Outdoor Irrigation: Your ONE Day Is Now Monday

Brea is operating under Phase 2 of its water conservation ordinance in order to be compliant with the state-wide drought declaration. Between November 1 through March 31, 2016, outdoor irrigation may ONLY occur once weekly on the designated day — MONDAY.

Another provision of the conservation ordinance is that no outdoor watering is permitted within 48 hours following measurable rain. Therefore, should rain occur over a weekend, you need to skip that Monday and wait another week before running the next irrigation cycle.

Property owners must adjust their automated sprinkler systems to reflect current scheduling limitations.

Furthermore, each station on a system is restricted to no more than 15 minutes of total operating time on the irrigation day. To maximize absorption of available water, a “cycle and soak” method is recommended for deeper roots and healthier plants. Set two shorter run times in the early morning, spaced at least an hour apart. Review the online instructional video link at cityofbrea.net/water. As always, sprinklers never can run between 10 a.m. and 4 p.m.

The current drought requires sacrifice from all. Each person can share in the solution through reduced use and careful practices.

Water Report Card Highlights Savings Superstars

In recent months, a notable group of community partners have made big changes to cut down on their outdoor irrigation. These cutbacks have been essential as the City of Brea strives to meet its State-mandated reduction level of 24% as compared to 2013 usage.

Here are some comparative reductions from several large scale users who made significant impacts for Brea's August report:


- Suzuki - 80%
- Craig Park - 78%
- City of Brea, parks and landscaping - 50%
- Brea Olinda Unified School District - 40%
- Lake Park Brea - 36%

In general, most of Brea's residential customers also achieved very worthy savings even though the challenge mounts in this category. Taking into account the recent growth Brea has experienced, the City's GPCPD (gallons per customer per day) dropped by 31 from two years ago. The cumulative residential savings since the State's mandate is at 25% for the past four months. Gratitude is due to all who have made effective efforts!

Going forward, more is still being expected for the City's reporting to the State — particularly from those who have not been diligent in participation so far. Even with so much prior good work, the toughest cuts are ahead. Normal winter usage is always much lower than in summer months. Thus, the comparison baseline against which the State measures is a lower starting point. It will require great discipline to hit the expected reduction percentage while still meeting essential needs from a smaller amount of water as the initial supply. Unfortunately, fines of \$10,000 per day could possibly be levied if Brea fails to comply.

California's drought is indeed everyone's problem. Therefore, it is only fair that everyone participates in the solution. Again, thanks to the many Brea homeowners and businesses who are taking the drought seriously and making meaningful change in their consumption patterns.

Wipes Clog Pipes!

Disposable hygiene wipes have become increasingly popular. Likewise, these are an increasingly common source of sewer blockages. Even those labeled "flushable" do not actually break down once in a sewer system. Inside your pipes, over time these tend to cling along sidewalls creating eventual blockages. Resulting back-ups can occur anywhere along

that line and present health and environmental risks.

In recent years, significantly more maintenance has been tied to this product category. Costs are being incurred by individual property owners as well as wastewater collection operators. Be cautious if wipes are being used in your home or business. Choose an alternate disposal method to avoid a nasty surprise. Wipes go into the trash, not the toilet!

Brea Energy Efficiency and Solar Power Project Continues to Impress

The solar panel arrays seen at several City facilities are producing well in excess of the original estimates for the Brea Energy Efficiency and Solar Power Project. Since construction was completed, the Measurement & Verification phase has been on-going. The amount of solar energy produced at each of the three City sites is continually quantified against original projections.

The principal financial benefit Brea will realize is reduced overall energy use and more favorable rates on what is used during the 25-year project lifespan. But in addition, the State Of California has also been paying the City 32 cents per kilowatt hour for the solar energy produced under their California Solar Initiative program. These are direct payments over the first five years of this project. Brea's solar systems have consistently exceeded estimated production and have earned more than the projected CSI income.

At the four-year mark, Brea has received \$3.6 million in CSI payments, which is \$482,636 above the estimate. Plus, the kilowatt hour production is about 1.5 million kWh above the 10 million estimate. Impressive!

Don't Delay Making El Niño Preps

While enduring a record-breaking drought, parallel preparations are underway to withstand potential damage from a forecasted El Niño winter.

