

57 Freeway/Lambert Road Interchange Project Update

The 57/Lambert Road Interchange Improvement project is a large-scale, multi-year construction project valued at over \$98 million. Construction began in fall 2019 and is anticipated to be completed in spring 2022. Once the project is complete, it will provide additional capacity, better traffic flow, enhanced safety, and reduced congestion and delays. As of winter 2021, construction on the project was about 86% complete. Project development is beginning stage five, of the eight-stage project. Current construction work includes:

- Bridgework at the 57 Freeway and Lambert Road intersection
- Northbound on-ramp loop grading and pavement work
- Pavement and electrical operations on Lambert Road

This work will require intermittent road closures along westbound and eastbound Lambert Road, from State College Boulevard to Associated Road, during the nighttime hours from 10 p.m. to 5 a.m., and some on/off-ramp closures to complete the bridge and pavement work. Minor lane closures during the day will also take place while allowing traffic flow in both directions on Lambert Road. The Interchange is anticipated to be fully operational in April of 2022, barring any further weather delays.

Grant Awarded for the Senior Center Generator Project

City staff has created the scope of work for the Senior Center Generator project. The scope includes the design, acquisition, permitting, and installation of a new emergency generator and all electrical connections required for generator operation at the Brea Senior Center. The City successfully acquired grant funding for the Community Power Resiliency Allocation Program, which focuses on preparedness and redundancy in emergency systems associated with power outages. Staff applied for the grant funding, from the Governor's Office of Emergency Services, and was awarded \$200,000 towards the installation of a new emergency generator. The goal of this funding is to provide power resiliency to the Brea Senior Center, ensuring

that the needs of seniors can be met in times of emergencies. The project bidding process has been completed and an award letter was sent to California Building Evaluation & Construction, Inc., the contractor selected to perform the work. The anticipated project completion is at the end of March 2022. It is exciting to see this project move into design and construction to provide additional emergency preparedness. The City of Brea is thankful for the opportunity to make advancements to the senior center facility.

Upcoming Compost Giveaway Event

The City of Brea and Republic Services will be giving away free compost on **Saturday, February 19, from 8 to 10:30 a.m.**, at Tri-City Park.

The benefits of compost include:

- Creates healthier soil by adding organic matter and improving soil structure.
- Healthy soil uses water more efficiently, allowing water to flow toward roots, storing water in the soil longer, and reducing runoff and erosion.

Please plan to bring your containers or buckets and Republic Services staff will fill them with compost. There is

a limit of 60 gallons of compost per household. Proof of Brea residency (California driver's license or utility bill) will be required.

Development Update

MARRIOT HOTEL



A new 138-room Residence Inn Hotel by Marriot is under construction near the northeast corner of State College Boulevard and Birch Street, just north of Toast Kitchen and Bar. The hotel will have a restaurant, meeting room space, lounge area, fitness center, swimming pool, and an outdoor patio area with amenities for guests. The hotel is expected to be completed in early 2023.

BREA IMPERIAL CENTER

The renovations consisting of façade upgrades, new landscaping, and parking lot improvements to the Brea Imperial Center is near completion. These improvements are expected to be complete in early 2022.



201 N. BERRY STREET



A new 108,123 square-foot industrial warehouse building is near completion at 201 N. Berry Street. The site will be occupied by ATOSA, a major manufacturer of commercial kitchen equipment. Construction for the new warehouse building is expected to be complete in early 2022.

BREA PLACE



Building A, consisting of 425 residential units, is located at the northwest corner of Birch Street and State College Boulevard. Construction for this building is expected to be complete in early 2022. Building B, located north of Building A, has been completed and consists of 228 residential units.

The system enhances transparency, facilitates officer training, and automates many record-keeping processes. The Brea Police Department is committed to constant innovation and safety enhancement through smart, empathetic, and responsive policing in

CERT Classes Planned for 2022

The Community Emergency Response Team, better known as CERT, is a nationwide program that trains citizen responders to offer assistance in their neighborhood in the event of a large-scale disaster or other local emergency. Classroom and hands-on training teaches disaster preparedness for hazards that may impact neighborhoods, and trains citizens for basic disaster response skills, such as fire safety, light search and rescue, team organization, and disaster medical operations. CERT training is provided free of charge, but pre-registration is required for each class. Registration is open to those residing in Brea.

Laurel Elementary Turns 100

The 2021-22 school year marks the 100th anniversary of Laurel Elementary Magnet School of Innovation & Career Exploration. To honor the momentous occasion, the Laurel Leopard students and staff held a centennial celebration in January that included a walk through the decades co-curricular event featuring a classic car show, artwork, guest speaker, and other activities highlighting the past 100 years. The opening ceremony included a performance by the Laurel choir and a student-led presentation about the history of Laurel. State and local dignitaries, former Laurel educators, and current and former Brea Olinda Unified School District (BOUSD) Board of Education Members also attended the event.

"We are very excited to celebrate the rich history of our school and community," commented Laurel Principal Lauren Tovar. "This year our students have been learning about the City of Brea and Laurel over the last century, and they have enjoyed learning how their school and community have changed over time."

Laurel School was erected with Mission-style architecture in 1921 after the City purchased eight-acres from the Union Oil Company for \$50,000. The campus was rushed to completion and opened without a kindergarten classroom so the youngest students began school in retail office buildings until the remainder of the school was completed in 1922. The school opened with 139 students, and today, over 450 students call themselves Leopards.



In the Fall of 2016, Laurel underwent a transformation and became a magnet school that emphasizes innovation and career exploration. Students utilize one-to-one technology devices to engage in Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math (STEAM) programs, collaboration with community business partners, and project-based learning. This forward-thinking vision proved successful as Laurel earned a CSBA

Golden Bell Award for 'community schools through partnerships & collaboration' just four years into its new educational format.

"We are very proud to honor this history and to highlight our magnet program which has enriched the lives of so many students," mentioned Tovar. "Laurel has an amazing community of students, parents, and staff and I am very honored to lead this school."

Every generation builds on the Laurel legacy while adding to its rich history, and now 100 years in the making, Laurel is primed to provide its students with the tools to address the real-world issues affecting them in the 21st century. We are all excited for what lies ahead in the second century of the Laurel Leopards!







Water Ordinance Promotes Water Conservation

Last summer in preparation for the State's current drought condition, the City adopted a Water Shortage Contingency Response Ordinance. Although there was a considerable amount of rain in December, it is imperative to continue conserving water to protect supplies. Wasteful practices are always prohibited under Statewide restrictions. Below are a few friendly watering reminders:

- From October to April, water two days a week (Monday and Friday).
- It is prohibited to water between 10 a.m. and 4 p.m.
- Limit watering to 10 minutes per station.
- Washing down hard or paved surfaces is prohibited, with certain exceptions.
- No watering during or 48 hours after a rain event.

Low-Water and Drought-Resistant Plants are a great way to stay water wise. These include plants that are native to California, don't need much water in the summer and thrive in water-scarce conditions. Some plants may save more water than others. Check with your local nursery for suggestions about what is best suited for your area and circumstances.


