# Capital Improvement Program Projects

As the City's infrastructure continues to age, an effective Capital Improvement Program, also known as the CIP, is necessary to maintain and upgrade as needed. Below are highlights of some recent projects.

## COMPLETED PROJECTS:

### Country Hills Subdivision Pavement & Water Improvements – Phase II

Installed approximately 3,500 feet of water main, replaced water service connections, and made asphalt and concrete paving improvements to the existing streets. Additional work included the replacement of curb, gutter, and curb ramp improvements to improve accessibility for the neighborhood.

### South Brea Water and Sewer Improvements

Removed and replaced water and sewer mains, performed asphalt and concrete paving improvements, and removed and reconstructed existing curb ramps within the existing neighborhood.

### Rehabilitate Ring Road at Berry Street Reservoir

Removed and replaced asphalt paving access ring road around the Berry St. Reservoir, and replaced the existing curb and gutter within the project vicinity. This project also included the implementation of concrete slope stabilization around the perimeter of the reservoir to aid in future maintenance.

### Brea Boulevard Street Improvements

Removed and replaced existing asphalt and slurry sealed from the southerly City limits to Imperial Hwy. Additional work included the replacement of curb, gutter, curb ramp improvements along the corridor, and traffic striping. The new striping introduced new "sharrow" bike markings. "Sharrows", or shared lane markings, have been strategically placed within the right lane to serve as a visual cue to bicyclists where they should ride and to motorists to watch for the presence of bicyclists. The new "sharrows" do not restrict vehicular access, instead they emphasize the importance of sharing the roadway.

## CURRENT PROJECTS:

### Birch Street Improvements

This project includes asphalt paving improvements on Birch Street, from South Associated Road to Valencia Avenue. The improvements include paving upgrades, the removal and reconstruction of curb, gutter, and curb ramps as well as the removal and replacement of existing water infrastructure at the intersection of Birch Street and Kraemer Avenue.

### Lambert Road Traffic Signal Synchronization

This project will upgrade traffic signal control equipment, develop traffic signal timing plans, and synchronize traffic signals along the Lambert Road/Carbon Canyon Road corridor in Brea.

### Briarwood Lift Station Replacement

This project includes replacing the existing pump station with a package pump station at the location of the existing Briarwood Lift Station.

### Tamarack Park Parking Lot Rehabilitation

This project includes parking lot improvements such as asphalt paving, curb ramps, landscaping and irrigation, and security upgrades to the Tamarack Park parking lot.

# Changes Coming to Curbside Carts

The City of Brea and Republic Services are developing an updated recycling program for Brea residents to comply with new State mandated recycling requirements under Senate Bill 1383. This program will be rolled out soon. Meanwhile, residents who request a cart exchange/replacement (i.e., if a cart is damaged) through Republic Services will be receiving new State mandated colored carts. The transition to new carts should be completed by 2036. If you have the original (current) carts, please continue to use those as you have been.

## HERE ARE SOME FRIENDLY CART REMINDERS:

- Trash materials are disposed in the black/grey colored cart.
- Recyclable materials are disposed in the dark green OR blue-lid cart.
- Organic materials (such as yard waste) are disposed in the brown OR green-lid cart.

Earlier this year, the City began the process for the Focused General Plan Update and Brea Core Specific Plan, which is now branded as *Brea 2050: Where Opportunity Meets Community*. Together, the updated General Plan and the new Specific Plan for the Core area would guide the City's future growth for the next 25 years. This project is expected to take two years to complete, with the goal of final adoption by end of 2025.

Since the initial project kick-off, the City has already conducted various public outreach efforts, which included a direct mailer, a project video, an informational pop-up at

the City's Public Works and Fire Department Open House, a community survey, and a community Open House. The City is also in the process of conducting a focused group outreach, through the Community Steering Committee and other stakeholders. The community is encouraged to continue to participate in future community outreach opportunities to share their thoughts and help guide the City to accurately reflect the vision of the entire community.

## Arovista Park Modernization Update

The long-awaited Arovista Park Modernization project officially kicked off in April 2024. Phase one of construction will take place on the east side of the park (across from the Brea Senior Center) and is expected to take eighteen months to complete. As part of this project, the City is adding the first all-accessible playground in North Orange County which will provide an opportunity for children and adults of all ages and all abilities to have a safe space to play and enjoy the outdoors. Other amenities included in this phase are four new pickleball courts, upgraded basketball and volleyball courts, new restroom facilities, a new outdoor events space, resurfaced parking lot with new EV Charging stations, and an upgraded Tracks at Brea Trailhead.

During the construction period, parking will be limited in the lot adjacent to the Brea Senior Center and Boys and Girls Club. For more information, please contact Community Services at **714-990-7738**.