El Niño conditions will not eliminate the current widespread drought problem. Although any new rain is welcome, it may only provide temporary relief in a limited area. Unless quality snowpack is captured in California's northern Sierra Mountain range, the State continues to lack adequate long-term water storage. Presently, there is no method to capture and redirect any volume of water that might be produced from an El Niño in the southern part of the state.

Currently, a City of Brea workgroup is planning for the potential negative effects of heavy winter storm surges. Public Works has checked equipment and stocked supplies that may be needed. Watershed areas and catch basins have been cleared. Planners are mapping low spots in local terrain. First responders refreshed training related to flooding, mudslide and rescue. Everyone's focus is good preparation should weather conditions turn into an emergency situation.

You should prepare too! Here are some steps you can take.

1. Inspect your structure, especially roof covering, flashings and vents. Make needed repairs.
2. Clear all gutters, downspouts and drains.
3. Remove debris, dead brush and objects such as wood piles that may become obstructive.
4. Stock up your emergency supplies and review evacuation options.
5. Check on the status of your home flood insurance coverage.
6. Be sure to turn off sprinklers when it rains!

For a more complete checklist go to cityofbrea.net/preparedness. If you find yourself in need of sandbags, free ones are available at all fire stations and the City Service Center. There is a 10 bag limit per residence and while supplies last.

Brea City Council Honors Suzuki with a Green Life, Green Brea Award



The latest "Green Life, Green Brea" recognition celebrates conservation efforts and sustainable practices by Suzuki Motor Corporation. Mark Eastman, Vice President of Operations, and Roland "Tai" Taitano, Manager of Administrative Services accepted the award at a recent City Council meeting.

Suzuki team conducted one of the largest turf removal projects in the State in effort to save a significant quantity of water.

The project removed roughly 298,760 square feet of turf, which filled 75 truckloads. In its place, Suzuki installed 3,000 tons of decomposed granite and planted over 8,600 drought tolerant trees, shrubs, and ground cover plants. With the help of their landscape contractor, JW Construction and Landscape, and landscape designer Finer Landscape, Suzuki was able to reduce water usage by 70%. This project is now saving about 700,000 gallons of water per month!

Their "green" thinking and achievements has earned them the prestigious "Green Life, Green Brea" Award, which was presented at the City Council meeting on October 20.

The Green Life, Green Brea Award recognizes Brea businesses and organizations for exemplary achievement in energy and water conservation, and other measures showing a high level of environmental stewardship. The City created this award to help promote, inspire, and recognize sustainable practices by Brea businesses.

Suzuki Motor of America, Inc. has been a landmark in Brea since 1980 when they opened their corporate headquarters at the corner of Imperial Highway and Valencia Avenue. Currently, President Tak Hayasaki and a team of 162 employees work at the Brea location. Suzuki is an international company well known for distributing motorcycles and outboard motors. This year the

Brea Prepares for Upcoming Development Activity

Even as building continues around town, downtown is ramping up again and Brea's professional development staff is busy preparing for the next wave of construction.

- Owners of the highly successful Improv are looking to Brea for their newest concept to be built at the site of the current Old Navy store. This would include an expanded space for comedy headliners, other live performances and expanded dining options. The Planning Commission hearing is likely in the first quarter of 2016.
- A downtown parking garage will be constructed on the east side of Brea Boulevard. Years ago, a third garage had been conceptualized and funding was initiated, however, when the State of California pulled redevelopment funds, this project had to be put on hold. The City worked to convince Sacramento to return funds committed prior to the dissolution of redevelopment and after four years, recent State legislation has achieved that goal. The Council revived this project by approving a "not to exceed" budget and a bid package is being prepared and contractor pre-qualifications are underway.
- Also near downtown, Trailview Townhomes have been approved and are into construction. This project includes thirteen for-sale multi-family units at the north end of Orange Avenue. The architectural treatment will open onto a center segment of the Tracks at Brea Trail.
- Plans are being prepared for a new residential project on Birch Street and State College Boulevard. The project includes multi-story residential units, retail on the ground floor and improvements to the two existing commercial office buildings. On the east side of the street a plan for a new hotel is being designed.
- The Imperial Center East shopping center is getting an update. The mattress shop is moving to the far west end of the center and Trader Joe's will be expand-

ing operations. Changes to the parking lot and traffic signal will help to ease traffic flow into this vibrant shopping area.

