

Behind the Scenes Volunteer Work Generates Fun Times for Brea

Everybody likes to have a good time! Especially at popular annual Special Events that have become part of Brea's cultural landscape. Before these happen it takes a lot of behind-the-scenes hard work to deliver celebrations that bring people together for fun.

Summer's party season gets in high gear with the July 4th Country Fair at City Hall Park. A volunteer steering committee meets beginning in February to handle details. This group represents a number of local non-profits who make a six-month commitment to help with the event.

In August, Brea Fest takes over the Civic Center, plus a side street, to accommodate all the food, music and activities. While Country Fair fills daytime hours, Brea Fest lights up the night with



dining, dancing, displays and performances. Booths must be set-up and decorated, tickets collected and thousands of people greeted. It's one big party and this event requires the support of about 100 volunteers!

Other notable Special Events are several Craft Boutiques, a Jewelry & Accessories Show and the Wellness Festival at the Brea Community Center. The Senior Center also hosts periodic celebrations. Back at the Civic & Cultural Center, a holiday tree-lighting ceremony closes out each year. All of these events benefit from the assistance of volunteers who work hard for a share in the happiness they generate.

In addition to volunteers, in-kind donations are essential for staging various events. Local businesses have provided goods and services or outright sponsored various activities. Local churches and service groups, such as Rotary, Kiwanis, Lions, and Soroptimists often step up to offer manpower or monetary donations. New Budget Provides Balance and Funds Progress for Brea

Reflecting Brea's solid fiscal foundation, the budget is once again balanced for FY 2015-16. The General Fund \$52 million budget reflects both operating revenues and expenditures. Following a prolonged recession, City revenues are projected at 3.3% higher due to increasing sales and property taxes. It is also noteworthy that the City retains a healthy reserve of more than 30% of annual expenditures.

Long ago Brea adopted fiscally conservative policies and the City Council has often been asked to make tough strategic decisions. Over time, a series of good actions and solid management allowed for progress even through difficult periods. Keys to balancing this year's new budget include; maintaining relatively flat expenditures, utilizing innovative methods to maintain core services, plus some overall improved economic factors.

A major project in the coming fiscal year will be implementation of a community engagement effort. Values identified through "Envision Brea" will also guide future budget priorities. This comprehensive outreach process will help chart Brea's future and can provide useful information for a required General Plan mid-term review and updates to certain Plan elements, the Parks, Recreation, and Human Services Master Plan and will apply to a Cultural Arts Master Plan.

Difficult choices are ahead to prioritize and allocate available funds for several identified needs. These include: a downtown east-side parking structure, enhancements to Lagos de Moreno Park, water conservation projects and discretionary payments to CalPERS.

A major uncertainty remains whether or not the State Department of Finance (DOF) will approve certain expenditures. The City is hopeful that it can reclaim and use its 2011 bond proceeds, taken by the State in dissolution of Redevelopment Agencies, to eventually reimburse expenditures related to "The Tracks at Brea" and proceed with previously identified projects such as the downtown parking structure and a proposed new Birch Hills community facility.

No new full-time positions are proposed in this budget. Employees continue to contribute toward their retirement with those hired after July 1, 2011, covering 100% of the employee cost. Other current miscellaneous employees are paying approximately 65% of the employee costs. The City's goal is to eventually have all employees contributing the full cost per pension reform legislation.

Major General Fund purchases will include replacement of radios which are backbone equipment for Police, Fire, and Public Works. This would be financed over a multi-year term.


A separate Capital Improvement Project (CIP) Budget was also approved by the City Council. This \$29 million budget covers 45 projects identified for the FY 2015-16 period. These projects relate to infrastructure improvements and major project funding does include a mix of City money with County, State and Federal taxes, plus various grants.



Property Assessed Clean Energy Benefits Brea Owners

PACE (Property Assessed Clean Energy) is financial assistance lending for property owners to install upgrades for renewable energy, water conservation and energy efficiency. Solar, cooling systems, lighting improvements, water pumps, insulation, and landscaping are just a few examples of improvements that can be covered under PACE.



