Quality, Professional Employees At Your Service in Brea

Whether you operate a business or run a private household, certain best practices guide your efforts; scheduling workload, doing maintenance routines and budgeting carefully. Best practices are also essential on a large scale to run an entire City. To execute, they require the best people. So, just who is working for you in Brea?

In a full-service city, the public expects much: public safety, quality streets, safe buildings, uninterrupted water and trash services, robust recreational activities, plus, social supports for seniors and others. Needless to say, wide-ranging professional skill sets, certifications and advanced degrees are required to deliver such varied services. Because everybody depends on reliable city operations, there is tremendous pressure for employees to consistently deliver. Take a few minutes to consider who is behind the scenes.

Professional Pride

It is universally acknowledged that police and fire personnel need targeted training. However, people don't realize how most all city positions require other relevant certifications or advanced educational degrees. With strict standards among public sector professionals, Brea residents can be assured that a quality staff is recruited.

In Brea, performance expectations will always remain high in order to meet civic needs. As an employer, the City has greatly benefited from the stability of many long-term employees, who commit to a career of loyal service. Current staff averages about 15 years on the job. Another very positive factor has been the high percentage of employees who are also residents; one in three. This creates an extra layer of built-in citizen oversight by those whose service within the organization is very personal. Success on the job reflects their own hometown.

Long ago, the City of Brea internalized two core values; customer service and a commitment to learning. With

ongoing City Council support, these attributes resulted in positive recognition for Brea as a leader in the world of governance. Although a smaller municipality, over the years Brea has garnered many achievement awards and employees have been elected to boards of professional associations.

A Closer Look

Before transparency and engagement became buzzwords, Brea was among the first in California to establish a website and use it, not only

for posting timely event information, but also budget reports and legal documents. As technology has evolved, so too the website's functionality, digital content and overall accessibility. Program detail is now readily available to the public, and social media channels also inform new audiences about city activities and emergency situations.

For more than three decades, the City has invited community participation to guide major transitions. The Downtown Charette, Future Brea, The Brea Project, and Imagine Brea might be memorable to long-time residents. Such outreach was augmented by other project-specific efforts such as budget workshops, the fire department review, the General Plan Advisory Committee and more recent citizen leadership teams to launch the Sports Park and the Brea War Memorial. Each of these represented strong citizen/employee collaboration.

Over the past decade, employees were early to alert the Council of pending recessionary pressures and then were quick to adapt for necessary changes as policy decisions were made. Brea voluntarily implemented pension reforms and increased employee contributions even before recent calls for such measures ramped up elsewhere. Also, the internal organization has been streamlined. From ten years ago, there are now 44 fewer full-time and 30 fewer part-time positions allocated. Executive directors have consolidated too, structured with only six rather than eight departments, and with Fullerton Fire command sharing. Outsourcing and shared services have also increased.

The public demands results and that's the bottom line. Brea employees are conscientious and professional in trying to meet high expectations. Careers in public service are rewarding when such challenges are met. Even with resources limited, Brea employees keep service at the forefront of their effort. Their contributions remain a critical component of Brea's high quality of life.

Capital Improvements Build A High Quality Brea

Your quality of life in Brea is very dependent upon smart management of Capital Improvement Projects. Almost \$19 million will be spent in the current budget year to assure streets are maintained, utilities are fully functional, traffic flows (*at least to limits of the City's ability to control it*) and facilities are upgraded.

As 2015 begins, several projects will be visible. Improvements to the greenbelt along Imperial Highway on the eastern border have recently been completed. A blighted strip of forgotten land was transformed into an attractive, useful, lighted and landscaped pathway. Medians along Valencia Avenue will soon add both aesthetics and traffic control along the west side of the growing La Floresta development to the Blackstone development. Work is soon to commence for utility upgrades in the alleys parallel to Brea Boulevard. Plus, remediation work and construction between Brea Boulevard and State College is quite active for the much-anticipated Tracks at Brea Trail.

Other important projects are rehabilitation of the heavily used Wildcat Way as just one piece of its street maintenance program. Brea continues a rigorous schedule even as some cities struggle to even keep their potholes filled.

Underground utilities here are also kept in good shape, with current water main and sewer improvements in process near Imperial and Berry.

City facility improvements are coming at the Civic & Cultural Center, where after more than three decades, much-needed updates will be made to ceiling grids, flooring and the interior of the City Council Chambers. This project will incorporate required ADA and audio-visual modernization components.

Brea's Public Works Department keeps a close watch on physical needs around the city. Engineers plan years in advance, not only to do necessary technical designs for any given project, but also to identify appropriate funding sources. Capital improvements are always expensive to implement. Funding streams can be rather complicated: development impact fees, gas taxes, Measure M or AQMD allocations, enterprise funds or grants. Preparing bid documents and administering contracts are also demanding tasks. Collaboration with relevant State and Federal agencies can become politically challenging in order to move ahead on certain

issues such as traffic controls. However, Brea's dedicated professionals always look ahead and prepare to maximize infrastructure for this busy community.

Brea's Community Services Staff Reaches Thousands

It's highly personal for the few dozen people working in the Brea Community Services Department. What they do involves human interaction. From tots to seniors, they present numerous programs that enhance daily life and help build connections.

Periodically, the Community Services staff evaluates its work by counting various service units delivered over the year. Although the emotional component of their work could never be quantified, simple numbers add up quickly to be quite impressive. This interesting summary attests to the vast reach of Brea Community Services programs for 2014.

