57/Lambert Interchange Improvement Project Completed

After four years of construction, Caltrans completed and reopened the 57 freeway at Lambert Road interchange on January 31, 2024. The project was funded through grants and local funding that included state and federal grants, OCTA Measure M grant funds, and local funding from traffic impact funds.

The improvements made to the interchange now provide additional capacity, create a better traffic flow, enhance safety, reduce congestion, and improve the overall operational performance of the Lambert Road interchange. Also, the interchange project provides a bridge widening component as part of the future Northbound Truck Climbing Lane project, between Lambert Road and the Orange County and Los Angeles County line. The last phase of the project includes landscaping of the area which is now underway.

PROJECT HIGHLIGHTS INCLUDE:

- Widening of all Lambert Road on-ramps and off-ramps,
- A newly constructed Lambert Road loop on-ramp,
- Widening of Lambert Road in both directions, from Pointe Drive to State College Blvd, and
- Additional lanes on Lambert Road, in conjunction with extra space on the Lambert overcrossing bridge structure, for the future travel climbing lane project.

Construction to complete the project took longer than originally anticipated. Schedule fluctuations due to weather, supply chain issues, the pandemic, material needs, and the passing of safety inspections at each stage of the project all contributed to the delay. Caltrans District 12 Director Lan Zhou, "gives a special thank you to the Brea residents and local businesses for their patience as we (Caltrans) completed this challenging project."

What's Buzzing?

With summer upon us, it is essential to be mindful of the buzzing of pesky invaders that often accompany the warmer weather; the mosquitos and citrus psyllid.

Here are a few steps on how you can protect yourself and your citrus trees.

Protect Yourself from Mosquitoes

In California, two species of concern are the Culex and Aedes mosquitoes. Both have the potential to transmit diseases to humans and animals.

- Apply insect repellent containing an EPA-registered active ingredient, including DEET, picaridin, oil of lemon eucalyptus, or IR3535.
- Dress in long sleeves and pants, especially if outside at dawn and dusk, when mosquitoes that can spread West Nile virus are most active.
- Install screens on windows and doors and keep them in good repair to keep mosquitoes out of your home.
- Eliminate all sources of standing water, including flowerpots, old tires, buckets, etc. Mosquitoes lay eggs in very small amounts of standing water.
- Clean rain gutters clogged with leaves.
- Report neglected swimming pools and day-biting mosquitoes.

Protect Your Citrus Trees

A plant disease that kills citrus trees has been found in Brea, called Huanglongbing or citrus greening disease. It's not harmful to humans, but it is fatal for citrus trees and has no cure.

- Inspect trees for the Asian citrus psyllid and Huanglongbing monthly, and whenever watering, spraying, pruning or tending trees. If the disease is spotted, call 800-491-1899.
- Do not move citrus plants, leaves, or foliage into or out of the quarantine area or across state or international borders.
- As part of tree care, visit your local nursery or garden center to get advice on products that can help protect citrus trees from the Asian citrus psyllid.
- Buy citrus trees from licensed, local nurseries and only use registered budwood.
- Cooperate with agricultural officials placing insect traps, inspecting trees, and treating for the pest.
- Be sure to dry out citrus tree clippings or double bag them before disposing of the plant material.
- If you no longer wish to care for your citrus tree, consider removing it so it doesn't become a host.



TRANSWESTERN WAREHOUSE



The construction for a new industrial warehouse facility located at 285 N. Berry Street, near Imperial Highway, is nearing its completion. This new 35-foot tall, 126,797 square-foot warehouse building is a great addition to Brea's robust industrial base. Construction is expected to be completed by Spring 2024.

PROLOGIS WAREHOUSE



The demolition for the existing office building at 2727 E. Imperial Highway has been recently completed to pave the way for a new 60-foot tall, 113,700 square-foot warehouse building for Prologis. The site preparation and construction of the new warehouse will soon follow, with an anticipated completion date of Spring 2025.

Brea Begins General Plan Update and Brea Core Specific Plan


The City recently began its Focused General Plan Update. A General Plan is a document that provides a blueprint for meeting the community's long-term vision for the future. Brea's current General Plan was adopted in 2003, with a horizon year of 2020, making it no-longer a visioning document for the community and decision-makers. This project also includes preparation of a new Brea Core Specific Plan, which is phase two of the larger Brea Core improvement effort. The new specific plan would further implement the Brea Connecting the Core Active Transportation Plan that was adopted by the City Council in 2020.

