## 57 Freeway/Lambert Road Interchange Project Update

Construction is progressing on the SR 57 Freeway/Lambert Road Interchange Improvement Project. All the SR 57 on-ramps and off-ramps at Lambert Road, including the newly constructed northbound on-ramp loop, are operational. The ramps were upgraded by installing safety guardrail systems, electrical lighting, and new signage. With the new on-ramp loop open, motorists are urged to use the right lanes of Lambert Road when traveling eastbound to take the SR 57 Freeway north.

The demolition of the widening portion of the northbound SR 57 Freeway main bridge is complete. To minimize traffic disruptions, work was primarily conducted overnight. Reconstruction of the bridge is anticipated to commence this spring. Intermittent lane closures will occur to complete construction.

At this time, Caltrans is anticipating the SR 57 Freeway/Lambert Road Interchange Improvement Project to be substantially completed by the end of this year. Caltrans and the City of Brea appreciate your patience as we continue our goal of creating a safe environment for local residents, business owners, pedestrians, and traveling motorists. ## City Council to Approve FY 2023-25 Budgets

**Public Hearing to Adopt Budget: Tuesday, June 20**

A Public Hearing will be held on June 20 for the Brea City Council to adopt the Fiscal Year 2023-2024 and 2024-2025 budgets. After months of preparation, City staff will present proposed budgets for the General Fund Operating Budget, Successor Agency to the Brea Redevelopment Agency Operating Budget, Brea Public

Financing Authority Budget, Brea Community Benefit Financing Authority Budget, and the Seven-Year Capital Improvement Program (CIP) Budget. A budget workshop will be held with the City Council in May. The public is invited to attend the meetings. 




# Development Update

## NEW WAREHOUSE BUILDING



A new industrial warehouse facility was recently approved for construction at 2727 E. Imperial Blvd. The existing office building will be demolished to make room for a new 113,716 square-foot warehouse building. The project includes a surface parking lot and new landscaping throughout the site. Construction is expected to begin in winter 2024.

## CORAZON TASTE OF MEXICO

One of Brea’s celebrated restaurants, Corazon Taste of Mexico, located in Downtown Brea, is expanding. The City recently approved plans for the restaurant to expand into a portion of the former Brea Improv space located directly adjacent to the restaurant. Construction is under way and the expansion is expected to be completed soon.


## THE BOILING CRAB

The City is currently reviewing plans for a new restaurant, The Boiling Crab. This well-known seafood restaurant serves Louisiana-inspired Cajun seafood. The restaurant will occupy a portion of the former Brea Improv space, adjacent to the Corazon Taste of Mexico restaurant, and will also include an outdoor patio. The restaurant is anticipated to open in a few months.

## BREA MALL MIXED USE PROJECT



In December 2022, the Planning Commission recommended an approval of a mixed-use project that encompasses the southwest portion of the Brea Mall property. This includes demolition of the now vacant Sears building and construction of new outdoor retail court with outdoor gathering spaces, a new fitness center, and a 380-unit apartment building. The City Council's review of the project is expected to occur in the Spring.

# A Threat to California Citrus

A plant disease that kills citrus trees has been found in Brea. The disease, called Huanglongbing or citrus greening disease, is not harmful to humans, but it is fatal for citrus trees and has no cure. The disease is spread by a pest called, the Asian citrus psyllid, which feeds on citrus tree leaves. Some citrus trees in Brea have been found to have the citrus greening disease. ## Watering Schedule Changes for the Summer Months

Although the winter months brought significant rainfall to our region, California continues to monitor and evaluate its precious water resources. In Brea, the watering schedule changes for the spring and summer months to continue promoting water conservation.

### From May to September:

- Automated irrigation is limited to three days per week: Wednesday, Friday, & Sunday.
- Limit watering to 10 minutes per station.
- No outdoor watering from 10 a.m. – 4 p.m.



## Keep Mosquitos Away

Dump and drain after the rain! All the rain we have been receiving can bring various breeding areas for mosquitos to grow in population. Mosquitoes are responsible for more human deaths than any other animal in the world. In California, two species of concern are the Culex and Aedes mosquitoes. Both have the potential to transmit diseases to humans and animals. Be proactive and dump out any outdoor water source.

