The City of Brea has preserved a vital part of local history by protecting a 12-acre historical park to recapture the sights, sounds, smells and vital role Olinda played in the development of the area. The site features:

- Olinda Oil Well #1, which was drilled in 1897 and continues pumping over 100 years later.
- A jackline pump that was once the power source for multiple active wells.
- The field office, housing a vault, warehouse, historic replica house and historical photos.
- A records vault that stored explosives and company documents.
- Explore what life was like as an Olinda "wildcatter."
- Hike the Olinda Oil Trail, a two-mile moderate loop hiking trail with spectacular panoramic views of Orange County.

Residential Solid Waste & Recycling

Single-family homes in Brea have a three-cart collection program, which makes separating waste easy. The green cart is for recyclables, the brown cart is for yard waste, and the black cart is for landfill materials. Brea residents are currently only sorting their yard waste. The City is working with Republic Services to develop a residential organic

recycling program that is coming soon. Once this new program is in place, it will allow residents to dispose both yard waste and food waste into the same cart.

Brea City Council Approves Biennial Budget

At their June 20 meeting, the Brea City Council approved the fiscal year 2023-24 and 2024-25 operating budgets, along with the Capital Improvement Program Budget.

Each year, the budget process is framed around the City Council's Top Priorities and Projects. While the process is a citywide effort that involves the entire organization, it is supported by the City's Financial Policies Statement. As part of this current budget cycle, the organization transitioned from an annual operating budget to a biennial operating budget. This change allows the organization to maintain long-term financial prospective while improving organizational efficiencies.

The City's economic outlook continues to be favorable. While consumer spending is on the conservative side, the City did see marginal revenue growth and continued development in the last fiscal year. As required by the City's financial policies, the adopted biennial budget is balanced for the next two fiscal years while maintaining a General Fund reserve of at least 25% of expenditures. That is in excess of what the Brea City Council requires.

Below are highlights of the recently adopted General Fund budget. A fund that is used to support City services such as public safety, parks, recreation, human services, and more.

REVENUES

- Budgeted at \$67.7 million for FY 2023-24 and \$69 million for FY 2024-25
- Sales Tax and Property Tax are the primary revenue sources

EXPENDITURES

- Budgeted at \$67.1 million for FY 2023-24 and \$69 million for FY 2024-25

- Improved and increased service levels to the community:
 - Increases in police and fire services
 - Continues the restoration of Community Services programs, amenities and events
 - Improves technology deployment for organizational efficiencies
 - Invests in equipment maintenance and capital replacement items
 - Enhances maintenance services supporting parks
 - Improves cross departmental efficiencies for inspection services

CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM

Here are highlights of the recently adopted Capital Improvement Program budget. This is the City's way to plan, budget, implement, and maintain its infrastructure to ensure the highest quality of life the community expects.

- Budgeted at \$13.1 million for FY 2023-24 and \$11.2 million for FY 2024-25
- Last year's completed projects include: water replacement and street rehabilitations, as well as upgrades to the Brea Skate Park, City Service Center and Senior Center generator
- Upcoming projects include: traffic calming; street, water and park improvements; sewer relining, asphalt rehabilitation, and more

Build a Kit

Plan on being self sufficient for at least 72 hours. Your kit should include: water, nonperishable food, medications, flashlight and batteries, first aid kit, to name a few. Visit [ready.gov](https://www.ready.gov) for a more complete list.

Be Informed

Sign up for AlertOC, Orange County's Emergency Mass Notification System. By registering with AlertOC, time-sensitive voice messages from the City may be sent to your home, cell, or business phone. Text messages may also be sent to cell phones. AlertOC can send out messages to email accounts and TTY devices as well. Visit [alertoc.org](https://www.alertoc.org).

Make a Plan

Your family may not be together if a disaster strikes. It is important to know how you will contact one another and reconnect if separated. Establish a family meeting place that is familiar and easy to find. Most importantly, practice your plan!

Get Involved

Join the Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) program and get trained on basic disaster response skills, such as fire safety, light search and rescue, team organization, and disaster medical operations. Classes begin in September! Also, take a CPR class. Keep an eye out for the next class being offered.

Burglary Prevention Tips

If anything looks questionable in your home, such as a split screen or a cracked window, **DO NOT GO IN! Call 9-1-1** right away from a neighbor's house or your cell phone to report the suspicious activity.

If you see any suspicious activity taking place, or have an information pertaining to a crime, don't hesitate to call the police. For other safety tips and alerts provided by the department, visit **BreaPolice.net**.

Follow these safety tips to protect your home against burglary, forced entry or home invasion:

- Lock all windows, including interior garage doors and sliding doors and keep spare keys away from exterior windows, doors, and lockboxes.
- Keep fences closed and locked. Lock all entry gates with a padlock.
- Keep bushes and tree branches trimmed and away from windows.
- Get to know your neighbors and watch out for each other.
- Remove objects in your yard that could be used to make a forced entry (tools, ladders, bricks, large rocks, etc.).
- Install an audible or monitored alarm system and place the company's sign in your front and back yard.
- Install a video camera at your home to help deter or identify a thief.
- Turn on exterior lights in driveways, front and back porch, etc.
- Install deadbolts to all entry doors and use longer screws when installing the strike plate.

- Keep your eyes up, and your phone down.
- Look left, right and left again before crossing the street.
- Always walk on sidewalks.
- If there are no sidewalks, walk facing traffic as far to the left as possible.
- Wear bright-colored clothing or reflective gear if walking at night.
- Make eye contact with drivers before crossing the street.
- Do not run or dart out into the street or cross between parked cars.


