# Recycling Tips for the Holiday Season

## DURING THE FALL

- Pumpkins, leaves, candy, and apples go in the Organics Cart
- Snack wrappers, makeup, and plastic utensils/straws go in the Trash Cart
- Paper, cardboard, glass bottles/jars, metal cans, plastic bottles/tubs, pie tins, aluminum foil, and cartons go in the Recycle Cart (must be empty, clean, and dry!)
- Reuse or donate toys, costumes, and decorations

## IN THE WINTER

- Recycle gift boxes, tissue paper, shoe boxes, card/envelopes, paper gift bags, and non-metallic wrapping paper
- Dispose of bubble wrap, metallic wrapping paper, ribbons, bows, laminated/coated/dyed gift bags, sticky gift labels, and foam peanuts in the trash

### ACCEPTED RECYCLABLE MATERIALS

Aluminum and metal cans  
 Aluminum foil (clean) and pans  
 Glass bottles and jars  
 Milk and juice cartons  
 Junk mail, magazines, newspaper, office paper and cardboard  
 Paper egg cartons  
 Plastic buckets, containers, and jugs  
 Small scrap metal  
 (less than 10 pounds, no cords/chains)

### ACCEPTED ORGANICS MATERIALS

Small branches, leaves, and yard trimmings  
 Grass, weeds, flowers, and plants  
 Untreated wood  
 Food scraps (fruit, vegetables, grains, fish, meat, small bones, dairy, coffee grounds)  
 Food-soiled paper (paper napkins, paper towels, soiled cardboard pizza boxes)

## Trash Collection


Republic Services observes Thanksgiving Day, Christmas Day, and New Year's Day. If your pickup day falls on one of these holidays, service will be delayed by one day.

## Holiday Tree Recycling

Commencing December 26 through January 16, Republic Services will be collecting holiday trees from residents.

- Residents must place their trees curbside on their regularly scheduled collection day.
- Holiday trees must be removed from stands, cut into lengths no longer than four feet, and be free of ornaments, garlands, tinsel, flocking, or other decorations. If trees are not bare, they will not be collected.
- Holiday trees collected are taken to an organics materials processing facility to be turned into compost for beneficial reuse.

Other holiday greenery, such as wreaths, must be completely bare and placed in the organics container. Artificial trees, wreaths, and other greenery that cannot be reused for the following year or donated, should be disposed of in the trash cart.

## Development Update

### GREENBRIAR RESIDENTIAL DEVELOPMENT

1698-1700 Greenbriar Lane



The Greenbriar residential development is a 179-unit community of for-sale townhomes under construction on the site of a former office building and parking structure formerly occupied by Mercury Insurance. Demolition of the building is underway, with the project currently under the building permit plan check process. Completion of construction is anticipated to conclude in late 2026 or early 2027.

### BREA PLAZA LIVING PROJECT

1639 East Imperial Highway



A four-story multifamily residential apartment building, featuring a two-level parking structure is coming to the northwest corner of the Brea Plaza Shopping Center. Pending the building plan check processes, construction is estimated to start in early to mid-2026.

# Maintaining City Infrastructure

The City's Capital Improvement Program (CIP) aims to maintain and monitor Brea's infrastructure. The following projects were recently completed.



## BIRCH STREET PHASE 1A STREET IMPROVEMENTS

Construction is complete for the street improvements along Birch St., from Kraemer Blvd. to Valencia Ave. The project consisted of the removal and replacement of asphalt pavement, traffic loops, curb access ramps, median curbs, and striping. This first phase was completed in October, and subsequent phases of street improvements along Birch St. have been programmed for the upcoming years.



## BIRCH STREET WATERLINE IMPROVEMENTS

Located at the intersection of Birch St. and Kraemer Blvd., the project consisted of installing approximately 300 linear feet of steel pipe, fittings, valves, appurtenances, and the removal and replacement of a pressure regulating station. The project serves to complete the necessary improvements to the high-pressure water line at the intersection for the City's water system.

# Update of the City's Street Sweeping Program

The City is reinstating parking enforcement for its Street Sweeping Program. City streets are swept twice a month to minimize the accumulation of debris in roadways and along curbs. Sweeping also helps maintain the safety and cleanliness of City streets and significantly reduces pollution. The sweeper can more effectively clean when cars are not parked on the street. Warning citations for street sweeping violations began in September, with a two-month grace period. Citations will begin to be issued starting the week of November 3, 2025. Please note, this enforcement program is different from Overnight Parking Permits.

By keeping vehicles off the street during designated street sweeping days, residents help us keep Brea streets and storm drains clean and safe. In addition to properly cleaned

and maintained streets, street sweeping helps the City comply with mandates from the Environmental Protection Agency. Cities are required to monitor and reduce pollutants dispersed into the sewers, which lead to beaches and waterways. Failure to comply with the program puts the City at risk of being fined.

## 2026 Overnight Parking Permits

If you use on-street, overnight parking in Brea, be sure to order your new overnight parking permit for 2026. Without a visible 2026 parking permit beginning in January, vehicles can be cited if left on public streets between the hours of 2:00 a.m. - 6:00 a.m. Renewals and new permits are expected to be available in late 2025. 
## Be Water Smart!

