Recycling Organic Waste

All businesses and residents in Brea are now required to recycle their organic waste in order to be in compliance with Senate Bill 1383. Organic waste includes, yard and kitchen waste from homes, as well as food scraps from industrial and commercial operations. By recycling food and yard waste, you are protecting valuable landfill space, which also reduces CO₂ emissions and preserves our environment. The City is currently working with Republic Services, our contacted waste hauler, to develop a residential food waste

recycling program. More information will be provided as details become available.

In the meantime, food waste recycling is already available to commercial businesses (restaurants, grocers, hotels, etc.) and businesses can sign up for food waste recycling services by contacting Brea's Recycling Coordinator at recyclebrea@cityofbrea.net or 714-990-7645.

EV Chargers Being Added to Brea Downtown



The City of Brea has reached an agreement with Tesla to add Electrical Vehicle (EV) infrastructure in the Brea Downtown area inside Parking Structure #2, located on Birch Street at Madrona Avenue. A co-funding opportunity from the Mobile Source Air Pollution Reduction Review Committee (MSRC) and Tesla made this project possible. The EV infrastructure, being installed by Tesla, will enable EV drivers to charge their vehicles while enjoying the Brea Downtown

area. Once the project is completed, there will be 24 Level III V3 superchargers and 24 Level II chargers. This project is anticipated to be completed by late summer of 2022.



57 Freeway/Lambert Road Interchange Improvement Project Set to Open

Construction began in fall 2019 for the 57/Lambert Interchange Improvement project. The large-scale, multi-year construction project, valued at over \$98 million, is anticipated to be fully operational this Summer, barring any further weather delays. The completed project will provide additional capacity, better traffic flow, enhanced safety, reduced congestion and delays. A ribbon cutting ceremony will be held, stay tuned for an exact date.


As of February 2022, construction on the project is about 92% complete. The Project is currently in Stage 5 of an 8-stage construction schedule.

Current construction work includes:

- Bridgework at the 57 Freeway and Lambert Road intersection
- Northbound on-ramp loop grading and pavement work
- Pavement and electrical operations on Lambert Road

This work will require intermittent road closures along westbound and eastbound Lambert Road, from State College Blvd. to Associated Road, during the nighttime hours of 10:00 p.m. and 5:00 a.m., and some on/off-ramp closures to complete the bridge and pavement work. Minor lane closures during the day will also take place while allowing traffic flow in both directions on Lambert Road.

Brea Branch Library Construction Update

The Brea branch library is currently closed for tenant enhancements. The demolition portion of the project is complete. The electrical installation and framing process of the project is underway. The anticipated completion date of the project is December 2022.

Development Update

ALDI GROCERY STORE



On March 8, 2022, the Planning Commission approved a request to allow an ALDI grocery store located at 2395 E. Imperial Hwy. Approval included an expansion of approximately 4,262 square feet, for a total building size of 19,976 square feet, with façade and landscape improvements. Construction anticipated to begin late 2022.

MARRIOTT HOTEL


On June 27, 2017, the Planning Commission approved the Brea Place development that includes two residential buildings (northwest intersection of



Birch St. and State College Blvd.) and a hotel (northeast intersection of Birch St. and State College Blvd.). The 140-room hotel will include amenities consisting of a public restaurant, an outdoor seating area with fire pits, and pool with spa. Hotel construction began at the end of 2021 and is anticipated to be complete at the end of 2022.

BREA 265 SPECIFIC PLAN

The Brea 265 Specific Plan is a phased, master planned community on approximately 262 acres located along Birch St./Rose Dr. and Valencia Ave. The development consists of up to 1,100 residential dwelling units, in low and medium density, with an associated park, recreation, and open space amenities. This past March, presentations on the project were made to the Planning Commission, and additional hearings are scheduled for Planning Commission and City Council Meetings through Summer of 2022.

Minimize Theft from Vehicles

Practice the #9PMroutine

This is a nightly reminder to remove valuables from vehicles, lock vehicle doors, lock the doors to your residence, turn on exterior lights, and activate all alarms and/or security systems at 9:00 p.m. Always remember to report suspicious activity.

Be Water Safe and Prevent Drowning

Children and adults drown without a sound.

- Learn to swim.
- Learn CPR.
- Always keep children within arm's reach.
- Remove items that a child could climb on to get over a fence and into a pool area.
- Designate a water watcher, someone who is free of distraction and can focus on those in the water.
- Install and maintain proper barriers around the pool and spa, such as fences, gates, alarms and safety covers.
- If a child goes missing, **ALWAYS** check the water first.
- Never swim alone.
- Wear a life vest if you are not a strong swimmer.

Alarm Permit Renewals

Renew Alarm Permits by July 1

In an effort to reduce costly false alarms, the City of Brea requires all residential and commercial alarm users to obtain an alarm permit. Permits must be renewed annually along with the \$25 permit fee. For more information, and to obtain an application, visit breapolice.net/alarmp permit.

Fire Department and Emergency Ambulance Services Enter New Contract





Half of the mosquitoes produced in Orange County come from residential backyards. Check your home for potential mosquito development sites. Anything that can hold water for a week can produce mosquitoes, even a tablespoonful or two.

Take these easy protective measures to reduce the chance of mosquito bites this Summer.

- Check window screens, make sure they fit, and are in good repair.
- Wear long sleeves and long pants when going out during periods of peak mosquito activity, particularly around dusk.
- Wear a mosquito repellent containing DEET; follow label directions.

Work continues developing the Fiscal Year 2022-23 budget. The Brea City Council will hold a budget workshop prior to a Public Hearing at the June 21 City




Summer Watering Schedule

- It is prohibited to water between 10:00 A.M. and 4:00 P.M.
- Limit watering to 10 minutes per station.




