# What's Buzzing?

With summer upon us, it is essential to be mindful of the buzzing of pesky invaders that often accompany the warmer weather; mosquitos and citrus psyllid. Here are a few steps on how you can protect yourself and your citrus trees.

## Fight Back Against Mosquitoes

Rain can bring various breeding areas for mosquitos to grow in population. In California, two species of concern are the Culex and Aedes mosquitos. Both have the potential to transmit diseases to humans and animals. Be proactive and dump out any outdoor water source.

Tips to prevent mosquito bites:

- Apply insect repellent containing an EPA-registered active ingredient, including DEET, picaridin, oil of lemon eucalyptus, or IR3535 to clothes and exposed skin.
- Dress in long sleeves and pants, especially if outside at dawn and dusk when mosquitos that can spread West Nile virus are most active.
- Install screens on windows and doors and keep them in good repair to keep mosquitos out of your home.
- Eliminate all sources of standing water on your property, including flowerpots, old tires, buckets, pet dishes, and trash cans. Mosquitos lay their eggs in very small amounts of standing water.
- Repair leaking faucets and broken sprinklers that can contribute to standing water around your home.

## Protect California Citrus

A plant disease that kills citrus trees has been found in Brea. The disease, called Huanglongbing (HLB) or citrus greening disease, is not harmful to humans but it is fatal for citrus trees. The disease is spread by a pest called the Asian Citrus Psyllid as it feeds on citrus tree leaves. An HLB emergency program for cities and communities of Orange County is in place, including Brea, to protect the state's iconic fruit.

To further protect your citrus trees, follow these tips:

- Inspect trees for the Asian citrus psyllid and HLB monthly, and whenever watering, spraying, pruning or tending trees.
- Do not move citrus plants, leaves, or foliage into or out of the quarantine area or across state or international borders. Keep it local.
- Visit your local nursery or garden center to get advice on products that can help protect citrus trees.
- Buy citrus trees from licensed, local nurseries and only use registered budwood.
- Cooperate with agricultural officials placing insect traps, inspecting trees and treating for the pest.
- Dry out citrus tree clippings or double bag them before disposing the plant material.
- Remove no longer wanted citrus trees so they do not become a host to the pest or disease.

# Water Conservation Measures Continue

Since 2022, the City has adjusted its watering schedule to focus on functional turf, like sports fields and trees, in an effort to conserve water. Now, with the introduction of new regulations under AB 1572, the irrigation of non-functional turf is prohibited on commercial, industrial, and institutional properties across California. This includes areas like street rights-of-way, parking lots, medians, and non-recreational spaces outside businesses.

In response, the Municipal Water District of Orange County is offering a Turf Replacement Program for commercial properties. This program provides incentives for replacing irrigated turf grass

with California-native and climate-friendly plants. For details and application information, visit [mwdoc.dropletportal.com](https://www.mwdoc.dropletportal.com).

- During Summer, automated Irrigation is limited to three days per week, Wednesdays, Fridays, and Sundays.
- No outdoor watering from 10 a.m. – 4 p.m.
- Limit watering to 10 minutes per station

# Residential Organics Takes Shape

The Brea City Council recently approved an amended agreement with Republic Services to include the necessary programs for everyone to comply with California Senate Bill 1383 (SB 1383). The bill requires reductions of organic waste in landfills as part of a greater plan to reduce emissions of short-lived climate pollutants, such as methane.

As part of the City's commitment to comply with SB 1383, Brea residents will be able to dispose of food scraps and food soiled paper in their yard waste carts starting July 1. Residents will be receiving informational letters and educational materials from Republic Services to keep informed on this new recycling program.

It is crucial for residents to ensure they have all three carts (trash, recycle, and yard waste/organics) to be in compliance with SB 1383. ## Steps to Deter Coyotes

The City of Brea wants to help you stay safe and proactive in deterring coyotes in your neighborhood.

### Use these tips to prevent human-coyote conflicts:

- It is unlawful to feed or make food available to wildlife.
- Coyotes primarily hunt rodents and rabbits for food, but will take advantage of whatever is available.
- Remove sources of water, fallen fruit, and cover compost.
- Do not leave small children or pets outside unattended and bring your pets in overnight.
- Install motion-sensitive lighting and trim shrubbery to reduce hiding places.

If ever followed by a coyote, make loud noises, never run. If a coyote attacks a person, immediately call 9-1-1.

# Brush Clearance & Fire Prevention

The Brea Fire Department's top priority is keeping our community safe with an emphasis on fire prevention. The Brush Clearance Program serves as a reminder of the local hazard abatement requirements the City has in place to protect your property, and the Brea community. Notices are sent to homes that are in close proximity to hillsides where there is high potential for wildland fire.

Here are some helpful tips for creating defensible space:

## 0 – 5 Feet from Home

- Use hardscape like gravel, pavers, or concrete
- Relocate garbage, recycling containers, and lumber

## 5 – 30 Feet from Home

- Remove all dead plants, dead or dry leaves
- Trim trees to keep branches a least 10 feet from other trees

## 30 – 100 Feet from Home

- Keep 10 feet of clearance around exposed wood piles
- Cut annual grass down to a max height of four inches

## Stay Safe this Summer

The Brea Fire Department is sharing the following safety tips to keep in mind when spending time outdoors this summer.