These combined projects are anticipated to take two years to complete. The first step in the process is to conduct robust community outreach activities, such as public workshops, pop-up events, online surveys, announcements, and Community Steering Committee meetings. The community is encouraged to participate in these events to share their thoughts and help guide the City to accurately reflect the vision of the entire community. Summer Safety Tips

The Brea Fire Department wants you to be safe this summer. Keep cool in extreme heat, these conditions can be dangerous for everyone, but especially dangerous for people with chronic medical conditions. Stay cool and hydrated. Here are some safety tips to keep in mind when spending time outdoors this summer.

Bicycle safety:

- Do not overcharge an E-bicycle and always store and charge outdoors.
- Adjust bicycle seats to a proper height and locked in place before riding.
- Check that tires are properly inflated.
- Make sure the bike is equipped with a horn/bell, rear-view mirrors and reflectors on the rear and front pedals and spokes.
- Wear neon, bright clothing to increase visibility. If riding at night, wear reflective clothing and use flashing lights.
- Don't forget to wear your helmet.



Wear sunscreen & insect repellent:

- Use shade, wide-brimmed hats, clothing that covers your body, and broad-spectrum sunscreen, with at least SPF 15, for sun protection.
- Use insect repellent and wear long-sleeved shirts and long pants to prevent mosquito bites and ticks.
- Apply sunscreen before insect repellent. Reapply sunscreen after 2 hours and after swimming, sweating, or toweling off.



Being safe is fun in sun. Some friendly reminders – have someone watch the pool, especially for novice swimmers. The Brea Plunge offers swim lesson opportunities. If you are grilling, make sure to keep your eyes on the grill and away from the house, deck or anything flammable. Only call 9-1-1 for an emergency.



National Night Out is an opportunity to connect with neighbors, meet your local Brea Police Officers, and enjoy a night of family-friendly activities.

An evening of fun and community spirit includes,

- Photos with emergency vehicles, live K-9 demonstrations, and exciting police equipment.
- Fun games, entertaining activities for all ages, and "Dunk a Police Officer" in the dunk tank.

Take Steps to Deter Coyotes

Coyotes have become more visible and a concern in many neighborhoods. Be aware that coyotes are more active in the spring, when feeding and protecting their young. The City of Brea wants to help you stay safe and proactive in deterring coyotes in your neighborhood.

Use these tips to prevent human-coyote conflicts:

- In the City of Brea, it is unlawful to feed or make food available to wildlife.
- Coyotes primarily hunt rodents and rabbits for food, but will take advantage of whatever is available.
- Remove sources of water, pick up fallen fruit, and cover compost piles.
- Do not leave small children or pets outside unattended and bring your pets in overnight.
- Install motion-sensitive lighting and trim shrubbery to reduce hiding places.
- Share these tips with your neighbors and help keep our community safe!

If ever followed by a coyote, make loud noises, never run. If a coyote attacks a person, immediately call 9-1-1.

Help Keep Our Community Safe

The sale, use or discharge of fireworks are prohibited in Brea and can carry a fine up to \$1,000, even the "safe and sane" ones. Fireworks are dangerous and can be harmful to you, your property, and your pets. They are also a serious fire hazard as sparks from fireworks can travel to nearby homes or brush and ignite a fire.

Summer Program Kick Start Early Learning

In most communities, the start of summer typically generates excitement as students and teachers prepare to take a well-deserved break from the classroom. However, at Brea Olinda Unified School District, the summer months are filled with many opportunities for students to begin or continue developing early learning and foundational skills, recover academic credits that may have been lost in the prior year, and/or explore new and exciting programs like robotics for the first time. It's also a great time to enjoy some good old-fashioned fun with summer camps.

This summer, state preschool will be offered to Laurel and Arovista elementary students at Arovista Elementary this summer, from June 3 to August 12. There will also be a Preschool Summer Camp offered at Olinda Elementary from June 3 to August 2. Brea Olinda's state preschool program offers a fee-based and state-funded program for children ages three to five years old and is designed to provide an enriched environment for early learners. Our early learners in TK and Kindergarten can also look forward to a Summer Camp at Arovista Elementary from June 3 to August 2, and a Summer Camp for children in grades first through sixth,



at Olinda Elementary. Brea Olinda's Summer Camps provide parents with a reliable source of child care, but also provide a fun way for students to enjoy the summer months with fun activities, field trips and peer-to-peer connections.

The District will also offer elementary and junior high school students the opportunity to enroll in the very popular Summer Robotics Camp. The Robotics Camps are open to students

in grades 5 - 8 and can help them explore robotics for the first time or expand critical skills in engineering and coding using VEX IQ and VEX V5 robotics equipment. Look for more information about Robotics Camps on the BOUSD website.

Lastly, our high schoolers will have the opportunity to recover credits and improve grade point averages (GPA's) with several summer courses offered June 11 - July 26 at Brea Olinda High School. Credit recovery courses are only available to students who meet certain requirements and must be approved by a high school counselor.
