

# Spring into Sustainability

As spring blossoms in California, so does a renewed commitment to sustainability. California's Senate Bill 1383 (SB 1383), which went into effect in 2022, is a pivotal law focused on reducing organic waste in landfills and promoting environmental sustainability. This spring, residents will have an updated, comprehensive, waste management program to ensure compliance with this State mandate. It is required for households to have all three curbside carts; one for trash, one for recycling, and one for organic materials. Recognizing what materials belong in each cart is crucial for compliance and program effectiveness. Additional information and educational materials will be provided to residents prior to program implementation. Embrace spring's spirit of renewal by becoming a champion of sustainability in your community!

Businesses are also mandated to implement recycling and organics recycling programs to align with the State's sustainability goals. # Safety Enhancements Added to The Tracks at Brea

As spring arrives and you head outdoors, you may notice there are new amenities in place to enhance safety while using The Tracks at Brea trail. In addition to the new e-bike ordinance, location markers and safety signage have been added along the trail.

As part of a Girl Scout Gold Award project, location indication markers were added along The Tracks. Girl Scout Sophia San Filippo presented her idea to the Parks, Recreation and Human Services Commission, and then worked with several City departments to see her project through. The location indication markers are color coded to represent the different segments of The Tracks. Should someone need assistance, they can tell their location through the colors.

Another addition to The Tracks at Brea Trail is new safety signage. Staff worked to provide educational signage in regards to wildlife and pedestrian safety. The signage is intended to increase awareness of the wildlife that may be on the trail and offer safety tips. There are also signs pertaining to bicycles and e-bikes which is meant to caution trail users about sharing trail space.

The new signs and trail markers provide QR codes to the City's website where more information is provided. The hope is that the new additions to The Tracks at Brea trail will provide ease and education to the patrons who travel through The Tracks.



## Solar Permitting System

The Community Development Department has launched SolarApp+, an online permitting platform for roof-mounted residential solar projects. This automated system streamlines the review process for residential solar panel installations, with or without energy storage, up to a

maximum size of 38.4 KW. By substituting manual plan checks with automated software, SolarApp+ expedites the permitting process time and offers immediate access to comments from City staff. Visit the City's website and search for "solar" to learn more about eligible projects.



## Brea Fire Debuts Ambulance Program

The Brea Fire Department now has its own in-house ambulance service program. Rather than contracting with a private ambulance company, the fire department owns and operates ambulances out of Brea Fire Stations 2 and 3. In addition, the ambulance operators who drive the ambulances, also known as EMTs, are City employees. This service model, that appears no different to the public, has many community benefits. It will improve the department's oversight of training

and hiring practices, and also lead to enhanced customer service by maintaining a high level of control over the quality of services provided. Additionally, this program creates a potential hiring pool, which is an added benefit to the fire department's staffing needs. The billing portion will continue to be provided through a separate third-party contractor.

## Fire Department Offers CERT Training

The Community Emergency Response Team, better known as CERT, is a nationwide program that trains citizen responders to help in their neighborhood in the event of a large-scale disaster or other local emergency. Participants receive classroom and hands-on training to learn about disaster preparedness for hazards that may impact neighborhoods. Basic disaster response skills, such as fire safety, light search and rescue, team organization, and disaster medical operations are also taught. CERT training is provided free of charge, but pre-registration is required for each class. Registration is open to those residing in Brea.

# New E-Bike Ordinance in Effect



The Brea City Council adopted a new e-bike ordinance that took effect on January 2, 2025. The intent of the ordinance is to focus enforcement on reckless or destructive behaviors, as well as actions that pose a danger to the shared use of streets and trails by pedestrians and vehicles. The ordinance covers all “electronic mobility devices” (e-bikes, mobility devices, motorized scooters, skateboards, and pocket bikes) and aligns with the City’s existing regulations for bicycles, skateboards, and roller skates. The ordinance calls for violators to be fined, but also gives the Brea Police Department the option to refer juvenile offenders and their parents to e-bike education programs in lieu of paying a fine.