PACE financing is unique in that it authorizes you to pay for energy efficient expenses as a line item on a property tax bill. This gives owners the benefit of not paying upfront costs, reaping tax exemptions, and obtaining State energy credits. A benefit for cities is that it helps meet climate action plan objectives required by the state to address climate change. The program has flourished in California, with many other states following suit. To date, PACE has yielded an estimated 31,300 projects totaling \$626 million in the residential market and 330 projects totaling \$112 million.

Brea City Council has approved two different PACE programs that are now options available to Brea property owners. HERO has been operating in Brea for slightly longer than a year, already completing 70 projects totaling \$1,753,930. CaliforniaFIRST, which was just approved in April, is working on a variety of energy-saving measures at the Brea Mall.

After 35 Years, Brea City Council Chamber Gets Makeover

Since 1980, public meetings of the Brea City Council, the Brea Planning Commission, and the Brea Olinda Unified School District Board have taken place in the original Council Chamber on level one of the Brea Civic & Cultural Center. In the early years after the building was dedicated it was considered a state-of-the-art room. However, new digital technologies and enhanced building codes eventually required that changes be made.

A comprehensive overhaul is underway with completion anticipated by summer's end.

The circular seating footprint will stay the same with an accessible section reconfigured to comply with the American Disabilities Act. The entire audio-visual system is being upgraded to current standards with a new control room for operation of cameras and microphones. Finally, the interior décor will be fresh and modern once the project is complete.


This important location will soon be ready to host a new chapter of Brea's history over the next decades.

Schools Administration Re-Sets As Students Enjoy Summer Vacation

After graduation and promotion ceremonies, students quickly disperse for vacation. While there is a pause in the action on campuses, there is no slowdown in administrative offices. Summer is time to hit the re-set button on business matters.

The \$55 million budget for the Brea Olinda Unified School District promises some relief from recent tight years. There was some growth in Proposition 98 funding due to significant increases in State revenue. The State is also offering repayment on some prior year mandates that is welcome "one-time" money. Although support has improved, a gap remains in the Local Control Funding Formula or LCFF. The new budget for BOUSD does provide some salary increases and projects that include roof repairs at multiple sites, concrete work at Brea Olinda High School, and a variety of asphalt repair projects throughout the District.

Over the summer months, BOUSD administrative staff is helping Dr. Brad Mason settle in as its new superintendent. He brings strong skills from earlier service in the Redlands Unified School District where he served

as Assistant Superintendent for Business Services after a stint as its Human Resources Director. Prior to that, he held various positions at different school sites in roles as principal and teacher dating back to 1990. Anne Flesher will provide valuable continuity and context for him in her continuing role as Assistant Superintendent for Human Services. They will be joined by Jean Aldrete, as the new Assistant Superintendent/Business Services to complete the leadership team.

Before ramping up for the next academic year, it is fitting to bask in highlights from the close of the recent session. Brea Olinda High school graduated 473 seniors in the Class of 2015. This outstanding group garnered a collective \$5,664,261 in college scholarship awards. They also were active in community service as well, represented with 40 seniors earning the Brea Mayor's Youth Award after donating almost 9,000 hours to local non-profits. Brea Canyon High school graduated 26 students.

Arovista Elementary School was selected for recognition by Campaign for Business and Education Excellence. The school was named a Scholar School on the California Honor Roll for high performance and its focus on academic success.

All of Brea's schools are to be commended for another year of achievements. This summer recess is a welcome time to refresh for the next school year!

The Tracks at Brea Trail Receives Additional EPA Funding



Twenty-seven grants for The Tracks at Brea trail have been awarded to date; and grant funding for this project has surpassed \$15 million! The entire four-mile trail will run east/west through the City and is being constructed in six segments as grant funding is received.

Over 100 years of railroad activity on the trail property has resulted in the requirement of soil cleanup prior to any trail construction. Most recently, the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) has generously awarded another \$600,000 for soil cleanup, bringing the total EPA grant support for this project to \$2,666,085.

This summer, construction of the trail will begin on the segment between Brea Boulevard and State College Boulevard. Primarily funded by the EPA, the soil cleanup and rough grading were completed earlier this spring for this segment.

While it has taken years of work to obtain funding for land acquisition, soil remediation and construc-

tion, soils testing and analysis, design engineering and community outreach, groundbreaking progress is now visible on yet another trail segment and staff is continuously applying for additional grant funding.
