Brea Library Set to Re-Open in Early 2023



OC Public Libraries and the Brea Library staff look forward to welcoming you back to the library in early 2023! The goal of the tenant enhancement project was to reimagine the existing space to create a facility that is compliant and accessible, to maximize usable space for the public to study, read and attend programs, and to create a modern, inviting space where people can gather to build community or to relax. With the addition of three quiet study rooms, a teen space, laptop study tables and a program area, OC Public

Libraries believes the goals were achieved. To create a positive customer experience, the facility was converted to a one-desk service model for one stop assistance, and for convenience, power outlets were added throughout the library for charging or using mobile devices. Additionally, the project scope included upgraded cabling, improved energy efficiencies, new lighting, paint, carpet, furniture and shelving. Come see the transformation!

City Council Adopts New Water & Sewer Fees

In Fall 2021, the City of Brea hired a consultant to conduct a comprehensive Water, Sewer and Impact Fees study. Several meetings were held with the City Council, including two community outreach meetings where the public was invited to learn about the study, hear about the findings, and provide their input. At its conclusion, the fees study recommended transferring more of the water revenue collected from consumption charges to fixed (ready to serve) charges. The Brea City Council adopted new water and sewer rates at its November 15, 2022 meeting. The rates went into effect on bills dated January 2023.

Brea's previous water rate structure was adopted in February 2016 and had not been increased since July 2017. The City was able to keep rates flat due to strategic bond refinancing, as well as purchasing water rights. Prior to adopting the new fee structure, Brea collected 17% of its revenue from fixed charges. The recommendation from the study is to receive 25-30% of water system revenue from fixed charges.

However, the newly adopted rates are anticipated to cover between 19-22% of revenue from fixed charges. This allows for more reliance on revenues from fixed meter charges and less reliance on water consumption charges. Sewer rates, based on a fixed rate, were also increased because the study revealed the previous rates did not collect enough revenue to properly maintain infrastructure. A detailed breakdown of the new rates were mailed with the December 2022 utility bills and they are also available to view online, at cityofbrea.net/waterrateinfo.

In addition, Brea's utility customers will soon be receiving a new and improved utility bill. The redesigned bill is formatted in a modern and streamlined way to make it easier to read. The new utility bill will also include a graph comparing monthly water usage for easy tracking. When the new bill arrives, an insert will be included to highlighted the improvements. Housing Rehabilitation Program



Brea Students Win Regional Contest



For over 30 years, the Municipal Water District of Orange County (MWDOC), one of Brea's water providers, has offered an annual Water Awareness Poster Contest. The contest is open to all Orange County K-12 students, encouraging them to submit original artwork that explores a water-smart theme, and uses art to express the importance of using water wisely. MWDOC selected 40 winners from hundreds of entries received countywide. Of the 40 winning posters, MWDOC submitted five to

the Metropolitan Water District of Southern California (Metropolitan) for their regional poster contest. The selected winners of Metropolitan's contest earn a spot in their annual "Water Is Life" calendar. This year, two winners were selected from Brea, second-grader **Anagha B.** and sixth-grader **Raina K.** Both of their artwork, pictured above, can be found in Metropolitan's 2023 calendar.



2022 Development Year-End Review

2022 was a busy year of development in Brea. The following are highlights of major projects:

Plans Approved or Under Review

Brea 265 Specific Plan

In August, the City Council approved Brea 265 Specific Plan, which allows up to 1,100 residential units with a mix of single- and multi-family, 15-acres of additional parks and recreational facilities, and 47-acres of passive open space, along with a 52-acre off-site open space land dedication. The project will be developed in phases, spread out through the next 25 years.

6th Cycle Housing Element

The City's eight-year housing strategy that addresses local housing needs received the State certification in September. Brea is the 6th city in Orange County to receive such certification.

Brea Mall Mixed-Use Project

In December, the Planning Commission recommended an approval of a mixed-use project that encompasses the southwest portion of the Brea Mall property, and includes demolition of the now vacant Sears building, and construction of a new outdoor retail court with outdoor gathering spaces, a new fitness center, and a 380-unit apartment building. The City Council review of the project is expected to take place in early 2023.

Projects Under Construction or Completed

Avalon Apartments at Brea Place

Construction of the 650-unit apartment complex located at the northwest corner of State College Boulevard and Birch Street was completed in July.

Cadence Senior Living

A new 80-unit assisted living and memory care facility located on Randolph Avenue, across from the Brea Mall, is expected to open in early 2023.

Brea Imperial Center

Located on the southwest corner of Imperial Highway and State College Boulevard, the center underwent renovations consisting of façade upgrades, new landscaping and parking lot improvement, along with the addition of a new In-N-Out.



