The Brea Police Department has joined the Neighbors App by Ring in an effort to connect with our community to fight crime and identify suspects. The Neighbors App allows neighbors to share photos and videos from their security cameras, regardless of whether or not they use Ring products, by creating a community that informs and looks out for one another. The app allows users to remain anonymous and receive real-time notifications. Uploading videos and photos are voluntary and can assist law enforcement agencies in locating and identifying suspects. It also allows us to send messages to specific neighborhoods in the event we are searching for footage that could assist in investigations. 57 Freeway/Lambert Road Interchange Improvement Project Update

Construction is well underway on the 57 Freeway/Lambert Rd. Interchange Improvement project. These highlights are from work done since mid-September 2019.

- Work continues on the northbound off-ramp re-alignment, sound wall and retaining wall.
- The contractor began driving concrete piles for the 57 Freeway/Lambert Rd. bridge extension on the north side of the existing bridge.
- Work continues on the retaining wall along westbound Lambert Rd., adjacent to the Olen Properties.
- Work along the southbound freeway on-ramp continues with grading for shoulder widening and construction of the sound wall.

Alvero Senior Assisted Living

The property located on the southwest corner of Randolph Ave and Madison Way is under review to become a senior assisted living and memory care facility. The two-story building is proposed to have 80 rooms.



Self Storage Facility

A new three-story self-storage building is proposed for the property located at 2700 E. Imperial Hwy. The facility is designed to have 1,095 storage units.



Warehouse Building

A new 108,125 square foot warehouse and office building is in review. The proposed building will be located at 201 N. Berry St.

Join the Brea Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) and get prepared to help protect your family, neighborhood and community in the event of a natural disaster or hazard. Registration is now open for Brea's Winter CERT Classes taking place February 11 - 29. Classes will be held on Tuesdays, Thursdays, and Saturdays. The training is provided free of charge, but pre-registration is required for each class. Sign up early, as registration is on a first come, first served basis with a limited number of applicants accepted.

The Brea CERT program educates people about disaster preparedness and provides training in

basic disaster response skills, such as fire safety, light search and rescue, team organization, and disaster medical operations. CERT training is provided using a nationally-recognized, 20-hour curriculum approved by the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA). With training in the classroom and practical exercises, CERT members will be able to assist others in their neighborhood or workplace when emergency responders are not immediately available. Brea Olinda High School Celebrates 30 Years on Wildcat Way

On December 10, 2019 alumni, students, staff, families and community members gathered together in front of “the Wildcat” to celebrate 30 years since Brea Olinda High School moved to its current location at 789 Wildcat Way. Together with the community, the District spent the afternoon celebrating the achievements of those who are proud to call themselves Wildcats. On display at the event were over 60 items collected from staff, student groups and clubs on campus to represent what life is like as a 2019 wildcat. From autographed shirts and sports gear, to a signed copy of the 2019 yearbook and the Wildcat Magazine, these items will be placed in a time capsule to be opened in 2049.



With help from the Brea Museum & Historical Society, the District shared the following facts about Brea Olinda High School with those who attended the celebration.

- While history of Brea’s elementary schools’ dates to 1902, students attended high school in Fullerton until 1925. It was then, after years of negotiations between the Brea and Olinda School Districts, that the Orange County Superintendent of Schools approved the formation of the Brea Olinda Union High School District.
- The new district did not yet have a high school. In the fall of 1925, 90 incoming freshmen and sophomores attended classes in remodeled buildings at the Brea Grammar School, now known as Brea Junior High.
- Voters approved a \$320,000 bond and in 1926 the district purchased 23.5 acres on East Birch Street for the future high school. The cornerstone was laid on October 20, 1926.
- Though still under construction, campus opened to students on September 14, 1927. That spring, 10 Brea students who attended Fullerton High School were considered Brea’s first graduates. The following year 21 students graduated from the new Brea High School.
- By 1969 the high school needed major improvements. Classrooms, the auditorium, and industrial arts buildings were remodeled. Air conditioning was added to some sections of the school and new lighting was added throughout.
- By 1982 the campus needed major renovations again. After considerable research, negotiations, and land sales, a 50-acre parcel was purchased from Union Oil for \$30,000 an acre. Ground breaking occurred on November 1, 1986 and the new Brea Olinda High School was officially open to students in September 1989.

October 1

Sidewalk Vending

Council adopted an Ordinance amending Title 5 of the Brea City Code and adopted regulations for sidewalk vendors by requiring compliance with the Sidewalk Vending Policy to be consistent with the Safe Sidewalk Vending Act (SB 946).

