved. A "Pop-Up" version of this design phase will be at events throughout the City during July and August. Keep an eye out, don't miss this opportunities to provide your input!

Brea Core Area



Brea City Council Approves Operating Budgets and Capital Improvement Program for Fiscal Year 2019-20


At the June 18 Brea City Council meeting, the Council approved the Fiscal Year (FY) 2019-20 five operating budgets, along with the Capital Improvement Program Budget. You can review the budget presentation and the entire budget document online at cityofbrea.net. The approved FY 2019-20 City Operating Funds total \$101 million, including the General Fund Operating Budget.

General Fund

The General Fund Budget is the financial plan for the City of Brea for the fiscal year, which began July 1, 2019. The revenues are budgeted at \$55.5 million and there are \$55.3 million in budgeted expenditures. The General Fund Budget is used to support City services such as police, fire and parks, recreation, human services as well as planning, community development and administrative support services. Brea currently maintains a reserve balance of 25% of its annual expenditures.

Revenues

- Sales tax revenue is still the City's single largest revenue source, representing 37% of the FY 2019-20 budget, even although online sales continue to negatively impact this revenue source.
- Property taxes continue to grow as the City receives improved housing valuations, as well as new property taxes generated from the Central Park Village development. Property taxes are the second largest revenue source and represents 21% of the FY 2019-20 budget.

Expenditures

- The General Fund expenditures overall represents a 0.49% increase in budgeted expenditures as compared to the FY 2018-19 estimated year-end expenditures. Overall department operating expenditures are relatively minimal and are flat in several areas even though cost of materials, supplies and contract services increase.
- Employees continue to contribute toward their retirement benefits at or above 100% of the employee portion. For FY 2019-20, a 2% Cost of Living Adjustment (COLA) has been budgeted for employees.

*Excludes one-time payoff of an energy efficiency loan of \$2,453,903.

Capital Improvement Program

- The Capital Improvement Program (CIP) consists of projects aimed at improving the city's public infrastructure, such as streets, transportation issues, street lights, traffic signals, parks, public buildings, sewer and storm drains, and water projects.
- Nearly \$4,000,000 in new projects are planned for this year including water main, park irrigation and street upgrades.
- Currently in construction are the 57/Lambert Interchange, alley rehabilitation projects and water and street improvements.



SR 57/Lambert Road Interchange Improvement Project Breaks Ground

- The SR 57/Lambert Interchange Improvement project is set to begin construction by late summer/early fall. The new Interchange will add capacity and relieve current and future congestion.
- The project is anticipated to be completed by December 2021.
- Caltrans, OCTA and the City of Brea have been working together for many years to get this project funded, approved and ready for construction. Caltrans is the lead agency on all aspects of construction. The City will work regularly with Caltrans in order avoid as much disruption as possible. However, a project this large and complex will no doubt result in traffic delays and detours. Please use patience and drive carefully around the interchange and follow detours.
- Approximately 70 residents attended the Community Meeting on May 22 to hear about the upcoming Interchange Improvement Project. Caltrans, OCTA and the City provided a project overview and answered questions about the \$98 million project. Participants were positive and understood the need for

the improvements. The primary issues raised were construction noise and traffic delays and detours. Caltrans reviewed the construction phasing plan and committed to ongoing communication throughout the project.

- In a ceremony on June 21, officials from the County, Caltrans, OCTA and the City of Brea officially broke ground on this much anticipated \$98 million Interchange project. Federal and State officials also attended to mark this important milestone.

Make Sure You're Prepared in the Event of a Disaster

National Preparedness Month (NPM), recognized each September, provides an opportunity to remind us that we all must prepare ourselves and our families now and throughout the year.

Take time to learn lifesaving skills — such as CPR and first aid, check your insurance policies and coverage for the hazards you may face, such as flood, earthquakes, and tornadoes. Make sure to consider the costs associated with disasters and save for an emergency. Also, know how to take practical safety steps like shutting off water and gas.