### Swimming Safety Tips:

- Install barriers around a pool or spa, such as fences, gates/doors, alarms and safety covers.
- No one should ever swim alone.
- Designate a water watcher, someone who is free of distraction and can focus on those in the water.
- Always keep small children within arm's reach.
- If a child goes missing, **ALWAYS** check the water first.
- Learn CPR and wear a life vest if you are not a strong swimmer.





# E-Bike Safety

The Brea Police Department is working closely with the City of Brea and the Brea-Olinda Unified School District to create and distribute a series of educational resources about e-bikes and other electronic mobility devices. These materials will be shared in the coming months through both social media channels and traditional print media. Additionally, the Police Department is developing an engaging e-bike safety class for both riders and their parents, offering an interactive opportunity to learn essential safety information and get answers to questions you might have.

E-Bikes are subject to all other laws applicable to bicycles, and may be ridden where bicycles are permitted unless prohibited by signs. Before purchasing an e-bike, it is important to know the rules of the road. Here is a quick overview of important information and safety rules.

## CLASS TYPES AND DESCRIPTIONS

### Class I E-Bike

Equipped with a motor that aids only when rider is pedaling with a maximum motor assisted speed of 20 MPH

### Class II E-Bike

Throttle assisted electric bicycle equipped with motors that exclusively propels the bicycle, with a maximum motor assistance of 20 MPH

### Class III E-Bike

Equipped with a motor that aids only when the rider is pedaling, with a maximum motor assisted speed of 28 MPH

## RULES & REGULATIONS

- Class III riders must be 16 years old and wear a helmet at all times. Class I & II riders must wear a helmet until 18 years of age
- Riding against the flow of traffic is prohibited
- Obey all traffic lights and signs, and yield right-of-way to pedestrians
- It is illegal to carry passengers on your e-bike unless the bike has an extra permanent seat or when using a child safety seat
- Proper reflective and lighting equipment must be used during night operation

## All Fireworks are Illegal in Brea

### Help Keep Our Community Safe

The sale, use or discharge of fireworks are prohibited in Brea and can carry a fine up to \$1,000, even the "safe and sane" ones. Fireworks are dangerous and can be harmful to you, your property, and your pets. They are also a serious fire hazard as sparks from fireworks can travel to nearby homes or brush and ignite a fire.

# Expanded Dual Enrollment Opportunities



Brea Olinda High School (BOHS) students now have even more opportunities to jump-start their college education through the school's expanded Dual Enrollment opportunities. In partnership with Fullerton College, BOHS is offering an increased selection of college-level courses, allowing students to earn both high school and college credit simultaneously. Starting next fall, the expansion will include new courses in drone piloting, administration of justice, and an Early College Program, ensuring that students can reduce both time and the financial burdens associated with post-secondary education.

The expansion of dual enrollment opportunities offers numerous advantages to BOHS students, including:

- **College Credit:** Students earn credits that may be transferable to universities, reducing future college costs.
- **Career Preparation:** Students gain early exposure to career pathways in high-demand fields
- **Enhanced Academic Experience:** Students are challenged with college-level coursework that can help prepare them for future academic success.
- **Competitive Edge:** College-level courses can help strengthen college applications with advanced coursework.

The most exciting addition to BOHS's dual enrollment offerings is the introduction of the Uncrewed Aerial Systems Piloting (drone piloting) and Administration of Justice (AJ) certificate pathways through Fullerton Community College.

With the rise of drone technology across industries such as agriculture, real estate, public safety, and media, the addition of the drone certificate pathway provides students with valuable hands-on experience. Juniors and seniors who enroll in these

courses will learn about drone operation, FAA regulations, safety protocols, and potential career pathways in this rapidly growing field. By the end of the course, students will be prepared to take the FAA Part 107 certification exam, a crucial step toward becoming a licensed drone pilot.

The Administration of Justice certificate program also brings an exciting pathway for students who are interested in law enforcement, criminal justice, forensic science or legal studies. The certificate pathway program will offer an in-depth look into the American legal system, crime scene investigation and police report writing. Through courses in this program, students can gain a foundational understanding of the criminal justice system and will explore career opportunities in fields such as policing, forensic science, and legal studies.

"The expanded dual enrollment opportunities align with our district's vision of providing unlimited possibilities while also serving as an excellent example of how we prepare students for the future by blending technology, innovation, and practical skills for their future success," said Superintendent Brinda Leon.

Beyond dual enrollment, students also have access to work-based learning opportunities as part of several robust CTE programs. For example, through a new partnership with Brea Fire Department, students in the Sports Medicine and Health Care pathway program get advanced life support training and demonstrations by Brea Fire EMTs.

Brea Olinda Unified School District is committed to providing students with meaningful opportunities to explore their interests, gain valuable skills, and prepare for their future careers. Students and parents interested in learning more about dual enrollment opportunities are encouraged to speak with their school counselor to explore options.