Reminder, from October to April, watering in the City of Brea is limited to one day a week, on Wednesdays. By continuing to conserve water, you help protect and conserve the City's water supply.

- If the grass springs back when you step on it, there's no need to water.
- Water in the early morning or evening to minimize evaporation.
- Plant drought-resistant trees and plants, and place mulch around them to help retain moisture.





# Home Safety Tips During the Holiday Season

To keep you, your family, and your home safe this holiday season, the Brea Fire Department is sharing the following reminders.

## DECORATING TIPS

- **Designate a Decoration Spotter** – Whether hanging lights, garland, or attaching a large inflatable Santa Claus to your roof, make sure someone knows and is acting as a spotter, ready to take action if you suddenly fall.
- **Keep a First Aid Kit** – From the slip of a knife in the kitchen, to mishaps with scissors while wrapping presents, it's always a good idea to have a well-stocked first aid kit.
- **Purchase Safe Toys** – When it comes to gift giving, avoid choking hazards from small parts, button batteries, magnets, and other potentially dangerous but common features.
- **Keep the Floor Clear** – Kids, toys, packages, or bags can be tripping hazards if not seen.
- **Check Smoke Alarms** – Push the test button to make sure they are working.

## KITCHEN SAFETY TIPS

- **Stay in the Kitchen When Cooking** – Keep an eye on the food when cooking on the stove top.
- **Stay Inside Your Home When Cooking Your Turkey** – Make sure to check on it frequently.
- **Keep Children Away from the Stove** – The stove will be hot and kids should stay at least three feet away.
- **Keep Kids Away from Hot Food and Liquids** – Steam or splash from vegetables, gravy, or coffee could cause serious burns.
- **Keep Knives out of Reach from Children**
- **Make Sure Cords are out of Reach** – Electric cords from an electric knife, coffee maker, plate warmer, or mixer should not be dangling off counters and easily reached by a child.
- **Keep Matches and Utility Lighters up High** – They should be kept in a locked cabinet and out of children's reach.
- **Never Leave Children nor Animals Alone in a Room with a Lit Candle**
- **Keep these Turkey Frying Tips in Mind** – Do not overfill the fryer with oil. Submerge the turkey slowly in oil. Keep two feet of space between the propane tank and fryer burner. Keep an all-purpose fire extinguisher nearby and never use water to extinguish a grease fire.



# Holiday Shopping Safety

The City of Brea wants you to have a safe and cheerful holiday season. With increased shopping and travel over the next few months, please keep these tips from the Brea Police Department in mind.

- Lock It, Take It, Keep It. Theft from vehicles is highly reported during the holiday season. Do not leave items of value in the car, in plain view.
- Have packages delivered to a designated location you will be able to pick up right away.
- When shopping, only carry the amount of cash and credit cards needed.
- Park in well-lit, well-traveled areas and avoid being overloaded with packages.
- Don't place a purse in a shopping cart, leave a cell phone on a restaurant table, or leave a wallet on a counter when paying.
- Keep all doors and windows locked to decrease the chances of being burglarized.
- Put timers on interior and exterior lights.
- Be aware of surroundings. Do not be distracted in crowded areas, personal belongings are at risk.

# Update on BOUSD Measure H Bond & Activities

The summer of 2025 marked several important milestones for the Brea Olinda Unified School District (BOUSD) and the \$160 million Measure H Bond Program, approved by 64.55% of voters in November 2024. The District remains deeply grateful to the Brea community for its strong support and investment in BOUSD schools.

- In July, BOUSD's bond rating, Aa2, was reaffirmed by Moody's Investors Service. As stated in their July 30, 2025 release, this high-quality rating highlights the District's strong fiscal stewardship, the strength of Brea's local economy, and BOUSD's ongoing commitment to responsible, long-term infrastructure planning. The recognition also reflects the District's "strong financial position" and "demonstrated history of conservative budgeting and prudent financial management," allowing the District to manage public funds wisely while preparing for critical facility improvements across its campuses.
- In August, BOUSD successfully completed the sale of the District's General Obligation Bonds, Series A (\$40 million), attracting 12 competitive bidders, demonstrating the District's financial standing and high investor

confidence. Mesirow Financial submitted the winning bid with a True Interest Cost (TIC) of 4.695255%. As a result of a successful sale, the District minimized debt service and secured an overall repayment ratio of 1.93 to 1. The Bonds were structured to remain at or below the voter-approved tax rate of \$39 per \$100,000 of assessed value throughout the term of the bonds, while also preserving capacity for future bond issuances.

- Since its formation in early 2025, the Citizens' Oversight Committee (COC) has convened twice for regular quarterly meetings. The August meeting focused on reviewing Measure H Bond activities, including the first bond sale of \$40 million, project updates, such as geological testing at Brea Olinda High School, and financial review of 2024 Bond expenditures to date.

## Mayor's Youth Award




