## Street Sweeping

## Holiday Tree Recycling

Real holiday trees will be collected curbside by Republic Services from Thursday, December 26, 2024 through Saturday January 11, 2025.

Please observe the following guidelines:

- Make sure the tree is bare. Remove all decorations (lights, ornaments, tinsel, garland, tree stand).
- Set tree at the curb or next to dumpsters in your complex. If the tree is over six feet tall, cut it in half for easier collection.
- Trees in bags or with flocking are not recyclable. Cut and place flocked trees in the trash container, or if extra-large, schedule a bulky item pick-up.
- If you miss the collection window, cut the bare tree into pieces so that it will fit into your yard waste container with the lid closed.


## Artificial Trees

- Reuse: If you use an artificial tree, consider packing it up for next year.
- Donation: If you no longer need the tree and it is in good condition, consider donating it to a local organization or secondhand store.
- Disposal: If discarding, place the artificial tree or wreath into the trash container, or schedule a bulky item pickup.

**Note: Artificial trees, wreaths, and flocked trees are not recyclable.**

## Trash Collection

There will be no waste collection from Republic Services on the following holidays: Thanksgiving Day (November 28), Christmas Day (December 25), and New Year's Day (January 1). # Construction Updates

Below are highlights of projects currently in process or in review with the City. For additional information on projects in process, please visit, [cityofbrea.net/projectsinprocess](http://cityofbrea.net/projectsinprocess).

## ASSOCIATED ROAD HIGH PRESSURE WATER LINE PROJECT

Located along N. Associated Road, from Birch Street to Lambert Road, and along Lambert Road, at the intersection of N. Associated Road. The project consists of the installation of approximately 4,000 linear feet of cement mortar-coated steel waterline, waterline tie-ins and service modifications, and trench paving and striping improvements. This project serves to complete the high-pressure water line loop for the City's water system by adding redundancy measures. The contractor on the project completed installation of the waterline and is actively working on testing the line prior to making it active. The final stage includes paving and striping improvements.

## OC LOOP BIKEWAY

The County of Orange is partnering with the City to construct a portion of the OC Loop, a continuous 66-mile loop around Orange County that connects several regional bikeways to provide access to some Orange County beaches and inland destinations. The County is the lead agency for the construction, that will connect the El Cajon Regional Riding and Hiking Trail to the La Floresta Trail through portions of Brea, Placentia, and Yorba Linda. The construction of OC Loop Segment D, within the City of Brea, includes the construction of a bikeway along the south side of Imperial Highway, from La Floresta Drive to the southerly City limits at the Carbon Canyon Channel, as well as signal, signage, and striping modifications to the intersection of Imperial Highway and La Floresta Drive. The project is under construction and the portion within Brea's city limits is anticipated to be completed in December 2024.

## BREA MALL

Construction of the Brea Mall redevelopment project is progressing well. Two of the new buildings, including a new entrance to the mall, are halfway done, while the other two new buildings are ready for construction with permits in process. The remodel of the existing mall is also progressing, with 60% completion. Once the current phases are further along, construction on the landscaping and outdoor plaza will begin, as those plans have been approved. The residential and Lifetime Fitness buildings are next to start construction as grading permits have been approved.

## AROVISTA PARK

Construction is underway for the eastern portion of Arovista Park. All site equipment and amenities have been removed. Due to safety concerns, the Brea Skatepark remains closed until further notice. The project is anticipated to be completed in Fall 2025.





# Stay Safe This Holiday Season

The City of Brea wants you to have a safe and cheerful holiday season. With increased decorating, shopping, and travel over the next few months, the Brea Police and Fire Departments would like you to keep these tips in mind.

## DECORATING SAFETY TIPS

- Avoid using lit candles. Never put candles on trees.
- Do not leave holiday lights unattended. Turn off lights to avoid a fire.
- Do not overload electrical outlets. Do not link more than three light strands, unless directions indicate it is safe.
- Do not block exits with trees or decorations.
- Inspect holiday lights each year for frayed wires, broken or cracked sockets, and excessive kinking before putting them up.
- Never put wrapping paper in the fireplace.
- All decorations should be nonflammable or flame-retardant, including artificial trees. Keep decorations away from flames.
- Put away outdoor electrical lights to prevent hazards.
- Choose a tree with fresh, green needles that do not fall off. Before placing the tree in the stand, cut 2" off the trunk. Remember to add water to the tree stand daily!
- Make sure the tree is at least three feet away from any heat source, like fireplaces, radiators, candles, heat vents or lights.
- Use lights that have the label of an independent testing laboratory. Some lights are only for indoor use.

## PERSONAL SAFETY TIPS

- Lock It, Take It, Keep It. Theft from vehicles is highly reported during the holiday season. Do not leave items of value in the car, in plain view.
- Have packages delivered to a designated location you'll be able to pick up right away.
- When shopping, only carry the amount of cash and credit cards needed.
- Park in well-lighted, well-traveled areas and avoid being overloaded with packages.
- Do not place a purse in a shopping cart, leave a cell phone on a restaurant table, or leave a wallet on a counter when paying.
- Keep all doors and windows locked to decrease the chances of being burglarized. Put timers on interior and exterior lights.
- Be aware of your surroundings. Do not be distracted in crowded areas, personal belongings are at risk.

## Traveling During the Holidays?

## Conserve, Brea!

Remember, from October to April, outdoor automated watering is limited to one day a week, on Wednesdays only. Efforts to conserve water remain important to protect the City's supply. Wasteful practices are always prohibited under statewide restrictions.

### ADDITIONAL CONSERVATION REMINDERS:

- Limit outdoor irrigation systems to 10 minutes per station.
- Outdoor irrigation system watering is prohibited between 10:00 a.m. - 4:00 p.m.
- Water leaks must be fixed within 48 hours.

- Do not water until 48 hours after a rain event.
- Do your part to reduce/eliminate outdoor runoff from your irrigation system, since these flows can carry pollutants to the storm drain system.

# BOUSD Schools Shine in California PBIS Recognitions



The California PBIS Coalition recently awarded a range of honors to Brea's schools, from reflecting their commitment to fostering positive school environments, enhancing student outcomes, and promoting equitable and inclusive practices. In a remarkable achievement, nine schools from the Brea Olinda Unified School District (BOUSD) have been recognized for the 2023-2024 school year for their outstanding efforts in implementing Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports (PBIS) with six schools making improvements over the previous year.

PBIS is a framework designed to improve the behavioral and academic outcomes of students by providing consistent, positive reinforcement and support. Schools are recognized at different levels—Platinum, Gold, Silver, and Bronze—based on the depth and fidelity of their PBIS implementation, as well as their success in using data to improve student behavior and engagement.

"These recognitions affirm our district's dedication to fostering environments where students feel safe, respected, and ready to learn," said Superintendent Brinda Leon. "I am incredibly proud of our schools' efforts and the positive impact they are having on our students."

As BOUSD continues to prioritize PBIS, the district looks forward to even greater strides in enhancing the learning experience for every student. The recognition of these nine schools underscores the district's leadership in promoting effective behavioral strategies that lead to lasting academic and social success.