Public Improvements for La Floresta

Council accepted public improvements for the La Floresta Development Planning Area 12B, located on the West Side of Kraemer Blvd at Orbiter Street/Portarosa Lane.

Birch Hills Golf Course Ownership Transfer Documents

Council approved the execution of documents related to the transfer of ownership of Birch Hills Golf Course to the City.

2019 Report On Water Quality

Council accepted and approved the 2019 Public Health Goals Report on Water Quality.

SB 2 Planning Grants

Council adopted a Resolution approving the submittal and receipt of a grant application for \$160,000 in funding under the SB 2 Planning Grants Program Funds; authorized the City Manager to execute the Standard Agreement and all required documents with the State of California Department of Housing and Community Development; authorized the City Manager to execute subsequent Professional Services Agreements with consultant(s) to carry out the programs approved from this grant in an aggregate amount not-to-exceed \$160,000; and amended the Community Development Department's revenue and expenditure budget for Fiscal Year 2019-2020 by the amount awarded in the next quarterly budget adjustments.

October 15

Brea Construction and Fire Code Tri-Annual Code Adoption

Council approved introducing ordinances adopting and amending the 2019 editions of the California Building and Fire Codes, and scheduled a noticed Public Hearing and second reading for the November 19, 2019 City Council meeting.

Orange County Federal Transportation Improvement Program

Council adopted a Resolution Certifying Resources and Affirming Commitment to the 2021 Federal Transportation Improvement Program (FTIP).

Street Sweeping Pilot Program – Six Month Status Report

Council received and filed the Street Sweeping Pilot Program – Six Month Status Report.

PSA for Neighborhood Traffic Study

Council approved an amendment to a Professional Services Agreement with Albert Grover and Associates for a neighborhood traffic study, not to exceed \$23,500.

Chair Replacement for Facility Rentals

Council approved the purchase of 325 Matrix armless stacking chairs for the Facility Rental Program in the amount of \$47,926.

Agreement for Business License Administration and Discovery Services

Council approved an agreement with HdL for Business License Administration and Discovery Services; appropriated \$65,270 in General Funds to this effort and de-obligated \$60,000 in Fixed Asset Replacement (FARP) funds in the next round of budget adjustments for FY 2019-20; and authorized the City Manager to execute and administer said agreement.

Master Employee Salary Schedule

Council adopted a Resolution establishing the 2019 City of Brea Master Employee Pay Schedule confirming the pay rates and ranges for all City of Brea established positions in order to comply with CalPERS Regulations.

November 5

Legislative Update

Council received a recap report of the legislative schedule; 2019 hot topics for Federal, State and Local areas; housing update; Regional Housing Needs Assessment (RHNA); homelessness; 2019 priority legislation; and potential 2020 Ballot Measures from Townsend Public Affairs.

Agreement with MWDOC

Council approved an agreement with Municipal Water District of Orange County (MWDOC) in the amount of \$145,405 for sharing consultant costs for the 2019 AWIA Compliance Risk and Resiliency Assessments and Emergency Response Plans for participating agencies.

Public Improvements Acceptance for Central Park Village Development

Council accepted the partial public improvements of landscaped median for Tract 17389 for Central Park Village Development, located on South Side of Central Avenue at Site Drive.

Certificate and Agreement for Brea Apartment Venture

Council approved the Estoppel Certificate and Agreement and the Termination and Release of Development Agreement (DA) for Brea Apartment Venture, aka Western National for Lot 2 at Central Park Village project.

Maintenance and License Agreement with Winding Way Homeowners Association

Council approved the Maintenance and License Agreement with Winding Way Homeowners Association.

Budget Adjustments for Fiscal Year 2018-19

Council adopted Resolutions appropriating funds to adjust the Fiscal Year 2018-19 City Operating and Capital Improvement Program Budgets for Fiscal Year 2018-19.

November 19

Brea Construction and Fire Code Tri-Annual Code Adoption

Council adopted a Resolution for required amendments to the 2019 California Codes relative to local climatic, topographic and geologic conditions; and adopted Ordinances amending the 2019 editions of the California Building and Fire Codes.

Set Public Hearing for Trash Rate Increase

Council set the Public Hearing date of January 21, 2020 for trash rate increase in conformance with AB 1594, and directed staff to mail Public Hearing Notices to Brea residential customers.

Commercial Organics Recycling Program

Council adopted a Resolution approving the proposed solid waste service rate for commercial customers and approved the agreement with Brea Disposal (Republic).

Rejection of Bids for Senior Center Kitchen Enhancements

Council rejected all bids and directed the City Clerk to return all bid bonds for the Senior Center Kitchen Enhancements, CIP Project No. 7944.