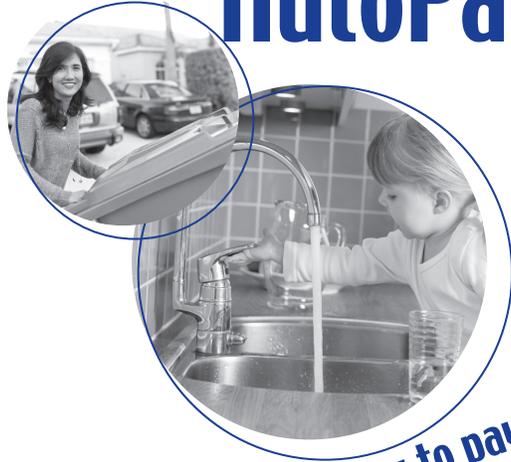

Civic Center Office Areas to Be Refreshed in 2015

After 34 years of heavy foot traffic, the Brea Civic & Cultural Center remains at the center of business. Public counters on Level 3 of the Civic Center have been renovated in the past year and in 2015 replacement carpeting will be installed in staff areas using a phased approach.

Plans for gradual and needed building improvements had been tied to the current budget. However, the March 2014 earthquake accelerated the timetable for implementation. Overhead ceiling grids fell or were bent with debris falling onto many work areas. New building codes, plus the unavailability of replacements for the original ceiling tiles, required that this project be done immediately. Now complete, there is a brighter and safer overhead surface.

There is a lot of coordination for departments to continue full operation while shuffling desks and files. But the finished result will be more in keeping with the building's contemporary architecture. A second project to update the City Council Chambers and modernize the broadcast system will be getting underway later in the year.

Brea Commissions Open Service Opportunities

Applications are due on Thursday, January 15, for consideration to fill openings on several Brea advisory groups. Terms are typically for service over a four year period with meetings about once each month. During the open period, residents are encouraged to apply for a position that is relevant to their interests and skill set.

The Planning Commission is part of the Community Development process and this panel is authorized to approve proposals and to issue variances as they work with City planning staff to assure that the built environment conforms to local standards.

The Parks, Recreation, and Human Services Commission works with the Community Services staff on programming recommendations for facilities and parks that meet needs for social, sports and recreation activities.

The Cultural Arts Commission works to enrich lives and expand learning by making local participation with the arts available to all.

The Traffic Committee reviews local circulation as well as traffic controls, speed limits and other issues related to both neighborhood and regional mobility.

Three positions are open for the Planning, Parks & Recreation, and Cultural Arts Commissions and two positions need to be filled for the Traffic Committee. An application can be found online. Submittals must be received at the City Clerk's office no later than 5:30 p.m. on Thursday, January 15. Applications will be reviewed by the City Council and interviews will then be set up, with appointments likely to be made by mid- February 2015.

Council to Appoint New City Treasurer

An unexpired term for Brea City Treasurer will be filled through an appointment process. The City Council will interview applicants and make a selection rather than hold a separate election that would carry high costs. 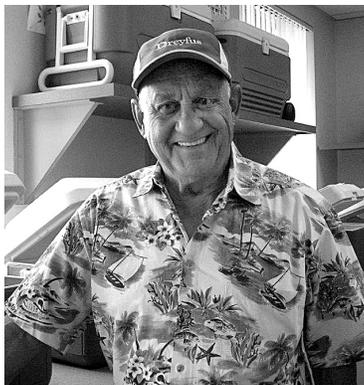
Description Of Responsibilities:

This is an elected position, which, because of a resignation, is being filled by appointment by the City Council. The City Treasurer is a member of the City's Investment Advisory Committee, participates in investment strategy discussions and reviews monthly and quarterly investment reports.

All applicants must be residents and registered voters within the City of Brea. The elected treasurer is required to file a Statement of Economic Interest pursuant to the Political Reform Act of 1974.

Desirable Qualifications:

A working knowledge of managing institutional portfolios, investments, and implementing sound fiscal strategies for the management of large sums of money, plus a bachelor's degree in business or finance is preferred.

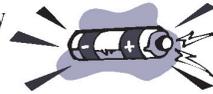
Get Ready For Emergencies and Pack Your Gear!

Each household and business needs to make the effort to become prepared. Having a plan and stocking up on supplies will add to your comfort and safety during an earthquake, fire or other emergency situation. Store enough supplies for at least 72 hours. Establish your options for evacuation and family communications. Identify an out-of-state point of contact.

Supplies Checklist

Essentials:

- Water – 1 gallon per person per day
- Water purification kit
- First aid kit freshly stocked
- First aid book
- Non-perishable foods
- Can opener (non-electric)
- Blankets or sleeping bags
- Portable radio, flashlight and batteries
- Essential medications
- Extra eyeglasses and keys
- Fire extinguisher – ABC type
- Cash and change
- Pet supplies
- Baby supplies – disposable diapers, wipes, formula, clothing, etc...



Cooking:

- Plastic knives, forks, spoons
- Paper plates and cups
- Paper towels
- Heavy-duty aluminum foil
- Camping stove for outdoor cooking (always check for gas leaks first)



Sanitation:

- Large plastic trash bags for waste; to use as tarps and rain ponchos
- Large trash cans
- Bar soap and liquid detergent
- Toothpaste and toothbrushes
- Shampoo
- Toilet paper
- Household bleach
- Feminine hygiene supplies



Tools and supplies:

- Axe, shovel, broom
- Adjustable wrench for turning off gas
- Tool kit with screwdriver, pliers and hammer
- Coil of 1/2" rope
- Plastic tape, staple gun and sheeting for window coverage
- Bicycle
- Maps



Safety and Comfort:

- Sturdy shoes
- Heavy gloves for clearing debris
- Candles and matches, light sticks
- Change of clothing
- Knife or razor blades
- Garden hose for siphoning or firefighting
- Tent
- Paper, pen, stamps
