Holiday Tree Recycling

Real holiday trees will be collected curbside by Republic Services. When disposing of trees, please observe the following guidelines.

- Remove the tree stand along with all decorations.
- Cut up trees and place them in the brown yard waste container.
- If the tree is over six feet in height, it can be cut in half and placed curbside.
- Trees in bags or with flocking are NOT recyclable. Cut and place in the black trash container or, if extra-large, schedule a bulky item pick-up.

Brea Skate Park at Arovista Re-Opens

Last fall, the Skate Park, located at Arovista Park, closed to undergo major renovations and upgrades. The City is happy to announce that the park re-opened on September 10.

The renovation impacted every element of the Skate Park. New skate elements were added, maintenance repairs were made, and concrete and drainage work was done. An ADA ramp was installed, along with stairs, railings, and retaining walls. The final concept plan for the park incorporated the community feedback received. The Skate Park is open daily, 7 a.m. to dusk.



EV Chargers Added to Brea Downtown

Electrical Vehicle (EV) infrastructure has been added in the Brea Downtown area inside Parking Structure #2, located on Birch Street at Madrona Avenue. A co-funding opportunity from the Mobile Source Air Pollution Reduction Review Committee (MSRC) and Tesla made this project possible. The EV infrastructure will enable EV drivers to charge their vehicles while enjoying the Brea Downtown area. There are now 24 Level III V3 superchargers and 24 Level II chargers, installed and ready for use.



Water Saving Measures Continue This Winter

Due to water supply issues and worsening drought conditions in the state, efforts to conserve water remain important to protect water supplies. As a reminder, the following water conserving measures are in effect.

- From October to April, the watering schedule changes to one day a week: Wednesday.
- Limit watering to 10 minutes per station.

The City of Brea is committed to saving water too! Passive turf areas at City facilities are being evaluated. Turf areas not being used for recreational purposes will no longer be watered. Sports fields will continue to be maintained and watered on their own schedule. For further information, please visit cityofbrea.net/water.



57 Freeway/Lambert Road Interchange Improvement Project Update

The 57/Lambert Interchange Improvement Project is progressing. All the on and off ramp improvements at the interchange are nearing completion. They are anticipated to be fully operational by the end of this year. Work will still continue on the 57/Lambert Road bridge extension as Caltrans has identified further modifications that are required. To complete the bridge work, there will be intermittent lane closures on the new ramps and Lambert Road. The bridge work is anticipated to be completed by June 2023.

Additionally, the landscape phase of the project is expected to begin before the end of this year with an estimated completion date of October 2023. This phase will complete all new landscaping within the new slopes and roadway areas.

The City appreciates your patience with respect to this project. Once entirely done, the interchange improvements will be a great benefit to the community.

6TH CYCLE HOUSING ELEMENT

On September 8, the California Department of Housing and Community

Development (HCD) certified the City of Brea's 6th Cycle Housing Element, which is the City's eight-year housing strategy that addresses local housing needs. The Housing Element also includes various programs that implements the goals and policies identified in the document. The Housing Element update was a two-year, community-based process that included multiple activities and opportunities for the Brea community to be involved and provide input. Brea is the 6th City in Orange County to receive HCD's certification on the Housing Element, a huge accomplishment and win for the community!

MARRIOTT HOTEL


A new hotel, Marriott's Residence Inn, is currently under construction at the northeast corner of Birch Street and State



College Boulevard. When finished, the hotel will include 140 rooms with various amenities. Construction is anticipated to be completed by February 2023.

BREA 265 SPECIFIC PLAN

In August, the City Council approved the Brea 265 Specific Plan, which includes development of up to 1,100 residential units with a mix of single family and multi-family, including 110 affordable housing units. The project



area encompasses approximately 262 acres of land. Through this project, 15-acres of additional parks and recreational facility will be provided, which includes a new 2-acre park and a 13-acre expansion to the existing Brea Sports Park. In addition to the new parks and recreational facilities, the project includes 47 acres of passive open space, including expansion of the City's trail network, along with a 52-acre off-site open space land dedication. The project will be developed in three phases, spread out through the next 25 years.

Stay Safe This Holiday Season

The Brea Police Department wants to help you have a safe and cheerful holiday season. With increased shopping and travel over the next few months, keep these tips in mind.

Lock It, Take It, Keep It. Theft from vehicles is a highly reported crime during the holiday season. Do not leave items of value in the car, in plain view. Thieves are looking for laptops, purses, cell phones, wallets, sunglasses, credit cards, and anything else to easily carry away.

Plan deliveries. To deter thefts, have packages delivered to a designated delivery location or place of work, rather than the front door or mailbox.

Limit cash and credit cards. Only carry the amount of cash and credit cards needed.

