
## View Brea's Draft Housing Element

After months of community engagement and workshops, Brea's Draft Housing Element is now available for review.

Last fall, the City began the process of updating its Housing Element as part of the 6th Housing Cycle. The process will ensure Brea's policies and programs can accommodate the estimated housing growth identified in the Southern

California Association of Governments Regional Housing Needs Assessment allocation for the years 2021 through 2029 planning period. The goal is to have the Housing Element adopted by the City Council before October of this year, so that it can be approved by the State before the October 15, 2021 deadline. # Completed & Upcoming Improvement Projects

As the City's infrastructure continues to age, an effective Capital Improvement Program, also known as the CIP, is necessary to maintain and upgrade as needed. There were several projects completed last fiscal year with a strong focus on water main replacement and street rehabilitation. There are also many projects planned for the current year. Below are highlights of some projects.

## COMPLETED PROJECTS:

Water main replacements and street rehabilitations in the Eagle Hills Tract; Puente Avenue, Gemini Avenue, and Titan Way; and in the North Hills Neighborhood.

Street pavement, sidewalk, and traffic improvements, such as alley pavement replacement; the Berry Street sidewalk feasibility study; Country Lane street rehabilitation; ADA ramp replacements; Lambert Road at Puente Avenue traffic signal efficiency; and citywide sidewalk replacements.

Other completed projects include, a kitchen remodel at the Brea Senior Center; parking lot rehabilitations at Brea Creek Golf Course and the Brea Community Center; and replacement of the Birch Hills Golf Course pedestrian bridge.

- Waterline replacement and street rehabilitation at Country Hills and South Brea
- Seismic retrofit of Fire Station No. 1
- Median and parkway landscaping improvements along Lambert Road and Associated Road
- Citywide slurry sealing




## 57 Freeway/Lambert Road Interchange Project Update

Construction continues progressing on the 57 Freeway and Lambert Road Interchange Improvement Project. The project has been a goal for decades, and although construction can be an inconvenience, we look forward to the improvement and benefit to our city. Construction began in late 2019 and substantial completion of the project is anticipated by early 2022. The following is a recap of recently completed work and upcoming construction.

- Relocation and replacement of Southern California Edison Utility Poles.
- New retaining wall built on the north side of Lambert Rd.
- Bridge columns constructed for the bridge widening over the Tracks at Brea Trail segment.
- Installation of new panels for the retaining wall located along the southbound on-ramp.
- Upcoming construction of additional retaining walls, sound walls, and ramp bridges.

# Development Update

Below are highlights of projects currently in process or in review with the City. For additional information on projects in process, please visit, [cityofbrea.net/projectsinprocess](http://cityofbrea.net/projectsinprocess).

## BREA PLACE

The Brea Place housing and mixed-use development, on the corner of Birch Street and State College Boulevard, continues to advance on the construction of both buildings. Units in Building B, the one closest to The Tracks, are now being leased and occupied. When completed, Brea Place will be comprised of residential apartments, commercial space, and a hotel located in the lot across the street.



## BREA IMPERIAL CENTER

Construction is underway in preparation of a new In-N-Out Burger restaurant, located on the southwest corner of Imperial Highway and State College Boulevard.



## BREA PLAZA

The proposed project, located on the northwest corner of Imperial Highway and Associated Road, involves the demolition of the Brea Plaza 5 Cinema, and the construction of an 8-story, mixed-use building with 189-residential units and approximately 21,355 sq. ft. of office space. The project requires a General Plan Amendment, Zone Change, Development Agreement, and an Environmental Impact Report. Public hearings for this project are expected to take place in late 2021.



## MERCURY LANE RESIDENTIAL PROJECT

Last year, the City Council approved the Mercury Lane workforce housing project located on the southeast corner of Mercury Lane and Berry Street. This project features a five-story building with 114 units, a parking garage, and recreational amenities. All units will be designated workforce housing and available to the workforce in Brea, with proximity to the Brea Mall, Downtown, and other major employment centers.

## Preparing for the Upcoming School Year

With the completion of the 2020-2021 school year that showcased the strength of our students, staff and families, Brea Olinda Unified School District is now focused on the future. With traditional, in-person classes slated to return this fall, the District has many things to be excited for as it prepares for the 2021-2022 school year.

