57/Lambert Project Update

Caltrans anticipates the interchange project to be substantially complete by the end of December 2023. Unfortunately, the project experienced several issues and delays that extended the construction schedule. Now on track, remaining project improvements include, completing the NB 57 fwy bridge widening, grinding and overlaying new asphalt on Lambert Rd., new traffic signals, median island, and overall site restoration. Landscaping of the project site will commence in early 2024.

Development Update

BREA PLAZA

1639 East Imperial Highway



Brea Plaza, a vibrant shopping center located along Imperial Highway, between the 57 Freeway and Associated Road, will soon undergo a remodel that would update and modernize the area located at the northwest corner of the shopping center. This project will demolish the existing theater building, add additional ground floor retail spaces, and second-floor office spaces with outdoor balcony areas to two of the existing buildings. Construction is expected to begin in winter/spring 2024.

GASLIGHT SQUARE REDEVELOPMENT

255 East Imperial Highway



In June, the City Council approved a development project at Gaslight Square. The project replaces four existing office buildings located along Imperial Highway with two new commercial buildings that include a 2,000 square-foot drive-through restaurant building and a 6,000 square-foot commercial building with spaces that could accommodate a restaurant and other general commercial uses. The two existing dentist offices will remain at their current locations, and the overall site will be improved with new landscaping and updated parking areas. Construction is expected to begin in winter/spring 2024.

City and HOPE Center Partner for Homeless Outreach

Addressing homelessness is a concern for all cities. Last year, the Brea Police Department responded to 1,076 homeless-related calls for service. That is a 12% increase from the prior year. To reduce the number of calls, and to offer individualized assistance to those in need, the City has formed a partnership with the HOPE Center.

Open in late 2022, the HOPE Center is designed as a structured, collaborative and highly leveraged approach for street homeless outreach workers to respond in real time when encountering individuals experiencing street homelessness and when applicable, to dispense specialized resources. The HOPE Center functions as a regional-wide response, integrating data and centralizing resources to street homeless in our surrounding communities. Earlier this year, the cities of Fullerton and Buena Park began their partnership with the HOPE Center and are currently deploying from there. While homeless outreach services

for the City of Brea are now centralized at the HOPE Center, the Brea Resource Center and Brea Police Department will continue to work in conjunction with their staff. Watering Schedule Reminder

Efforts to conserve water remain important to protect our City’s supply. Wasteful practices are always prohibited under statewide restrictions that have been made permanent. With that in mind, the City of Brea would like to remind you of the following watering schedule changes during the fall and winter seasons.

- No outdoor watering from 10 A.M. – 4 P.M.
- From October to April, outdoor automated irrigation is limited to one day a week, on Wednesdays.
- Limit watering to 10 minutes per station.

Capital Improvement Program Projects

As the City's infrastructure continues to age, an effective Capital Improvement Program, also known as the CIP, is necessary to maintain and upgrade as needed. Below are highlights of some projects.

COMPLETED PROJECTS:

- Country Hills Subdivision Pavement & Water Rehabilitation - Phase 1**
 Replaced water connections while rehabilitating the existing streets. Additional work included the replacement of curb, gutter, and ADA ramps to bring these items to standard and improve accessibility for the neighborhood.
- Water Line Improvements at Gemini Ave., Steel Dr., and Pleasant Hill Tract**
 The work entailed replacing undersized and end of life water mains, along with replacement of gate valves and fire hydrants to better service the community.

CURRENT PROJECTS:

- South Brea Water and Sewer Improvements**
 Removing and replacing water and sewer mains, the contractor is also installing new asphalt and concrete paving improvements, including ADA ramps. The project touches many components and maximized City funding by combining various work under one project.
- Berry Street Sidewalk Installation**
 Located on the west side of Berry St., from Central Ave. to Lambert Rd., this project includes the construction of new sidewalk, curb ramps, small retaining walls, and modifications to the existing adjacent landscaping to provide the area with new pedestrian facilities and access for businesses and the community.
- Country Hills Subdivision Pavement & Water Improvements – Phase II**
 Upon completion, this project will have seen approximately 3,500 feet of water main installed, along with asphalt and concrete paving improvements.
- Berry St. Reservoir Ring Road Rehabilitation**
 This includes paving improvements to the ring road around the Berry St. Reservoir. If an emergency did occur, the team can promptly mitigate any potential risks and ensure the City's water supply is safe.

Stay Safe This Holiday Season

The Brea Police Department wants to help you have a safe and cheerful holiday season. With increased shopping and travel over the next few months, keep these tips in mind.

Lock It, Take It, Keep It. Theft from vehicles is a highly reported crime during the holiday season. Do not leave items of value in the car, in plain view. Thieves are looking for laptops, purses, cell phones, wallets, sunglasses, credit cards, and anything else to easily carry away.

Plan deliveries. To deter thefts, have packages delivered to a designated delivery location or place of work, rather than the front door or mailbox.

Limit cash and credit cards. Only carry the amount of cash and credit cards needed.

Do not leave property unattended. Don't place a purse in a shopping cart, leave a cell phone on a restaurant table, or leave a wallet on a counter when paying.

Protect your home. Keep all doors and windows locked to decrease the chances of being burglarized. Install exterior lighting with motion sensors and an audible alarm system. If traveling, ask a neighbor to watch your home. Put timers on interior and exterior lights. Have newspapers, mail, and deliveries held or picked up by someone. Sign up for a vacation house check.

Be aware of surroundings. Do not be distracted in crowded areas, personal belongings are at risk. Limit cell phone use in public and don't carry social security cards or passports.

Personal safety. Park in well-lit, well-traveled areas and avoid being overloaded with packages.

If you see something, say something. Contact the Brea Police Department to report suspicious activity, call 714-990-7911. To report a crime in progress, call 9-1-1.

The City has begun preparing its first Local Hazard Mitigation Plan (LHMP). That's a five-year strategic plan that serves as a guiding blueprint for a community, enabling us to recognize potential threats that might affect the community and implement measures to minimize adverse consequences on residents, businesses, and the overall community. These potential hazards include, but are not limited to; wildfires, earthquakes, extreme heat and precipitation, floods, strong wind events, droughts, and hazardous material concerns. Having an LHMP also allows Brea to be eligible for FEMA grants and additional disaster relief funding from the State.
