
Parks Make Life Better!®

Ask anyone to describe what they like about California and they're sure to include the word outdoors. Recognizing that a hallmark of our lifestyle is outdoor enjoyment, the California Parks and Recreation Society (CPRS) is enlisting 525 agencies in the State to help raise awareness of the many benefits of public parks.

Whether it's a quiet individual moment on a bench near a garden, or a romp across an athletic field with a team of high-energy friends, local parks are important places where people relax and refresh. The City of Brea is fortunate to offer a collection of quality parks that host both everyday activities and seasonal special events. These locations are where countless memories are made!

Brea parks are safe, engaging places thanks to the joint efforts of the Community Services and Public Works Departments. Each of the City's 14 parks has its own personality. Here are a few highlights for your summer...

- **Arovista Park** – Brea Family Films is offered over summer months and allows families to come and watch Friday evening movies at no cost; the skatepark feature is popular all year long.
- **City Hall Park** – Houses the Brea Historic Museum and also the Brea Plunge, which is open during summer. Plus, it hosts Country Fair and Concerts in the Park series.
- **Country Hills Park and Founders Park** – Both feature public tennis courts tucked into residential neighborhoods.
- **Olinda Ranch Park** – Neighbors meet near a popular playground, picnic area and sports field.
- **Olinda Oil Museum and Trail** – Houses a two-mile loop trail and oil museum.
- **Sports Park** – Provides five fields for various sports user groups, a large shaded playground, and a .6 mile loop walking trail.
- **Tamarack Park** – A versatile sports field switches between baseball and soccer while the pick-up basketball court gets constant action.
- **Wildcatters and the Dog Park** – Contains sports fields, a playground and scenic walking areas. Across the street, bond with your canine in enclosed areas for either large or small dogs.

Park Spotlight—Olinda Oil Museum and Trail

The Olinda Oil Museum opened in 2003 and offers a look into early life in the town of Olinda, as well as oil operations artifacts. The City of Brea has preserved a vital part of local history by protecting a 12-acre historical park to recapture the sights, sounds, smells and the vital role Olinda played in the development of the area. The site includes: exhibits, a picnic area, and a loop trail to hike into the hills.

Olinda Oil Museum and Trail is located in the Olinda Ranch neighborhood at 4025 Santa Fe Road. Museum hours are Wednesdays from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. and Sundays from 12 to 4 p.m. where knowledgeable docents share stories, artifacts and facts about the site and early Olinda oil operations. The park is open daily from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. for individuals to walk the grounds or enjoy the two-mile loop trail. Group tours can be arranged by calling Sean Matlock at 714-671-4447.

Volunteer docents are needed to serve under the direction of the State Park Rangers. Docents give tours and staff the Field Office.



Resources: *This Summer, Using Less Means More*

Brea residents can be proud of past efforts and are thanked for a willingness to be good stewards of the environment. As summer 2015 approaches, even more must be done. Water supplies have dwindled and California's drought problem is severe. In light of the State emergency declaration, all must respond to a mandate for increased conservation.

Details for each water agency are still being established as Brea Line goes to press. Even without exact numbers, it is clear that a collective response is necessary from both residential and commercial sectors. The State Water Resources Control Board can levy fines that will hit all customers in a non-compliant utility. Conversely, there is a shared benefit when everyone participates.

Drought Response:

Through cooperative programs with the Municipal Water District of Orange County (MWDOC), water agencies in this region were credited with having achieved cutbacks. Even more work is underway to realize additional reductions.

Brea's Public Works Department manages the local water utility and made great strides in recent years to realize efficiencies in City

operations, which account for only a small percentage of the city's total consumption. With responsibility for 14 parks and 11 buildings, all heavily used by thousands on a daily basis, plus many street medians and civic edge areas, Public Works has a tough task. Retrofit projects

include installation of smart controllers, rotating nozzles, drip irrigation, recycled water delivery and turf replacement. These efforts help preserve public uses and serve as examples for others to adopt.