Do not leave property unattended. Don't place a purse in a shopping cart, leave a cell phone on a restaurant table, or leave a wallet on a counter when paying.

Be on alert for catalytic converter thefts, they are on the rise. If possible, park vehicles indoors or in a well-lit area. Visit BreaPolice.net for more catalytic converter prevention tips.

Protect your home. Keep all doors and windows locked to decrease the chances of being burglarized. Install exterior lighting with motion sensors and an audible alarm system. If traveling, ask a neighbor to watch your home. Put timers on interior and exterior lights. Have newspapers, mail, and deliveries held or picked up by someone. Sign up for a vacation house check.

Be aware of surroundings. Do not be distracted in crowded areas, personal belongings are at risk. Limit cell phone use in public and don't carry social security cards or passports.

Personal safety. Park in well-lighted, well-traveled areas and avoid being overloaded with packages.

If you see something, say something. Contact the Brea Police Department to report suspicious activity, call 714-990-7911. To report a crime in progress, call 9-1-1.



Prevent Fires in Your Home This Holiday Season

Here are some reminders from the Brea Fire Department to keep your home fire safe this holiday season. Whether choosing the right tree or cooking, these tips will help prevent fires.

Tree Safety

- Choose a tree with fresh, green needles that do not fall off when touched.
- Before placing the tree in the stand, cut 2" from the base of the trunk.
- Add water daily to the tree stand.
- Keep the tree at least three feet away from any heat source, like fireplaces, candles, heat vents or lights.
- Use lights that are listed by a qualified testing laboratory. Some lights are only for indoor or outdoor use.
- Replace any string of lights with worn or broken cords, or loose bulb connections. Read manufacturer's instructions for number of light strands to connect.
- Never use lit candles to decorate the tree.
- Always turn off Christmas tree lights before leaving the house or going to bed.
- Recycle the tree when it is dry. Dried-out trees are a fire danger and should not be left in the home or garage, or placed outside against the home.

Cook with Caution

- Be on alert! Don't use the stove if sleepy or have consumed alcohol.
- Stay in the kitchen while frying, boiling, grilling, or broiling food.
- Have a "kid-free zone" of at least 3 feet around the stove and areas where hot food or drinks are prepared or carried.
- Remain at home while food is cooking and use a timer as a reminder.
- Keep anything that can catch fire — oven mitts, wooden utensils, food packaging, towels or curtains — away from the stovetop.
- Flames from a small (grease) cooking fires can be smothered by sliding a lid over the pan and turning off the burner. Leave the pan covered until completely cooled.
- For an oven fire, turn off the heat and keep the door closed. If in doubt, call 9-1-1 from outside the home.

Goals for the 2022-23 School Year

As we maneuver through the 2022-23 school year, the Brea Olinda Unified School District (BOUSD) is focusing on three essential goals: academics, social and emotional wellness, and safety.

Academically, our vision is to provide unlimited possibilities that ignite the educational imagination of all learners to thrive in our ever-changing world. We do this by enlisting highly-skilled teachers and staff in programs that include dual language immersion programming, computer science immersion programming, magnet elementary school, and a hands-on approach to learning through our Career Exploration and STEAM programs. Not to mention, a multitude of extracurricular activities and child development programs that focus on whole-child learning.

Our emphasis on the social-emotional and mental health of our students and staff has continued to increase. In support of a safe and healthy learning environment, we added psychologists, marriage family therapists and intervention specialists to compliment our counseling staff. We also partnered with Project Kinship and Care Solace to provide an extra layer of care for our community and staff.

Wellness will continue to be an integral part of the educational experience for our students and our efforts were showcased on FOX 11 Good Day LA's Destination Education segment in



August. BOUSD Superintendent Brinda Leon, psychologist Rachel Miller and elementary counselor Erika Rodriguez discussed the shift in students' behavioral and emotional patterns in the classroom since the COVID-19 pandemic began and how the district responded to those needs.

Safety is also a top priority for the District. Our students and staff

participate in required safety training in schools every year. It is only through practicing lockdowns, fire drills, duck-and-cover and shelter-in-place procedures, and other scenarios that students and staff can be prepared for an emergency. We have a school resource officer who is available in our schools every day. Additionally, our safety committee meets regularly, we manage an extremely collaborative relationship with law enforcement officials who are an extension of our operations and we are continually evaluating safety protocols across every level. The Orange County Intelligence Assessment Center (OCIAAC) will also be a resource partner for our schools as they conduct additional safety assessments with recommendations for all of our campuses.

The energetic atmosphere felt when school began has carried through the first month of school with blossoming student engagement and connectedness, a sign that BOUSD is successfully adapting to the new landscape of education.
