Street Sweeping

No street sweeping on November 26, December 23 and 31.

Street sweeping for December 23 will be swept on December 22 and times will vary on this day. Due to this temporary change, there will be no street sweeping parking enforcement.

Holiday Tree Recycling

Real trees will be collected curbside by Republic Services December 27-January 7. When disposing of trees, please observe the following guidelines:

- Remove tree stand and all lights, decorations, tinsel, etc.
- Trees under six feet in height can simply be placed at the curb on your regular collection day; those over six feet in height should be cut in half first for safe collection.
- Trees in bags or with flocking are **NOT** recyclable. Cut and place in black trash container or schedule an item pick-up.

If you take your tree down after the collection period, cut it into pieces to fit in your yard waste container along with any wreaths and greenery. Artificial trees and wreaths are not recyclable. If you're discarding them, please consider donating.

Trash Collection


If your regular trash collection falls on or after Thanksgiving Day (Nov 25) trash pickup will be delayed one day. There will be no service interruption to residents due to Christmas Day (Dec 25), and New Year's Day (Jan 1).

Brea City Council Adopts Housing & Safety Elements

Since Fall 2020, the City of Brea has been working on updating the General Plan Housing and Safety Elements for the 2021-2029 planning period. These policy documents are a State requirement aimed at ensuring Brea's future housing and safety plans are meeting the needs of our community.

Over the past year, City staff and consultants set out to engage the community to ensure feedback was received and incorporated into the plans. Study Sessions were held by the Planning Commission and City Council, there were workshops,

meetings, videos, and a dedicated engagement website with project updates, surveys and more. The updated plans were presented and adopted by the City Council on September 21. The final step in the process is certification with the State Department of Housing and Community Development (HCD). Completed & Upcoming Improvement Projects

As the City's infrastructure continues to age, an effective Capital Improvement Program, also known as the CIP, is necessary to maintain and upgrade as needed. There were several projects completed last fiscal year with a strong focus on water main replacement and street rehabilitation. There are also many projects planned for the current year. Below are highlights of some projects.

COMPLETED PROJECTS:

- **Resurfacing of the Sports Park Basketball Courts**

The Brea Sports Park basketball courts' surfaces began to wear thin and became slippery for players. New surfacing improves the user's play experience by removing the slippery areas and allowing the players more traction while improving the aesthetics and overall safety of the courts.

- **Sports Park Field Renovation**

The largest and most used field at the park underwent renovation. This process included scalping the existing turf, leveling the field with 55 yards of topsoil, and overseeding the field with a grass seed mixture of Rye and Bermuda. This renovation benefits the community and the sports user groups by keeping the fields safe, looking nice, and playable year-round.

- **Napoli Tract Water Improvements**

This project was located south of Lambert Rd. and west of Brea Blvd. and included Napoli Dr., Delphia Ave., and St. Crispin Ave. The work involved the replacement and upgrading of existing water mains, appurtenances, and street resurfacing throughout the tract. These improvements have improved water distribution, street conditions, and accessibility for this neighborhood.

UPCOMING PROJECTS:

- **Lambert Road Traffic Signal Synchronization Project**

This is a multi-jurisdictional project that improves traffic signal synchronization of 25 signals from Martinez Dr. in La Habra to Valencia Ave. in Brea. This project includes 13 signals in Brea, eight signals in La Habra, and four signals within Caltrans' jurisdiction. It is expected to be completed in early 2023.

- **Country Hills Pavement and Water Improvements**


This project is located within the residential neighborhood north of Birch St., south of Lambert Rd., east of North Associated Rd., and west of Kraemer Blvd., and is anticipated to be completed by May 2022. The project includes the replacement and upgrade of existing water mains and appurtenances, as well as street resurfacing throughout the Country Hills tract.

5-N-GO CAR WASH



A new self-service car wash is under construction on the southeast corner of Brea Blvd. and Imperial Hwy. The previous car wash in that location was demolished. The new 5-N-Go Car Wash will have an automated drive-thru system with self-service vacuum stations. The location will also have two digital signs displaying business information and City emergency announcements, when necessary. The car wash is expected to be completed in February 2022.