Public Works has also partnered with several local businesses who are stepping forward with significant water use efficiency updates. As these develop, Brea Line looks forward to sharing future success stories.

On the residential side, hundreds of people are successfully making changes on their properties. Controlled landscape irrigation is key to reduced consumption. Even after compliance with rules established in Brea's conservation ordinance, some homeowners may struggle to achieve savings unless they replace old irrigation system components or transition to California-friendly landscapes. Rebate programs through MWDOC help to offset costs. Currently, more Brea turf replacement projects are in the pipeline for approvals than have already been completed.

This indicates a strong response on the part of local homeowners.

The City of Brea will continue to provide updated information about water mandates as new requirements are clarified at the State level.

The City Council will likely adopt stricter rules so that Brea does its part and avoids fines. Please keep up your good work and encourage friends and neighbors who still may be adapting.

Energy Reminders:

Summer heat boosts the demand for electricity. Get ready to offset higher bills with smarter habits. Go to the Southern California Edison website sce.com and select Home or Business from the lower panel. You can gather lots of tips for saving electricity and learn about current rebate programs that help you save on upgrades.

Brea's Energy Efficiency and Solar Power Project continues to be a wise investment. As the City reaches the four year mark, solar PV systems at three civic locations are performing well and delivering real savings. Energy generated by these systems is over 10,000 kilowatt hours; enough to power 300 homes. The cumulative project effect has mounted to be about 24% beyond original projections. A recent report shows almost \$3 million in reduced energy expense from what it might have cost had the City done nothing.

Art in Public Places Excursion Enjoyed by Seniors and Teens

In April, participants from the Brea Senior Center and the Student Advisory Board came together in a planned inter-generational outing for a fun and educational tour of Brea's Art in Public Places program.

The tour, provided by art piece specialist Trinitee Manuel, took 17 seniors and 8 teenagers to learn about several sculptures at the Brea Civic Center, Olen Pointe Business Park, and the Brea Olinda High School aboard the Brea Trolley.

Along the way, the group learned about several key art pieces and gained a greater appreciation for what Brea has to offer with regards to its vast collection of public art pieces. After the tour concluded, the group enjoyed a leisurely lunch at Coco's Bakery before saying their goodbyes.

This tour provided more than just insight to Brea's extensive public art collection. The excursion allowed for a growing sense of fellowship between generations which normally have limited interaction.

Construction Coming for Brea Senior Center

The Brea Senior Center will undergo several parking lot and entryway enhancement beginning in mid-May. Federal grant funding through the Community Development Block Grant program was received for handicap accessibility improvements as well as a dedicated passenger loading and unloading area for the Senior Shuttle program. The Brea Rotary Club is also sponsoring the construction of a covered seating area and a flag pole for the new Senior Shuttle Station.

The Senior Center will remain open with all programs and services available throughout the construction period. To expedite work, drivers need to be attentive and courteous to the neighborhood. Please stay clear of the corner at Sievers Avenue. Senior Center visitors should park in designated spaces to the south of the Center along the border of Arovista Park. A safe, sidewalk approach will stay open from that side. You may call 714-990-7750 for more information.

Budget Process Underway

Preparation continues on budget documents for the 2015-16 Fiscal Year. The City Council will have a study session on May 18 and then anticipates a public hearing at the June 16 City Council meeting. Budget information is posted for review under the Administrative Services Department section at cityofbrea.net. Highlights of the adopted budget will be included within the July-August issue of Brea Line.



Property Assessed Clean Energy (PACE) is a financing option available to business and residential property owners in Brea to fund onsite energy efficiency and water saving improvements. PACE loans are repaid twice a year through a property tax bill assessment and interest on the loan is tax deductible.

Brea now has two PACE programs available: HERO and CaliforniaFIRST. Property owners can compare the interest rates and details of the two programs by visiting their websites or calling them.

During the time Dr. Skip Roland held the reins of the District's top job he also found himself dealing with the aftermath of flood, fire and earthquake. He retires this year.