Often, we will be the first ones in our communities to take action after a disaster strikes before first responders arrive. So it is important to prepare in advance to help yourself and your community. These two pages includes helpful information and reminders that you can use to start planning today.

Register with this countywide mass notification system to be contacted via phone, email or text should an emergency threaten your Brea home or business. For those already registered, be sure to update any contact information that has changed. Go to AlertOC.com.

Log in to add your cell phone, work phones and email. You can register everyone in the family to be sure you all stay informed during emergencies.

Change Your Clock, Change Your Batteries

A smoke alarm can provide a lifesaving early warning. Brea Fire recommends that you change the batteries on all of your alarms at least once a year. An easy way to remember is to change your batteries when you change the time this November. Always use fresh batteries. Smoke alarms work every minute of every day, so replace your alarms after 10 years.



Don't Be Fooled by Scammers; Stay Alert and Informed

Scammers can target anyone, but often will concentrate on senior citizens. Criminals deceptively mask themselves as trustworthy people or companies. They will pose as Social Security workers, representatives from the Gas Company or Southern California Edison, or even the victim's grandchildren. Scammers are quite convincing, have many different tactics and can be very persuasive. They often convey a sense of urgency and alarm compelling the victim to ignore any suspicions that arise.

If you are ever in doubt about a caller, or someone who is at your door, and their claim or question seems even a little suspicious, do not hesitate to call the Brea Police Department for assistance on our non-emergency line at 714-990-7911.

Below are a few quick tips to help prevent senior-targeted crime:

Financial Scams:

- Beware of callers pretending to be family members, urgently asking for cash and/or gift cards to be mailed to them.
- Beware of callers who claim they are from the Social Security Administration. Social Security rarely contacts persons by phone unless you have on-going business with them.
- Check your personal credit every six months to monitor activity.

Mortgage Scams:

- Don't fall for quick pitches that claim to offer guarantees to save your home or prevent foreclosure.
- Always send mortgage payments directly to your mortgage service.
- Be cautious of letters or callers claiming that they need to assess the value of your home for a small fee.

Around Your Home:

- Never let strangers into your home, even if they are claiming to be from a well-known company. Always ask for ID. If in doubt, call the company before allowing access to your home.
- Don't hide keys under the doormat or in other obvious places.
- Never give out information on when you won't be at home or that you are alone.
- Don't leave packages or purses in plain view in your car.
- Keep your home well-lit at night.

Take a Pledge and Get Prepared for an Emergency

As the summer's heat is upon us, Brea Fire reminds us to be prepared. The City of Brea has received a state grant to fund a new emergency preparedness program called "California for All." The statewide goal is to engage at least one million Californians and teach them how to be better prepared for disasters. The City of Brea aims to encourage at least 1,000 Brea residents to "Pledge to Prepare" by 2020.

The grant will help build up the capacity of Brea's Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) by funding additional training, equipment, community outreach efforts and other assistance. In an emergency, CERT is a valuable extra resource to assist impacted neighborhoods when first responders are inundated with calls.

Watch for Brea CERT and Emergency Preparedness staff in the coming months out in the community. The team will provide you with important tips and guidelines and give you the opportunity to "Pledge to Prepare" by having a plan, making a kit and staying informed.

Fall Series: September 24 through October 12

Join the Brea Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) and get prepared to help protect your family, neighborhood and community in the event of a natural disaster or hazard. Registration is now open for Brea's Fall CERT Classes running from September 24 through October

12. Classes will be held on Tuesdays, Thursdays, and Saturdays. The training is provided free of charge, but pre-registration is required for each class. The City of Brea works in cooperation



with the cities of Placentia and Yorba Linda to provide the training. Sign up early, as registration is on a first come, first served basis with a limited number of applicants accepted.

The Brea (CERT) program educates people about disaster preparedness and provides training in basic disaster response skills, such as fire safety, light search and rescue, team organization, and disaster medical operations.