PSAs for Engineering Design Services

Council approved Professional Services Agreements between the City of Brea and five separate engineering firms for as-needed Engineering Design Services in the annual amount not-to-exceed \$300,000 per year, per firm, for a term of one year with three optional one-year extensions and authorized the City Manager to approve the optional annual contract extensions, with no rate increases without the Council's authorization.

Bids and Construction Contract for Central Avenue Sewer Improvements

Council approved the plans and specifications; received bids; approved the request for relief of bid; authorized the City Clerk to release the bid bond of GRFCO, Inc.; awarded the contract to the second lowest responsive and responsible bidder, Big Ben, Inc., in the amount of \$296,168; authorized the City Engineer to issue Change Orders up to a "not to exceed" amount of 10% of the contract price; and adopted a Resolution to appropriate an additional \$100,000 from the Sewer Fund (430) for the Central Avenue 8" Sewer Main Upsize, CIP No. 7627.

Supplemental Agreement for 12" Waterline Crossing at Puente Street

Council approved the Supplemental Agreement between the Union Pacific Railroad Company and City of Brea for the 12" Waterline Crossing at Puente Street.

2020 Water Master Plan Update

Council approved the agreement with Civiltech Engineering, Inc. for the 2020 Water Master Plan Update in the amount of \$214,874 and authorized the City Manager to execute a Professional Services Agreement (PSA) between City of Brea and Civiltech Engineering, Inc. for the 2020 Water Master Plan Update.

Budget Adjustments for Fiscal Year 2019-20

Council adopted a Resolution appropriating funds to adjust the Fiscal Year 2019-20 City Operating Budget.

Purchase of Personal Computers and Mobile Data Computers/Tablets

Council approved the agreement with Intelli-Tech, Inc. to furnish, house and image Hewlett Packard personal computers and laptops in the amount of \$246,399; approved the agreement with CDCE to furnish and install Panasonic computers for the amount of \$388,143; and approved the agreement with CDWG to furnish Microsoft Office 2019 licenses for new computer equipment for the amount of \$97,603.

Revision of Uniform Parking Bail Schedule

Council approved a reduction of \$2 on each of the parking violation fines on the City of Brea's Uniform Parking Bail Schedule.

December 3

Purchase of Common Stock Shares in California Domestic Water Company

Council approved the Common Stock Purchase Agreement to purchase 90 shares of California Domestic Water Company Common Stock for \$15,250 per share for a total of \$1,372,500, increasing the City's rights to access water.

Wildcatters Dog Park Surfacing Improvements

Council approved the plans and specifications; received bids; awarded the bid to the second lowest, responsible bidder, Three Peaks Corp in the amount of \$488,535; and authorized the Director of Public Works or his designee to issue Change Orders up to a "not-to-exceed" amount of 10% of the Contract Price.

OCTA Annual M2 Expenditure Report

Council adopted a Resolution concerning the Orange County Transportation Authority (OCTA) Annual M2 Expenditure Report for the City of Brea.

Cooperative Agreement for 57/Lambert Road Interchange Improvements

Council approved a Cooperative Agreement between the City of Brea and Orange County Transportation Authority (OCTA) for the 57/Lambert Road Interchange Improvements and authorized the City Manager to execute the Cooperative Agreement and all subsequent Amendments.

Maintenance Agreement for Transparent Sound Wall

Council approved the Project Specific Maintenance Agreement for the transparent sound wall between State and City and approved the transparent sound wall Maintenance Agreement (SR-57/Lambert Road Interchange Project) between City and Olen Pointe Brea Corp.

Application to OCTA for Traffic Signal Synchronization Program

Council adopted a Resolution approving the submittal of an application to the Orange County Transportation Authority (OCTA) for funding under the competitive M2 Regional Traffic Signal Synchronization Program.

CFD Annual Financial Report

Census Day is April 1

Brea has partnered with the U.S. Census to help ensure a complete and accurate 2020 Census count of every individual living in the city. Please participate in completing the U.S. Census questionnaire by April 1, on behalf of yourself and every individual, including seniors, children, and infants, living in your household.

Mandated by the Constitution, the results of this once-a-decade population count are important to Brea. They help our community by:

- Determining how much of the \$675 billion federal funding Brea receives
- Affecting Brea's representation in government
- Providing data to help plan for the City's future

In early 2020, every household will receive a notice to complete the Census. This time, the Census is easier to complete than ever before through the use of online submission. Questionnaires may also be completed by phone or by mail. Your responses to the 2020 Census are safe, secure, and protected by federal law.
