## Street Sweeping Reminders

The City of Brea prides itself on being a well-maintained community. Brea's Street Sweeping program is designed to ensure that the streets are kept safe and clean of debris.

In order to keep the streets clean and prevent debris from reaching our waterways, we encourage the community to move your vehicles from the street on your street sweeping day. This will allow the Street Sweeper to fully clean all areas of your street and maintain the City's roadways.

Additionally, the City is obligated to comply with the mandates of the National Pollution Discharge Elimination

System (NPDES). Proper street sweeping significantly reduces accumulation of trash and debris and prevents it from entering storm drains and the natural watershed.

Expect to see the street sweeper Monday through Thursday, even on rainy days. Rain tends to wash off extra debris, sweeping efforts continue to collect trash on schedule and keep it from washing into the storm drain system. ## Mayor's Youth Award Promotes Volunteerism

Volunteerism and service to the community are long-standing traditions in Brea. To receive a medal and letter of recognition from the Mayor, seniors must complete a minimum of 160 hours. Juniors receive a letter of recognition

# Brea City Council Approves Biennial Budget

At their June 17 meeting, the Brea City Council approved the fiscal year 2025-27 biennial budgets. The biennial operating budget serves as the City's financial plan for the next two fiscal years. The budget process is always framed around the City Council's Top Priorities and Projects. While the process is a citywide effort that involves the entire organization, it is supported by the City's Financial Policies Statement.

This year's budget process began with overcoming a projected budget shortfall. With the goal of delivering a balanced budget, while faced with economic uncertainty and fiscal challenges, each City department was tasked with evaluating their budgets to reduce expenditures and/

or increase revenues. This overall fund balancing strategy avoided making severe service reductions and continued the delivery of high-level services to the community. City staff will continue their work to better understand the changing economic environment and closely monitor the City's sales tax revenue and other revenue sources. With development continuing in Brea, it serves as an opportunity for sales tax growth and the prospect of additional revenue to support ongoing City services.

Below are highlights of the recently adopted General Fund budget, a fund that is used to support City services such as public safety, parks, recreation, human services, and more.

## REVENUES

- Budgeted \$74.4 million for FY 2025-26, includes \$2.7 million in estimated excess General Fund reserves from the prior year
- Budgeted \$77.4 million for FY 2026-27, includes \$3.9 million in estimated excess General Fund reserves from the prior year
- General Fund reserves above the City's 25% reserve policy limit were used to supplement revenues

# Register for CERT Classes

September 9 – 27, Tuesday/Thursday Evenings and Saturday Morning

The Brea Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) program educates residents about disaster preparedness for hazards that may impact their neighborhood. The program also trains them in basic disaster response skills, such as fire safety, light search and rescue, team organization, and disaster medical operations. With training in the classroom and during practical exercises, CERT members can then assist others in their neighborhood or workplace immediately

following an event when professional emergency responders are not immediately available to help.

CERT training is provided free of charge, but pre-registration is required. The minimum age to register for the class is 16 years, if a parent also registers and attends. Registration is open to those residing in Brea and taken on an on-going basis, until filled. For more information, visit [breafire.gov](https://www.breafire.gov).

# AlertOC Test on September 17

AlertOC is Orange County's regional mass notification system designed to keep those who live or work in Orange County informed of important information when there is an emergency situation affecting the health, safety, or welfare of our community. By registering your contact information with AlertOC, time-sensitive messages from the City may be sent to your home, cell, or business phones, as well as text messages, emails, and TTY devices.

# Burglary Prevention Tips

If anything looks questionable in your home, such as a split screen or a cracked window, **DO NOT GO IN! Call 9-1-1** right away from a neighbor's house or your cell phone to report the suspicious activity. Follow these safety tips to protect your home against burglary, forced entry or home invasion:

- Lock all windows, including interior garage doors and sliding doors, and keep spare keys away from exterior windows, doors, and lockboxes.
- Keep fences and entry gates closed and locked.
- Keep bushes and tree branches trimmed and away from windows.
- Get to know your neighbors and watch out for each other.
- Remove objects in your yard that could be used to make a forced entry (tools, ladders, bricks, large rocks, etc.).

- Install an audible or monitored alarm system and place the company's sign in your front and back yard.
- Install a video camera at your home to help deter or identify a thief.
- Turn on exterior lights in driveways, front and back porch.
- Install deadbolts to all entry doors and use longer screws when installing the strike plate.

## Pedestrian Safety Tips

In order to increase awareness around pedestrian safety, and remind drivers to watch for pedestrians each and every time they are behind the wheel, the Brea Police Department is offering the following safety tips and reminders.

- Keep your eyes up, and your phone down.
- Look left, right and left again before crossing the street.
- Always walk on sidewalks.
- If there are no sidewalks, walk facing traffic as far to the left as possible.
- Wear bright-colored clothing or reflective gear if walking at night.
- Make eye contact with drivers before crossing the street.
- Do not run or dart out into the street or cross between parked cars.

# New E-Bike Safety Program Launches in Brea this Summer



Brea Olinda Unified School District (BOUSD) is proud to announce a new partnership with Brea Police Department and the City of Brea focused on promoting e-bike safety among students and families. As e-bike use continues to grow in our community, safety education is more important than ever.

For the 2025-26 school year, students who plan to ride and park e-bikes on school campuses must first complete an official e-bike safety class in order to receive a valid BOUSD e-bike permit. Permits will be available for free to all secondary students and 6th grade elementary students who have completed the e-bike safety course. This new requirement is part of the district's ongoing commitment to student safety and the safe routes to school program.

Led by Brea Police Department officers, the free e-bike safety classes cover:

- Local and state laws for e-bike operation
- Safe riding practices on streets and sidewalks
- Helmet and equipment use
- E-bike classifications

Completion of a safety class is mandatory to obtain an e-bike permit. Upon completion of the e-bike safety course, students will receive a certificate of completion that can be used to obtain the permit sticker at their respective school. Permits will be available to Brea Junior High and Brea Olinda High School students during their fall registration dates.



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