CERT training is provided using a nationally-recognized 20-hour curriculum approved by the Federal Emergency Management Agency. With training in the classroom and practical exercises, CERT members will be able to assist others in their neighborhood or workplace when emergency responders are not immediately available. In Brea, hundreds have taken the extra step to raise their level of preparedness, will you?

Home Fire Safety Checklist

Simple Steps to Make a Home Safer

- ✓ Clean roofs and gutters of dead leaves, debris and pine needles that could catch embers.
- ✓ Replace or repair any loose or missing shingles or roof tiles to prevent ember penetration.
- ✓ Reduce embers that could pass through vents in the eaves by installing 1/8 inch metal mesh screening.
- ✓ Clean debris from exterior attic vents and install 1/8 inch metal mesh screening to reduce embers.
- ✓ Repair or replace damaged or loose window screens and any broken windows.
- ✓ Screen, or box-in areas below patios and decks with wire mesh to prevent debris and combustible materials from accumulating.
- ✓ Move any flammable material away from wall exteriors — mulch, flammable plants, leaves and needles, firewood piles — anything that can burn.
- ✓ Remove anything stored underneath decks or porches.

May 7

Tracks at Brea Trail Project Closeout

Council approved \$188,110 of Park Development Funds from Fiscal Year 2017-18; and approved \$453,000 (\$378,000 to cover reduction in grant revenues and \$75,000 in an increase in expenditures) from Fiscal Year 2018-19.

Traffic Diverter at Cashew and Lambert; Proposed Cliffwood Working Group

Council directed staff to collect additional data and remove the traffic diverter at Cashew Ave and Lambert Rd. Council approved formation of the Cliffwood Working Group to include eight (8) residents from north of State College, eight (8) residents from south of State College, two (2) residents from the Country Road Homes, two (2) members from the Traffic Committee, and one (1) member from the School District.

Blackstone Development Water Pump Station

Council approved the Grant Deed for dedication of Lot P of Tract 16976 in fee for water pump station for Blackstone Development and authorized the City Clerk to execute and record the Grant Deed.

Public Sidewalk Easement

Council accepted the public sidewalk easement dedication for 3300 E. Birch St and authorized the City Clerk to execute and record the easement.

Partnership with U.S. Census Bureau

Council adopted a Resolution affirming the City of Brea's partnership with the U.S. Census Bureau for the 2020 Census.

PSA Amendment with Land Concern

Council approved an amendment to Professional Services Agreement for additional landscape and irrigation design services for landscape improvements in Maintenance District #3 in the additional amount of \$11,200.

Amendment to Agreement for Professional Legal Services

Council approved Amendment No.8 to the Amended and Restated Agreement for Professional Legal Services between the City of Brea and Richards, Watson & Gershon, Inc.

Budget Adjustments for Fiscal Year 2018-19

Council adopted Resolutions appropriating funds to adjust the Fiscal Year 2018-19 City Operating and Capital Improvement Program Budgets.

MOU's Approving Changes to Employees' Salaries and Benefits

Council adopted Resolutions approving Memorandums of Understanding with the Brea Police Association, the Brea Police Management Association, the Brea Management Association, the Brea City Employees' Association, the Administrative and Professional Employees' Association, the Brea Firefighters' Association and approving

changes to the Executive and Part-Time Employee's salaries and benefit policies.

Amendment to Agreement for Legal Services for the Successor Agency

Council, as the Successor Agency, approved Amendment No.6 to the Amended and Restated Agreement for Legal Services between the Successor Agency to the Brea Redevelopment Agency and Richards, Watson & Gershon, Inc. dated July 1, 2004.

Budget Adjustments to the Successor Agency for Fiscal Year 2018-19

Council, as the Successor Agency, adopted a Resolution to adjust the Fiscal Year 2018-19 Successor Agency to the Brea Redevelopment Agency Operating and Capital Improvement Program Budget.