# What are Accessory Dwelling Units (ADU)?

An ADU (also known as a second unit or granny flat) is an independent housing unit that is located on a lot with a primary residence. ADUs are flexible spaces that may increase property value and be used as a guest home or long-term rental for passive income. In conformance with State law, the City generally permits ADUs and Junior ADUs through a building permit review process, in all areas where single-family, multi-family or mixed-use residential units are allowed. All ADUs must meet all required standards to ensure that the units contribute to a suitable living environment.

## Types of ADUs:

*Attached ADU*



*Detached ADU*



### Standard ADU

An ADU that is created by either converting an existing space within the primary residence or existing detached structure, or by constructing a new structure that is either attached to the primary residence or freestanding (detached from the primary unit).

### Junior ADU (JADU)

An ADU, that is no more than 500 sq. ft. in size and is contained entirely within an existing or proposed single-family residence.

## Building an ADU on Your Single-Family Property

To be considered for an ADU, the property must already have a primary residence, or a new primary residence is proposed along with the ADU. The City generally permits construction of an attached ADU that is up to 50% in size of the primary residence or 1,200 sq. ft., whichever is less, and a detached ADU up to 1,200 sq. ft. There are additional standards (e.g. setbacks, height limit, design standards, etc.) that all ADUs must meet.

Consulting with the Planning Division to discuss if a property is suitable for an ADU is highly recommended. Detailed information on the required plan review and permit process can be found at [cityofbrea.net/ADU](http://cityofbrea.net/ADU).

## ADU Design Process



- Download Building Permit Application, ADU Checklist, and Questionnaire.
- Consult with the Planning Division to discuss property and review application for consistency with requirements and refine design.
- Submit building permit application materials for review by Development Review Team.
- If application is approved, a building permit is issued.
- If applying for a JADU, record a covenant within 30 days. Consult with the Planning Division for covenant agreement.
- Begin building your newly permitted ADU.

# New Fiscal Year Budget Update

July 1 was the start of a new fiscal year for the City of Brea. With the Brea City Council adopting a biennial budget last year, the City entered the second year of a two-year budget. Adopting a biennial budget allowed the organization to maintain long-term financial perspective while remaining committed to City Council priorities, which include increased Public Safety, improved technology and efficiency, and an emphasis on employee attraction and retention. While staff was not focused on preparing a new budget this year, they worked diligently tracking revenues and expenses in order to stay within the adopted budget, with requests for periodic adjustments, only where necessary. Staff remains committed to the ongoing planning and review of the City's budget, and estimates remain conservative in order to maintain the organization's long-standing, positive fiscal health.

According to industry experts, the economic outlook for 2024 appears to be similar to that of 2023. Demand for housing keeps home values in Orange County high and consumer spending is still trending positively. Although for Brea, the growth rate for sales tax did not come in as high as previously assumed. With many projects on the horizon

in the City, there is strong potential to positively impact future sales tax and property tax revenues. Development continues to be strong, and it is seen with the total valuation of building permits being twice that of last fiscal year. There are new restaurants and shopping experiences already open in Brea, with many more to come, signaling promising possibilities for the future.

Brea's budget is balanced for fiscal year 2024-25. As with any 24-month expenditure plan, periodic budget adjustments are necessary to make. With direction provided by the City Council, adjustments were made throughout the year in response to economic fluctuations, for the purchase of public safety equipment and apparatus, and for the Arovista Park modernization project. Those are just a few examples of new items benefitting the community. For the current fiscal year, General Fund revenues are at \$75 million and expenditures are at \$72.9 million. The General Fund budget is the primary fund used to support City services such as, public safety, parks, recreation, and more. ## 2024 Election Information

A General Municipal Election will be held on Tuesday, November 5, 2024 for two (2) Council Member seats and one Treasurer seat.



If you are interested in serving on the Brea City Council, the nomination period opens July 15 and closes on August 9. Nomination paperwork must be filed with the City Clerk at 1 Civic Center Circle, Third Floor, by 5 p.m. on August 9, 2024. Please make an appointment if possible, but it is not mandatory.

If any of the incumbents (current Council Member/Treasurer who currently holds a seat) fail to file papers by the deadline, the filing period will extend through 5:30 p.m. on August 14, 2024.

All candidates must be Brea residents.

## Brush Clearance for Fire Safety

Brea is located within a very high fire hazard severity zone and fire prevention through brush clearance is critical for the health and safety of our community. The Brea Fire Department's annual Brush Clearance Program helps ensure the proper maintenance of properties for fire safety. This past spring, letters were mailed to properties nearest to fire prone areas as a reminder that all weeds, rubbish, refuse, debris, and other combustible materials must be cleared and remain cleared throughout the year. Brea Fire Prevention staff are inspecting properties throughout the year for compliance. If properties are found to be non-compliant, the City will notify property owners and assess inspection and/or abatement fees, as necessary. For questions about the program, call **714-990-7787**.

