**Installed:** October 25, 2016

**Artists' Statement:** Although the sculptures seem to be held together with fragile, glass rivets, the structural

integrity of the piece relies on the inner strength of the steel. Just as people in our lives we may perceive as having fragile parts may surprise us with their inner strength and connection to us. Sometimes in relationships, we take turns at being the strong, reassuring one, and at other times those people need reassuring. The linked sculpture elements demonstrate this power of unity and togetherness. The suspended triangular shape on the end represents lifting and supporting those who need it; interconnected, balanced and grateful.





## What are you Putting Down Your Drain?

Practicing good habits when using kitchen and bathroom drains are important to keep them running smoothly.

To keep drains in your home running free and avoid costly plumbing repairs, please keep the following information from the OC Sanitation District in mind.

1. Do not use your kitchen drain as a trash can. A garbage disposal is actually misnamed—it is not meant to grind down food products. Food scraps and other garbage must be disposed of in the trash.
2. The only items that should go down a kitchen drain are soap and water. You may use vinegar, or baking soda, to lessen odors in the kitchen drain.
3. Things that should NOT go down the kitchen drain:
  - Fats, Oils and Grease — are the number one cause of sewage spills. They build up in your sewer line causing a blockage. Place in a container and dispose of in the trash.
  - \* Prescription Drugs — Waste water facilities cannot remove chemicals from the water. To dispose of unused drugs, search for a proper drop off location near you, or check with your local pharmacy for services. Additionally, each spring and fall the Brea Police Department hosts a National Drug Take-Back Day event at the Brea Civic & Cultural Center making it easy to safely dispose of unneeded prescription drugs. Follow City of Brea social media accounts to find out when and where.
  - Coffee grounds, egg shells, and vegetable peels — should be placed in the trash or compost.
4. The only things that can go down the toilet (besides the obvious) are toilet paper and soap. Everything else, including hair, tissue and baby wipes, must be disposed of in the trash.

## State Route 57 Freeway/Lambert Road Interchange Improvement Project Update

Construction began in late August and is now underway. Here are some highlights.

- The retaining wall along the Olen Pointe Center was demolished to make room for an additional right turn lane onto the northbound on-ramp. Construction on the new retaining wall along this area is underway.
- The retaining and sound walls along the northbound Lambert Road off-ramp were demolished and grading is underway for a new.
- Construction work is underway along the southbound Lambert Road on-ramp for the widening of the shoulder and demolition of the existing sound wall to make room for the new sound wall and southbound on-ramp lane configuration.
- Work to widen the shoulder of the southbound Lambert Road off-ramp has begun, along with construction of a new retaining wall and lane configuration.

### In Construction...



#### Brea Place

Phase II of the Brea Place development is now under construction. Located at the southwest corner of Birch Street and State College Blvd, grading is in process for two apartment buildings and parking structures. Construction is anticipated to be completed in summer 2021.

### In Process...



#### Mercury Lane Residential

This project consists of a five-story building located on a vacant lot on the southeast corner of Berry Street and Mercury Lane. The proposed building includes 114 designated workforce housing units along with

garage parking and recreational amenities, such as barbeques, an outdoor courtyard, roof top deck, a fitness center and clubhouse.



#### Brea Mall Modifications

Simon Malls has submitted plans to update the Brea Mall. The proposal includes demolition of the vacant Sears building and adding 149,000 square feet to accommodate a fitness facility, retail, restaurant uses, parking structures, and 325 residential units. This project is

anticipated to go before the Planning Commission late spring of 2020.



#### Brea 265

Owned by Aera Energy, this 265-acre site is located in the east side of Brea, just south of Lambert Road/Carbon Canyon Road, north of Rose Drive, east of Valencia Ave and west of Carbon Canyon Regional Park. The Brea 265 Specific Plan proposes a master planned residential community of 1,100 low-, medium-, and high-density residential units, parks, recreational amenities and open space, linked together by an extensive trail network that connects to the Tracks at Brea and other regional systems. This project is

anticipated to go before the Planning Commission in late spring 2020.

- ✓ Remove tree stand along with all decorations.
- ✓ Cut up natural trees and place in brown yard waste container.
- ✓ If tree is over six feet in height, it can be cut in half and placed at curbside.
- ✓ Trees in **bags** or with **flocking** are **NOT** recyclable. Cut and place in black trash container or, if extra large, schedule a bulky item pick-up.

## Stay Fire Safe this Holiday Season

### Here's some reminders from the Brea Fire Department:

- Cooking is the top cause of holiday fires, according to the U.S. Fire Administration. The most common culprit is food that's left unattended. Make sure to keep a kitchen fire extinguisher that's rated for all types of fires, and check that smoke detectors are working.
- One of every four home Christmas tree fires is caused by electrical problems. Inspect decorative light strings, and throw out any with frayed or cracked wires or broken sockets. When decorating, don't run more than three strings of lights end to end. Extension cords should be in good condition and UL-rated for indoor or outdoor use.
- A heat source too close to the tree causes one in every four Christmas tree fires.
- Candles start two out of the five home decoration structure fires. Maintain about a foot of space between the candle and anything that can burn. Set candles on sturdy bases or cover with hurricane globes. Never leave flames unattended. Before bed, walk through each room to make sure candles are out.
- Make sure your fireplace and chimney are clean.
- Before the holiday season begins, have your chimney inspected to see if it needs cleaning. When cleaning out the fireplace, put embers in a metal container and set them outside to cool for 24 hours before disposal. Screen the fireplace to prevent embers from popping out onto the floor or carpet, and never use flammable liquids to start a fire in the fireplace.

## Help Keep Eagle Hills Holiday Lights Bright



- Parking is available at the Sports Park and Olinda Elementary School parking lot. There are restrooms at the Sports Park. Public bathrooms are not available along the route.
- Sorry, the sale of hot chocolate or coffee is prohibited, as it creates a safety hazard and makes a mess.
- Kindly use the trash bins provided to keep the neighborhood clean for other guests.
- The sidewalks are narrow; double-wide strollers are not easily maneuvered through the crowd. Please use a different form of transportation for the little ones.
- Please leave your dogs at home. What may seem like a fun walk with your pet can be scary for your "best friend." The crowds, lights, noise and excited children have proven to be too much for some animals and can create unsafe conditions.

## November Brings Change in Irrigation Schedule



Beginning November 1 through March 31, the watering schedule changes to in order to comply with Brea's water conservation ordinance. Outdoor irrigation is limited to once a week on Mondays. In addition, please keep these regulations in mind:

- Watering may never occur between the hours of 10 a.m. and 4 p.m.
- Sprinklers may never run for longer than 15 minutes per cycle.
- Runoff cannot be allowed to flow onto paved surfaces or into the storm drains.

The Brea City Council enacted a water conservation ordinance on July 16, 2009. Continued efforts to conserve remain important


in order to protect water supplies. Wasteful practices are always prohibited under statewide restrictions, which have been made permanent due to California's dry Mediterranean climate.