May 21

Discussion of the Proposed Fiscal Year 2019-20 Budgets

Council discussed 2019-20 Council top priorities, Fiscal Year 2019-20 budget process, budget highlights, fiscal policies update, economic outlook, proposed operating budget by department, General Fund revenues and expenditures, sales tax trends, property tax trends, budget assumptions, five-year projections, and Fiscal Year 2018-19 revenues over expenditures options.

Paramedic Services Program Overview

Council received and filed the Paramedic Services Program Overview.

Concrete Maintenance Agreement

Council pulled this item for the removal and replacement of sidewalks, curbs, and gutters throughout the City from the agenda for consideration at a future meeting.

Completion of the Brea Civic and Cultural Center Landscape Improvements

Council accepted the contract and notice of completion for the contract with Senitica Construction for the Brea Civic and Cultural Center Landscape Improvements project; authorized the City Clerk to record Notice of Completion; and authorized the City Clerk to release the Payment and Performance Bond upon notification from the Public Works Department.

Termination of Lot Tie Covenant

Council approved the termination of a covenant and replaced it with the proposed Reciprocal Easement Agreement between 2727 E. Imperial Hwy and 2767 E. Imperial Hwy.

Accept Public Improvements for 390 N. Brea Blvd

Council accepted the improvements; released the improvement bonds; and accepted the one-year warranty bond for Final Parcel Map 2017-131 for property located at 390 N. Brea Blvd.

PSA for Design Services for Alley Rehabilitation Projects

Council pulled the Professional Services Agreement with DMS Consultants, Inc. on design services for alley rehabilitation projects from the agenda for consideration at a future meeting.

PSA for As-Needed Landscape Design Services

Council pulled the Professional Services Agreements for as-needed Landscape Design Services for Capital Improvement Projects from the agenda for consideration at a meeting.

Adoption of Revised OCTAP Regulations

Council adopted a Resolution to adopt revised regulations for the Orange County Taxi Administration Program (OCTAP) into the City Municipal Code.

Issuance of 2019 Water Revenue Refunding Bonds

Council adopted a Resolution approving the institution of proceedings to refinance the outstanding 2009 and 2010 Water Revenues Bonds of the Brea Public Finance Authority and engage professional services.

Change Order with South Coast Fire Equipment

Council authorized the Purchasing Agent to issue a change order in the amount of \$8,167.44 to the original purchase order with South Coast Fire Equipment for a Pierce Arrow XT Pumper increasing the amount from \$669,182.37 to \$677,349.81

June 4

Traffic Committee Appointment

Council appointed Darlene Chandler to the Traffic Committee; and recommended Vance Bjorklund join the Cliffwood Working Group.

Public Hearing for Levying an Assessment to LLMDs

Council approved the adoption of Resolutions levying assessments for Landscape and Lighting Maintenance Districts (LLMDs) #1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6 and 7 for Fiscal Year 2019-20.

Carbon Canyon Road Corridor Study

Council received and filed the Carbon Canyon Road (SR 142) Phase II Corridor Study; and adopted a Resolution recommending the prohibition of vehicles and combination vehicles with an overall length greater than 30 feet kingpin-to-rear axle on Carbon Canyon Road.

Mitigation Agreements for the SR 57 Freeway and Lambert Rd Interchange Improvements

Council approved the Mitigation Agreement with Puente Hills Habitat Preservation Authority; approved the Fund Agreement for the Brea 57 Lambert Mitigation Endowment Fund with The San Diego Foundation; and approved the Fund Agreement for the Brea 57 Lambert Easement Endowment Fund with The San Diego Foundation in the cumulative amount of \$1,256,858.

June 18

Budget Adoptions for FY 2019-20

Council received public input and approved the Fiscal Year 2019-20 proposed Operating Budget and the Seven-Year Capital Improvement Program (CIP) Budget.