The Brea Fire Department's top priority is keeping our community safe and a great emphasis goes into fire prevention. Do your part by using the Self-Inspection Checklist.

- Property free of combustible materials/fire hazards.
- Cut grass and weeds down to 3 inches or less.
- On trees 18 feet and higher, trim lower branches to clear 6 feet from the ground.
- Trim tree branches 10 feet away from chimneys.
- Remove dead and dying trees, branches and bushes, and keep rooftops and gutters clear.
- Clear a minimum of 3 feet from the edge of the road.
- Allow access for emergency vehicles by trimming trees at least 13 feet and 6 inches above the roadway.
- Properly dispose of all bagged/cut materials, or chip and spread materials no higher than 3 inches.
- Address markers should be clearly visible on the front of all buildings and street curb. Addresses should be reflective, contrast with the background, and at least 4 inches tall with 1/2-inch stroke.
- Keep a 3-foot clearance of vegetation/dirt around fire hydrants adjacent to property line.

# September is National Preparedness Month

Make sure you are prepared in the event of a disaster. The Brea Fire Department has the following tips to share with you.

## BUILD A KIT

Plan on being self-sufficient for at least 72 hours after an emergency. Your kit should include: water, nonperishable food, medications, flashlight and batteries, first aid kit, to name a few. Visit [ready.gov](http://ready.gov) for a more complete list.

## MAKE A PLAN

Your family may not be together when a disaster strikes. It is important to know how you will contact one another and reconnect if separated. Establish a family meeting place that is familiar and easy to find. Most importantly, practice your plan!

## BE INFORMED

Sign up for AlertOC, Orange County's Emergency Mass Notification System. By registering with AlertOC time-sensitive voice messages from the City may be sent to your home, cell, or business phone. Text messages may also be sent to cell phones. **AlertOC will be conducting a Regional Test on September 17 at 10 a.m.** to test its effectiveness to deliver a large volume of notifications across the County to residents and businesses. ## GET INVOLVED

Join the Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) program and get trained on basic disaster response skills, such as fire safety, light search and rescue, team organization, and disaster medical operations.

# Burglary Prevention Tips

If anything looks questionable in your home, such as a split screen or a cracked window, **DO NOT GO IN! Call 9-1-1** right away from a neighbor's house or your cell phone to report the suspicious activity.

If you see any suspicious activity taking place, or have information pertaining to a crime, don't hesitate to call the police. For other safety tips and alerts provided by the department, visit [BreaPolice.net](http://BreaPolice.net).

Follow these safety tips to protect your home against burglary, forced entry or home invasion:

- Lock all windows, including interior garage doors and sliding doors, and keep spare keys away from exterior windows, doors, and lockboxes.
- Keep fences closed and locked. Lock all entry gates with a padlock.
- Keep bushes and tree branches trimmed and away from windows.
- Get to know your neighbors and watch out for each other.
- Remove objects in your yard that could be used to make a forced entry (tools, ladders, bricks, large rocks, etc.).
- Install an audible or monitored alarm system and place the company's sign in your front and back yard.
- Install a video camera at your home to help deter or identify a thief.
- Turn on exterior lights in driveways, front and back porch, etc.
- Install deadbolts to all entry doors and use longer screws when installing the strike plate.

# Prioritizing Safe & Modern Brea Olinda Schools



Long before Brea Olinda schools boasted career pathways programs, STEM, and dual language immersion programs, public schools were designed to teach students the core academics of English, language arts, and mathematics. Education has changed since the first high school in Brea was opened in 1927 to serve only 300 students at the time.

Today, Brea Olinda Unified School District (BOUSD) serves nearly 6,000 students in preschool through high school across 10 schools. With innovative programs such as coding, robotics, and medical pathways, Brea Olinda programs are among the top-rated in Southern California. Although, many of the facilities are still not equipped to provide the lab spaces, athletic facilities, and classrooms needed to be competitive in a contemporary learning environment. In addition, many of our school facilities have portable classrooms that are more than 25 years old and have exceeded their expected life span.

This summer, BOUSD prioritized facility maintenance projects by updating the exterior of Brea Country Hills Elementary and modernizing classrooms and other learning spaces at Brea Country Hills and Mariposa Elementary. Plans are also underway to enhance the safety of our schools with the installation of perimeter fencing at all school sites.

The fiscal impacts take on a large undertaking especially since there is no additional funding for public schools to support maintenance projects and facility improvements from the state. Community support is critical to meeting the needs of our students and families. It is only with the help of our community that we are able to enrich the student experience and strengthen Brea's educational legacy.






