Holiday Tree Disposal
Holiday trees will be collected and recycled Dec. 29-Jan. 9. When disposing of holiday trees, please observe the following guidelines.

- ✓ Remove tree stand along with all decorations.
- ✓ Cut up natural trees and place in brown yard waste container.
- ✓ If tree is over 6 feet in height, it can be cut in half and placed at curb.
- ✓ Trees in bags or with flocking are NOT recyclable. Cut and place in black trash container or, if extra large, schedule a bulky item pick-up.

Trash Collection
There is no pick-up on Nov. 27, Dec. 25 and Jan. 1. Then, for the remainder of those weeks, service is delayed by one day.

Street Sweeping
No sweeping — Nov. 27, Dec. 24-25, 31 and Jan. 1. (There will be a grace period for street sweeping parking tickets over the holidays.)



Winter Watering Reminder

Brea residents are to be commended for steps to reduce water consumption! On average each resident has reduced their daily usage by 11 gallons over the last month. Although overall city-wide consumption did increase, this is directly attributable to more than 1,000 additional new residents that now live here.

Improved conservation is anticipated from November to March, when Brea's winter restrictions are in effect. During that period, automated outdoor irrigation systems may only be run once each week.

To realize significant irrigation savings, consumers can take advantage of several rebate programs now being offered. Brea water customers could realize savings up to \$3 per square foot for turf replacement. There are also incentives to install smart timers that regulate automatic irrigation systems. Tracks at Brea Trail Construction



Construction of The Tracks at Brea trail is underway on the segment between Brea Blvd. and State College. Construction work began in early September to grade and remediate contaminates from previous years of railroad use on the property. This phase of construction is expected to be completed in January. In Spring of 2015, expect to see work begin for the paved bike trail, separate pedestrian pathway, and landscaping. This segment is expected to open to the public by the end of 2015.

Brea Earns "Best Practices" Spotlight Award from ILG



The Institute for Local Government and the Statewide Energy Efficiency Collaborative honored the City of Brea with a Beacon "Spotlight Award for Best Practices" due to the city's efforts to save energy, reduce greenhouse gas emissions and adopt policies and programs that promote sustainability.

Brea received recognition for implementing 42 varied sustainability activities such as:

- Adopting a water conservation ordinance;
- Authorizing a PACE option to provide financing for home energy solutions and efficiency upgrades
- Installing 1.8 megawatts of photovoltaic solar systems on three city sites

Last year, Brea reached the Platinum level in Spotlight's energy category, one of only seven cities statewide to do this so far. Brea realized a 30% energy savings. Only one other city exceeded that with a 31% savings.

The City of Brea remains driven to high performance standards to meet practical operational goals. Sustainability programs are adopted, not for recognition, but to more efficiently provide good services. However, it is gratifying to know that others recognize and appreciate the success of Brea's initiatives and look to it as a leader.

Brea Community Center Hosts Red Cross Shelter Drill

Brea was one of several county cities used for a recent Red Cross shelter activation drill. Shelter responders practiced setting up functional areas such as a dormitory, information lounge and dining hall. The regional fire scenario played out with responses also from auxiliary organizations including SCART (Southern California Animal Response Team) and FAST (Functional Assistance Service Team.)

Imperial Golf Lease

Council unanimously directed staff to amend Lease Agreement with Imperial Golf to allow for construction of a new clubhouse and to bring design and funding options back.

Downtown Liaison Police Officer

Approved the expenditure of Fiscal Year 2014-15 Supplemental Law Enforcement Services grant funds of \$100,000 toward the salary, benefits and overtime for the Liaison.

Completion Notice Fire Station 4

Accepted contract with Avi-Con dba CA Construction as complete for improvements at 198 Olinda Place, Olinda Village Shopping Center for the Fire Station 4.

Valencia Avenue Landscaped Median Improvements

Awarded contract to GMC Engineering, Inc., for \$935,529.45 from the Capital and Landfill Mitigation Improvements Fund 560 to install raised median curbs, landscaping, irrigation improvements, hardscaping with pavers, drain inlets with associated piping and curb ramp upgrades from Birch Street to Sandpiper Way.

Bond Proceeds

Approved a 1991b Bond Proceeds Funding Agreement Between the Successor Agency to the Brea Redevelopment Agency and the City and Taking Certain Related Actions, for \$700,000 to reimburse the City for costs provided for The Tracks at Brea Trail project

Adopted resolution as the Successor Agency to the Brea Redevelopment Agency, approving 1991B bond proceeds funding and related actions for \$700,000 to reimburse the City for costs provided for The Tracks at Brea Trail project.

Approved plans and specifications for Wildcat Way project to resurface existing asphalt pavement on Wildcat Way from Lambert Road to Brea Olinda High School driveway.

Appropriated \$52,000 from Project W and Measure M2 funds to the Capital Improvement Program Fund to install or replace transit shelters, benches, trash receptacles and amenities for Brea Mall Bus Stop Improvements.

57 Interchange Project Management

Increased the contract with AKAL Consultants by \$87,900 from Nexus Fund 540, and Federal and OCTA grant funds to provide additional project management services for Lambert Road and SR-57 Interchange Improvements Project.

Tracks Hazardous Removal

Approved loan agreement of \$350,000 and accepted federal grant and loan funds in the same amount through the Environmental Protection Agency's Revolving Loan Fund with a City match of \$70,000 from other grant funds for the removal of hazardous substances from Trail Project Segment 3.