TRANSWESTERN WAREHOUSE



A new industrial warehouse facility is proposed at 285 N Berry St., near Imperial Hwy. The existing building will be demolished to make room for a new 35-foot tall, 126,797 square-foot warehouse building. Once completed, the project will have a surface parking lot and new landscaping. Construction is expected to begin in the late fall 2021.

WESTERN REALCO

The Planning Commission approved the demolition of an existing two-story office building, located at 2929 Imperial Hwy., to construct a new two-story, 40-foot tall, 131,500 square-foot warehouse building. The project includes a surface parking lot and new landscaping. At this time, the Applicant has not identified a use or tenant for the project. Construction is anticipated to begin in winter 2021.

Shopping Safety Tips

The Brea Police Department is sharing with you the following tips. These are good ones to keep in mind all year round, but especially with increased shopping during the holiday season. And remember, personal responsibility is the best prevention to safeguard personal property and to prevent becoming a victim.

- Park in a well-lit area.
- Lock your car and be aware of your surroundings.
- Avoid overloading yourself with packages. It is important to have clear visibility.
- Keep a secure hold on your purse/handbag and parcels. Do not put them down, in a shopping cart, or on top of the car in order to open the door.
- Limit the amount of cash you carry.
- Designate an area to meet your kids in case they get lost.
- Keep all of your receipts.
- Remember to **Lock It, Take It, Keep It**.
 - Lock your vehicle every time you leave it unattended.
 - Take all valuables out of your car when you leave it. If you can't take your items, lock or hide them out of sight.

Protect Yourself from Mail and Package Theft

Many of us shop online, and as the holidays approach, we begin to see an increase in the thefts of packages from front porches and mailboxes. Protect your purchases by:

- Asking neighbors who are home during the day to keep an eye out for deliveries.
- Learn what security services are available from your chosen courier.
- Consider insuring items to be mailed.
- Report suspicious persons in your neighborhood.
- Consider having packages sent to your place of employment, if allowed.
- Contact package recipients and tell them when to expect delivery.
- Consider sending packages so that a recipient signature is required.

Stay Fire Safe this Holiday Season

Here are some reminders from the Brea Fire Department to keep your home fire safe this holiday season.

- Cooking is the top cause of holiday fires, according to the U.S. Fire Administration. The most common culprit is food that's left unattended. Make sure to keep a kitchen fire extinguisher that's rated for all types of fires, and check that smoke detectors are working.
- One in every four home Christmas tree fires is caused by electrical problems. Inspect decorative light strings, and throw out any with frayed, cracked wires, or broken sockets. When decorating, don't run more than three strings of lights end to end. Extension cords should be in good condition and UL-rated for indoor or outdoor use.
- A heat source too close to the tree causes one in every four Christmas tree fires.
- Candles start two out of every five home decoration structure fires. Maintain about a foot of space between the candle and anything that can burn. Set candles on sturdy bases or cover with hurricane globes. Never leave flames unattended. Before bed, walk through each room to make sure candles are out.
- Make sure your fireplace and chimney are clean.
- Before the holiday season begins, have your chimney inspected to see if it needs cleaning. When cleaning out the fireplace, put embers in a metal container and set them outside to cool for 24 hours before disposal. Screen the fireplace to prevent embers from popping out onto the floor or carpet, and never use flammable liquids to start a fire in the fireplace.

Home Fire Safety Checklist



- Clean roofs and gutters of dead leaves, debris and pine needles that could catch embers.
- Replace or repair any loose or missing shingles or roof tiles to prevent ember penetration.
- Reduce embers that could pass through vents in the eaves by installing 1/8 inch metal mesh screening.
- Clean debris from exterior attic vents and install 1/8 inch metal mesh screening to reduce embers.
- Repair or replace damaged or loose window screens and any broken windows.
- Screen, or box-in areas below patios and decks with wire mesh to prevent debris and combustible materials from accumulating.
- Move any flammable material away from wall exteriors — mulch, flammable plants, leaves, and needles, firewood piles — anything that can burn.
- Remove anything stored underneath decks or porches.