# Stay Safe Outdoors This Summer

The Brea Fire Department is sharing the following safety tips to keep in mind when spending time outdoors this summer.

## Grilling Safety Tips

- Propane and charcoal grills should only be used outdoors.
- The grill should be placed well away from the home, deck railings, and out from under eaves and overhanging branches.
- Keep children and pets at least three feet away from the grill area.
- Keep your grill clean by removing grease or fat buildup from the grills and in the trays below.
- Never leave your grill unattended.
- Always make sure your gas grill lid is open before lighting it.

## Swimming Safety Tips

- No one should ever swim alone.
- Designate a water watcher, someone who is free of distraction and can focus on those in the water.
- Always keep children within arm's reach.
- Install and maintain proper barriers around the pool and spa, such as fences, gates, doors, alarms and safety covers.
- If a child goes missing, ALWAYS check the water first.
- Learn CPR.
- Wear a life vest if you are not a strong swimmer.

## Be Alert & Know the Signs of...

### HEAT EXHAUSTION

Faint or Dizzy  
Excessive Sweating  
Cool, Pale, Clammy Skin  
Nausea or Vomiting  
Rapid, Weak Pulse  
Muscle Cramps

If experiencing these symptoms, get to a cooler, air conditioned place; drink water; take a cool shower or use cold compresses.

### HEAT STROKE

Throbbing Headache  
No Sweating  
Body Temperature Above 103°  
Red, Hot, Dry Skin  
Nausea or Vomiting  
Rapid, Strong Pulse  
May Lose Consciousness

If experiencing these symptoms, call 9-1-1, take immediate action to cool the person until help arrives.




## Brea Police Department's Proposed Integrated Crime Center

The sale, use or discharge of fireworks are prohibited in Brea, even the "safe and sane" ones, and can carry a fine up to \$1,000. Fireworks are dangerous and can be harmful to you, your property, and your pets. They are also a serious fire hazard as sparks from fireworks can travel to nearby homes or brush and ignite a fire.

# State of the Schools Illuminates Future



Brea Olinda Unified School District, in partnership with Brea Education Foundation, ignited excitement within the community with their sixth annual State of the Schools breakfast held at the Brea Community Center in late March.

The District welcomed over 150 attendees, which included representatives from BOUSD's 10 schools, District staff, parent leaders, Brea city staff, state and local elected officials, local businesses and Brea community members. Attendees were greeted by Brea Olinda High School cheerleaders and enjoyed performances by the BOHS jazz band and Masquerade show choir, while Falcon Academy of Science & Technology's alto saxophonist Aiden Van Dyk played the National Anthem.

Superintendent Brinda C. Leon delivered the keynote address, "Illuminating Our Future", which highlighted the District's progress, challenges, and aspirations. Some of the accomplishments noted were three elementary schools recognized as 2023 California Distinguished Schools, the District receiving a Golden Bell for its Career Technical Education (CTE) program, nine schools earning Positive Behavioral Interventions & Supports (PBIS) recognition, community outreach, athletic success and regional and national academic competitions where our students excelled. The success of the Wildcat seniors, who brought in over \$5 million in scholarship and awards for their academic and athletic accomplishments, was also highlighted.

Students from our BITA (Building Industry Technology Academy) program joined Leon on stage to give testimonials on one of Brea Olinda High School's seven CTE career pathways that combines rigorous academic learning with

practical hands-on, project-based courses integrating real world applications of knowledge and skill. Along with sharing their personal stories on what BITA means to them and how the program has prepared them for a future after high school, their craftsmanship was on display with wall frames, model homes and imaginative dog houses.

Leon also discussed challenges the District faces, which includes funding, and what's ahead for Brea Olinda Unified School District. "We have made significant

strides post-pandemic, but we recognize that there is still work to be done," stated Leon. A few key focuses for BOUSD are dual enrollment opportunities, facility improvements, commitment to mental health and social emotional supports and a renewed commitment to at-risk groups.

"Despite challenges, our schools have remained steadfast in their commitment to providing a quality education to every student, to prepare our students to become local and global influencers," stated Leon.