The e-bike ordinance is in response to an Orange County Grand Jury report titled, E-bikes: Friend or Foe. Released in June 2024, the report highlighted the lack of established regulations for e-bike use in the county. One of the report’s recommendations was for each city in Orange County to create an ordinance to address this gap. In response, the Brea Police Department, the City of Brea, and the Brea Olinda Unified School District all collaborated to address the Grand Jury’s findings and recommendations. Following the approach used for most traffic-related issues, a three-pronged strategy was developed with focus on education, engineering, and enforcement. With the primary focus on education, more information will be available in the spring.



## Staying Vigilant During Coyote Mating Season

In the spring, you may see an increase in coyote activity due to coyote mating season. Male coyotes can become more aggressive and pose a threat to your dogs and/or small pets. Please bring in your pets and do not leave them alone at night. As a reminder, if you experience a coyote attack or threat to a human, call 9-1-1 immediately. ## Overnight Parking Permits

If you use on-street, overnight parking in Brea, be sure to apply for your new overnight parking permit for 2025. Without a visible 2025 parking permit on your vehicle, vehicles can be ticketed if left on public streets between the hours of 2 – 6 a.m.

The City has transitioned to a new software to issue permits and all applications will be processed in the new software system, so renewals will not be available this year. A

video tutorial is available online to walk you through the application process. The cost of an overnight parking permit remains the same, \$22 if purchased online, or \$34 if purchased in person at the Brea Civic & Cultural Center. # Brea Olinda Unified Programs & Pathways Prepare Students for Future Careers



The Brea Olinda Unified School District (BOUSD) continues to set a high bar for educational excellence with its comprehensive and innovative programs. From early career exploration opportunities in elementary schools to a variety of Career and Technical Education (CTE) courses and pathways throughout junior high and high school, students within the district are empowered in their journey to pursue their passions and prepare for a successful future.

## EARLY CAREER EXPLORATION

BOUSD introduces young learners to various professions through engaging activities, guest speakers, and hands-on projects. These initiatives spark early interest in fields such as science, technology, engineering, arts, and mathematics (STEAM).

This past year, Laurel Elementary Magnet School launched the RIASEC career language model in their school with a dedicated Career Lab space. RIASEC is a personality type theory and assessment that helps individuals identify their interests and find careers that match their personality. Through intentional career-focused conversations and career-infused instruction, students develop foundational skills, build confidence, and envision a future filled with potential. Additionally, competitive robotics programs at each elementary school site provide opportunities for students to explore careers in coding and engineering while honing critical thinking and problem-solving skills.

## EXPANDED OPPORTUNITIES AT BREA JUNIOR HIGH

As students transition to Brea Junior High School (BJHS), they gain access to career-focused elective courses that build on their earlier explorations. Programs such as the Builder and

Maker Elective Pathways allow students to earn introductory course credits applicable toward high school academies and pathways such as the Building Industry Technology Academy (BITA) and Global Information Technology Academy at Brea Olinda High School (BOHS). Elective courses at BJHS also introduce students to fields like broadcasting, medical careers, visual and performing arts, and advanced robotics. These courses help prepare students for rigorous high school programs by fostering essential skills and encouraging exploration of potential career fields.

## ADVANCED CAREER PREPARATION

When students reach BOHS, students can further define their career interests through seven CTE pathways, advanced placement courses, dual-enrollment opportunities with local colleges, and a variety of visual and performing arts programs. These offerings deepen students' understanding of career-related fields and, in some cases, provide certifications required to enter the workforce directly after high school. Programs in culinary arts, medical and patient care, and BITA, allow students to earn certifications upon completion of the pathway.

"BOUSD's commitment to fostering academic excellence and career readiness at every stage ensures that every student is equipped to succeed in their chosen path," said Superintendent Brinda Leon. "By offering diverse programs that blend academic rigor with practical skills, and by starting career exploration early, the district empowers students to dream big, discover their potential and pursue their dreams."

## Mayor's Youth Award

High school students residing in Brea have a special opportunity to make an impact on the community while receiving recognition for their efforts. The Mayor's Youth Community Service Award is presented to graduating seniors who have worked to make a difference in the community by volunteering throughout their high school years. 