- Industrial development continues at a steady pace with construction of a new 367,000 square foot industrial building at 1225 West Imperial Highway. No tenant is yet slated, but the building can accommodate a warehouse/distribution operation or a manufacturing operation. Another new 215,000 square foot industrial building will be constructed at 3300 East Birch Street.
- Portions of the La Floresta commercial center including two dynamic new restaurants, at Imperial and Valencia are anticipated to open in December, with the anchor store, Whole Foods Market, coming online around February. *Oasis*, a prominent new piece for Brea's Art in Public Places collection is taking shape at the perimeter of the public plaza of La Floresta.

School improvement is a constant goal for the Brea Olinda Unified School District. A recent article entitled, *Envisioning Schools of the Future*, highlights the rapid pace of change in education and the need for modernization. In planning for such a journey, school administrators included the school community to help create a road map of sorts. With a nod to the AAA "TripTik" mobile travel planner, Superintendent Dr. Brad Mason was guided by its basic questions: "Where are you?" and "Where are you going?"

The District's outreach included parents, teachers, civic and business communities to see what Brea values for its students and schools. Through hundreds of surveys he collected, a number of priorities emerged. One particularly strong theme was modernization. Although steps had been taken over time to modernize some District facilities; much more needs to be done with aging schools in preparation for providing the environment necessary to launch our children into the future.

Most schools are built as "State of the Art" at the time in which they are built. The problem is they are

constructed for what is known and not for the time that is coming. It is not uncommon to have older classrooms built for an electrical load that only required two to four things being plugged in at the same time. In today's digital world, this is clearly insufficient!

General facility modernization and improvements are necessary throughout the Brea Olinda Unified School District. Additional specialized needs also exist to provide 21st century classrooms outfitted with critical technology to allow students to fully engage with current math, science and technology offerings found in the most rigorous and updated curricular programs.

The destination is not quite set, but the District is making new travel plans. You can expect to hear more about some exciting possibilities for the future and how you can join in supporting the journey!

08-18-2015

Centennial Celebration Committee

Council directed staff to provide specific skill sets for committee members to make sure they match criteria and agreed that the core group should include the Mayor and a former Council Member.

Nomination Process for Cal Domestic Water Company Board Member

City Attorney Markman announced that a seat on the Cal Domestic Water Company (CDWC) Board of Directors was up for re-appointment. Council directed staff to provide a list of desirable qualifications to consider when selecting a new candidate for nomination to the CDWC Board. Council Members Hupp and Parker were appointed to a selection sub-committee to recommend potential candidates.

Downtown Superblock Parking Structure

Council directed staff to bring the item back and to eliminate the mixed-use option.

Rooftop Solar

Council approved introduction of an Ordinance for a streamlined permitting process for small residential rooftop solar energy systems.

Compensation Plan

Amended compensation plan for part-time classifications and benefits policy

Easement Acceptance

Approved the maintenance and restoration agreement and public sidewalk easement at 1225 W. Imperial Highway.

Environmental Assessment

Approved a professional service agreement with ICF Jones & Stokes, Inc. for preparation of an environmental assessment for proposed entertainment venue alternatives.

Change Order

Amended the Professional Services Agreement with David Evans and Associates, Inc. for additional scope of design services and construction administration for the Tracks at Brea, in an amount not to exceed \$381,430.

08-25-2015 Special Meeting Recap

Proposed Water Rate Structure

Sudhir Pardiwala, Project Manager for Raftelis Financial Consultants, Inc. presented a PowerPoint that included: the Draft Financial Plan; Cost of Service Analysis; Proposed Water Rates; and Next Steps. Mr. Pardiwala clarified that Council would like the item to be brought back and noted that he will provide the differentiated water supply only, showing 3 and 4 tiers.

Approved the professional services agreements for annual on-call as needed civil engineering services for various capital improvement projects.


OpenGov Web Tool Offers Easier Budget Access

In a continued effort to provide transparency and access to information, the City of Brea has launched a web-based platform to display the City's financial information. To accomplish this, the City partnered with OpenGov, a company used by a number of local governments throughout the nation, to view current and historical annual budgets and actuals, including year-to-date departmental budget-to-actual performance.

For years this City has made its annual budget, and other financial information available to the public by posting it on its website. With the addition of OpenGov, the financial data now includes charts, graphs, and other features to make the budget information even more user friendly. Sortable data on the City's revenues and expenditures from the five most recent years are available for review from a desktop computer or mobile device.

Brea Community Emergency Council — Feed Your Holiday Spirit!