The return of five days a week instruction allows for the restoration of academic programs and enrichment activities such as arts, athletics and clubs. Falcon Academy of Science & Technology is set to revive its Code to the Future program, which was idle during remote learning instruction. Arovista Elementary will be expanding its Dual Immersion program to grades kindergarten through second. Laurel Magnet School of Innovation and Career Exploration will continue to provide career exploration opportunities with local business partners. Mariposa and Country Hills Elementary schools look to return to and expand Art enrichment activities for their students. And, Olinda Elementary is set to continue its FIBO Art enrichment program and expand into hands-on technology opportunities for students.

On the secondary level, Brea Olinda High School has added two new Career & Technical Education (CTE) Pathways - Broadcasting and Engineering Design. Six of the seven CTE pathways are introduced at Brea Junior High and continue into high school and beyond, as students continue to learn industry specific skills, certifications, and complete work-based learning and internships.

- Dump and drain any containers filled with water at least once a week

- Dump water from potted plant saucers
- Do not transport or share plant clippings rooted in water
- Drill a hole or puncture containers to eliminate standing water


# City Council Approves Operating & Capital Improvement Program Budgets for Fiscal Year 2021-22

At the June 15 Brea City Council Meeting, the Council approved the Fiscal Year 2021-22 operating budgets, along with the Capital Improvement Program Budget.

Due to the pandemic, cities across the nation have been facing various economic challenges. Brea was no different. The economic effects of the pandemic projected General Fund revenues to be \$8.4 million lower than originally projected pre-pandemic. To be able to present the City Council with a balanced budget, staff held the line and cut costs slightly on personnel and other operating costs,

identified savings wherever possible, and used Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act and American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funding. Overall, the City is proud to be able to continue providing core services to the community while maintaining fiscal integrity as we transition to a re-opening of the economy.



# General Fund

The General Fund Budget is the financial plan for the City. The current fiscal year, which began on July 1, 2021, lasts until June 30, 2022. The General Fund Budget is used to support City services such as police, fire, streets, park, building and other facility maintenance; parks, recreation and, human services as well as community development and administrative support services. The City currently maintains a reserve balance of 25% of its annual expenditures.

## REVENUES


- For this fiscal year, General Fund revenues are budgeted at just over \$60 million.
- Sales tax revenue remains the City’s single largest revenue source representing 38% of the budget.
- This fiscal year’s revenue projection is a 4.1% increase over last fiscal year. However, the projection is still lower than pre-pandemic projections.





## EXPENDITURES

- For this fiscal year, General Fund expenditures are budgeted at slightly over \$59 million.
- General Fund costs represent approximately 54% of the City’s overall operating costs and are funded by major revenue sources including sales tax and property taxes.
- General Fund costs for this fiscal year increased by 4.1% from the previous year.

## Permits Required to Park Overnight on City Streets

For safety, code, and aesthetic purposes, parking on all public streets within the City of Brea is restricted to no longer than 30 minutes between the hours of 2:00 a.m. and 6:00 a.m. Vehicles continuously parked on public streets during those hours may be cited for a parking violation on any day of the year, holidays included. An overnight parking permit is required for on-street parking. Residents with qualifying situations can apply for the annual permit.

During the pandemic, the Brea Police Department eased enforcement of overnight on-street parking. Now that conditions have improved and the State has re-opened, overnight parking enforcement has once again resumed. If you have vehicles that need to park overnight on City streets, please make

sure you obtain or renew a parking permit.

## Home Fire Safety Checklist

- Clean roofs and gutters of dead leaves, debris and pine needles that could catch embers.
- Replace or repair any loose or missing shingles or roof tiles to prevent ember penetration.
- Reduce embers that could pass through vents in the eaves by installing 1/8 inch metal mesh screening.
- Clean debris from exterior attic vents and install 1/8 inch metal mesh screening to reduce embers.
- Repair or replace damaged or loose window screens and any broken windows.
- Screen, or box-in areas below patios and decks with wire mesh to prevent debris and combustible materials from accumulating.
- Move any flammable material away from wall exteriors — mulch, flammable plants, leaves and needles, firewood piles — anything that can burn.
- Remove anything stored underneath decks or porches.



# Make Water Conservation a Way of Life!

## Watering Restrictions in Place Due to Drought Conditions

As of June 22, 2021, 90% of the Southwest and California is in drought, with 40% of this region in Exceptional Drought (D4), the highest level. Twelve months prior, most of the West was drought-free, but drought conditions began developing around May 2020. High temperatures and very low rainfall totals through spring and summer of 2020 set new records

across the Southwest, and the combination of extremely low soil moisture leading into winter and snow drought through winter means that run-off in the spring of 2021 has been very low.

In June, the Brea City Council activated Level 1 of the Water Shortage Contingency Plan.