State of the Schools Shows BOUSD Is Back and Better Than Ever



On September 30, the Brea Education Foundation, in partnership with the Brea Olinda Unified School District (BOUSD), hosted the fifth annual State of the Schools breakfast at the Brea Community Center. The District welcomed over 170 attendees that represented BOUSD's 10 schools, District staff, parent leaders, Brea City staff, state, and local elected officials, businesses and Brea community members.



Dr. Mason closed out the program discussing goals the BOUSD Board of Education have set for the 2021-22 school year to enhance the District. "The Brea Olinda School Board, in partnership with District leadership, have adopted ambitious goals for the 2021-22 school year that focus on raising the bar in the work that we do every day

Superintendent Dr. Brad Mason presented the keynote address, "Back and Better Than Ever; Braving The Future Together." During the presentation, Dr. Mason highlighted the achievements of Brea schools while navigating through the challenging 2020-21 school year. Some of the accomplishments included four schools earning Positive Behavioral Interventions & Supports (PBIS) recognition, community outreach, athletic success, the addition of the Brea Online Academy (Brea's 10th school) and other academic accolades. He also mentioned some of the challenges the District faces as it moves forward, such as dwindling classroom capacity, deferred maintenance challenges and staffing shortages.



Help Us Draw Brea's Future

Now is your opportunity to contribute and shape Brea's future!

Like many cities in our region, Brea is faced with developing voting districts for use during future City Council elections. Currently, Brea uses an at-large election system, in which all voters in the City have the opportunity to vote for candidates for all five seats on the City Council. Council candidates may reside anywhere in the City, and they each provide city-wide representation. In contrast, a by-district election system is one in which a city is physically divided into voting districts, each with one City Council Member who resides in their district and is chosen by the electors residing in that corresponding district.

Per the California Voting Rights Act (CVRA), Brea is seeking community input to determine how to best map by-district

election boundaries. Therefore, it is critical that we hear from residents as to how you think districts should be drawn. This is your opportunity to contribute and make a permanent mark in your community. Be a part of the process and attend Public Hearings to learn about by-district elections and share your thoughts with the community and City Council. The first Public Hearing was held on September 27 and is available to view online. The remaining meetings are listed in the timeline below. They will all take place in the City Council Chambers, and the community is encouraged to attend in-person or via Zoom. Meetings will also be broadcast live and available for replays.

Watering Shortage Contingency Plan Schedule Reminder

Earlier this year, the City of Brea activated Level 1 of the Water Shortage Contingency Plan. This activation level results in permanent and temporary watering changes for Brea's water customers. Listed below are a few of the changes:


TEMPORARY CHANGES:

- October to April, outdoor watering is limited to two days per week (Monday & Friday).

PERMANENT CHANGES:

- Outdoor watering is prohibited between 10:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m. and is limited to 10 minutes per station.
- Washing down hard or paved surfaces is prohibited, with certain exceptions.
- Drinking water is served only upon request at eating or drinking establishments.

Also available on Zoom

The delivery of safe and reliable water is of upmost importance to the City. It's been several years since Brea last completed a comprehensive water study to determine the costs of delivering water. Establishing water rates is complex and highly regulated, and requires gathering extensive data to determine an appropriate rate structure. The last water rate study was done in 2015. A fee study for wastewater rates was last done in 2006, and Water Impact Fees were last studied in 2002. The current water rate structure was adopted in February 2016 and has not increased since

July 2017. Brea has been able to keep rates flat due to strategic bond refinancing, as well as purchasing water rights.

The goal of this upcoming rate and fee study is to ensure that the revenues cover the cost of services, meet the debt coverage and reserve requirements, and provides revenue for future capital improvement projects. The study will also address drought conditions which could affect rates. The City has contracted with NewGen Strategies & Solutions to conduct the comprehensive rate and fee study.