57 Freeway/Lambert Road Interchange Project Update

Work continues on the 57 Freeway/Lambert Road Interchange Improvement Project as it moves toward completion. The Lambert Road on-ramps and off-ramps, including the new northbound on-ramp loop, are all expected to be operational by the end of February. Minor work will continue on the northbound on-ramp loop through March for final asphalt concrete pavement, median, and lane striping along Lambert Road. Additional work to the ramps will include various upgrades. This includes, installing safety guardrail systems, electrical lighting, new signage, and the widening of the southbound 57 Freeway overhead bridge. Intermittent closures in the area are expected to complete the work.

Construction to complete this improvement project has taken longer than originally anticipated. Causes of the delay include, schedules fluctuating due to weather, supply chain

issues, material needs, and passing safety inspections at each stage of the project. With safety as the highest priority, the latest project delay is needing to reconstruct the widening portion of the northbound 57 Freeway main bridge. At this time, Caltrans is anticipating the interchange improvement project to be completed in December 2023.

Caltrans and the City of Brea appreciate your patience as we continue our goal of creating a safe environment for local residents, business owners, pedestrians, and traveling motorists. 

Upcoming Compost Giveaway Event

The City of Brea and Republic Services will be giving away free compost on **Saturday, February 18, from 8 to 10:30 a.m.**, at Tri-City Park. If it rains on February 18, event will be postponed to March 11.

The benefits of compost include:

- Creating healthier soil by adding organic matter and improving soil structure.
- Healthy soil uses water more efficiently, allowing water to flow toward roots, storing water in the soil longer, and reducing runoff and erosion.

Please plan to bring your containers or buckets and Republic Services staff will fill them with compost. There is a limit of 60 gallons of compost per household. Proof of Brea residency (California driver's license or utility bill) will be required.

Residential Organic Recycling Changes Coming Soon



By 2025, California has a goal of reducing the volume of organic waste disposed of in landfills by 75%. While other cities have established organics recycling programs, a residential program has not yet started here in Brea. Residents should continue to place food scraps, or food-soiled paper, into black trash carts. Information will be announced once an organics recycling program is in place for residents.

Below are additional reminders when sorting items into carts.

- Place all clean, dry paper in the **green recycling cart**. This includes cardboard and other boxes, paperback

books, shredded paper (bagged), and wrapping paper with no metal. Also, recycle metal cans, glass bottles and jars, plastic bottles, jugs, and containers in the same cart.

- Use **brown yard waste carts** for limbs, branches, leaves, grass clippings, weeds, other plant material, and small scrap wood (no painted or treated wood). Reduce landscape debris by letting grass clippings drop back onto the lawn as you mow and compost in your backyard. Branches and wood must be no more than 4" in diameter and no more than 4' long. Palm fronds, cacti, other succulents, rocks, soil, pet waste, recyclables, and trash are not accepted in the yard waste cart.

This program is a unique opportunity for Brea residents to have one-on-one experiences with City staff and local elected officials. It's ideal for those interested in



The Brea Police Department is seeking volunteers who are looking to give back to the community. CERT Classes Offered This Year

The Community Emergency Response Team, better known as CERT, is a nationwide program that trains citizen responders to help in their neighborhood in the event of a large-scale disaster or other local emergency. Classroom and hands-on training teaches disaster preparedness for hazards that may impact neighborhoods, and trains citizens basic disaster response skills, such as fire safety, light search and rescue, team organization, and disaster medical operations. CTE courses develop and strengthen the essential skills students need to thrive in the 21st century labor market. Career awareness activities begin at the elementary level to help broaden students' horizons by introducing various career opportunities, which is crucial for student growth and development. Career awareness in elementary school can take many different forms such as learning about historical figures, discussing roles in the community, guest speakers, career dress up days, and parents discussing their careers with their children.

Part of Laurel's career exploration program, each classroom (TK-6th grade) is partnered with a local business so that students can learn and explore careers and engage in hands-on problem solving with the partner. Falcon Academy of Science and Technology provides the opportunity for students to learn the fundamentals of computer coding and

and beyond as students continue to learn industry specific skills, certifications, and complete work based learning and internships. The seven career pathways offered at BOHS are broadcasting, computer science, construction technology, digital media, engineering, patient care and culinary arts.

At the start of the 2022-23 school year, Brea Canyon High School became the first California continuation school to house a Spyder Lab and is now able to provide its students with a CTE class. In this highly-popular class students will learn real world essential and soft skills as they work in their new professional-quality graphic media technology lab.


