Activities Intersect at Brea Senior Center

May is Older Americans Month across the nation. Seniors are served year around at the Brea Senior Center with a whirl of activities that fill all the available space. Some people pursue crafts, others may play a game or make music, while still others attend a class or participate in a fitness activity. It's always possible to be learning or be entertained - or both!

Weekday lunches are about socializing with friends over a nutritious meal. Off-site outings are frequently scheduled for nearby shopping or cultural attractions. There are monthly celebrations and presentations on health or finances. An attentive staff coordinates all the comings and goings while constantly developing new program opportunities.



The Senior Mobility Program fills a gap between scheduled public bus service and private transportation. The Orange County Transportation Authority helps participating cities tailor a flexible program. Using available Measure M2 funding and City matching funds, a daily shuttle service brings seniors to the Center. Brea's trolley is also used for community shopping or other outings.

In addition, qualifying low-income seniors can apply for discounted cab rides to medical appointments and such.

Good food is the foundation of lasting friendships at Brea's Senior Center. A secret recipe for success over the past seven years is Chef Francesco La Torre. Starting as a volunteer, he worked in the kitchen and prepared occasional meals that had people taking notice. Now as an employee he has daily responsibility for the lunch program. Plus, twice monthly he prepares special "food to go" orders so seniors can enjoy good eating over their weekends. Chef Francesco expanded his service to seniors by teaching cooking classes. And last Christmas a special holiday meal was packaged and sent out with extra TLC through the Home Delivered Meals program. As an extra thanks during volunteer recognition week, he arranged a "to go" surprise for drivers.

State of the City Presentation Lists Highlights

An annual “State of the City” report updates members of the Chamber of Commerce and Brea staffers on highlights of the prior year. It is a good summary of recent projects so that everyone can stay in sync going forward.

No evidence was needed to prove what all have observed: the City of Brea is experiencing a real growth spurt. The City now has over 43,000 residents in about 17,000 households. Over 5,000 businesses are based here with hundreds more pulling licenses for routine deliveries or other services to customers located within city boundaries. The added population and commercial activities contribute to increased prosperity, but also impact traffic and increase public sector service expectations.

Current construction has been at a steady pace. New development is concentrated at La Floresta to the east, Central Park Village on the west, and upcoming is a proposal for Hines Brea Place near the Brea Mall and Brea Marketplace shopping centers. Downtown will be getting a third parking structure. Work has already begun by Caltrans to do upgrades to the existing ramps at Lambert and the 57 Freeway.

The City continues to upgrade recreational spaces, most recently opening a new segment of the Tracks at Brea Trail. Last year Birch Hills Golf Course was re-opened to the public. Plans are in process for a new Lagos De Moreno playground.

Brea displays pride in volunteerism with the recent Love Brea service day, the ongoing Hands-On program coordinated by the Family Resource Center, hundreds of Community Emergency Response Team trainees and monthly outreach to homeless persons through a police/public collaboration with the Coast to Coast non-profit.

Looking ahead, the current Brea Envisions outreach will help to build on a strong financial foundation to prepare for coming decades. While growth may slow, community needs will continue and resources will have to be managed accordingly.

Water Conservation Challenge Extends Into Summer

In the face of tough State of California mandates to reduce water consumption by 24%, thousands of Brea residents and a number of sharp businesses rose to the challenge and made cutbacks. California’s new normal will require that these good habits adopted over the recent period of severe drought must continue. None can waste a drop until the statewide water system has been upgraded to a point that local water agencies can be assured of more reliability.

Unfortunately, due to an exceptionally hot month of February, Brea fell short of its overall goal despite earlier promising results. At this juncture, California water regulators are taking another hard look at the numbers and thus far have held back on punitive measures such as fines. In the meantime, agencies have been ordered to adjust how they manage their increasingly valuable water commodity. This includes developing fair and accurate rates.

Most people are comfortable with the “new normal” for indoors... use of low-flow devices and restrictive times. A reduction in outdoor irrigation will be particularly effective going forward. With hundreds moving into California-friendly plant choices, an interesting new landscape trend begins. As a friendly reminder, these rules are firm for all times of the year no matter the plant palate:

- Never water outdoors between the hours of 10 a.m. and 4 p.m.
- Sprinklers may never run for longer than 15 minutes per station.
- No runoff may flow onto paved surfaces or into storm drains.

Be Aware: Coyote Sightings in the Area; Stay Informed to Protect Your Pets

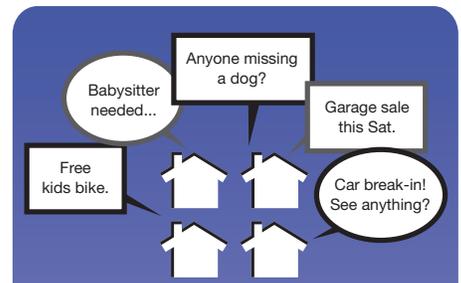
Increased coyote sightings in lowland areas have been reported. Drought conditions are partly to blame, along with the destruction of habitat and a reduced fear of human contact. There is no quick solution for nuisance urban coyotes.

Generally a reclusive animal, which prefers to avoid human contact, coyotes in wild land interface areas such as Brea, can become predators of opportunity in search of food and water. Coyotes are extremely adaptable and can lose their natural fear of humans and become more aggressive when they find convenient food sources. Never leave pet food or garbage outdoors for these scavengers to enjoy. Feed your pets indoors. Trash container lids must be tightly closed—it's time for another bin if yours has overflowed. Fallen fruit and standing water can also be invitations for coyotes. Keep yards free of potential shelter for them...thick brush or patio decking with open bottoms. Coyotes can easily jump fences, or even dig under them, so never leave pets unattended outdoors. All children should be taught from an early age to avoid strange animals whether domestic or wild. Never attempt to feed a wild animal.

As a wild animal, coyotes are under the purview of the Department of Fish and Wildlife. Attacks should be reported as soon as possible following the incident to the Ontario office of the Department of Fish and Wildlife at 909-484-0167. If you observe a coyote in the act of attacking a human or pet, please call 911. For more information visit the Department of Fish and Wildlife website.

Brea Olinda USD Seeks Input for Accountability Plan

It's that time of year again. In order to receive funding from the state of California, every school district is required to complete a Local Control and Accountability Plan (LCAP). The LCAP describes how a school district intends to meet annual goals for all pupils, with specific actions that address state and local educational priorities.



In other words, the LCAP details how money will be spent to meet the needs of students. The Brea Olinda Unified School District (BOUSD) is required to seek stakeholder input prior to writing the plan. As such, over the next few months, the district

will issue a survey to parents, educators and community groups to evaluate the 2015-2016 LCAP, and to refine and establish goals designed to create a dynamic learning environment for all Brea students.

The LCAP will provide a three-year snapshot aligning the district's vision with its expenditures. It is divided into five main sections, each of which details specific actions aligned with the BOUSD strategic plan and the California areas of emphasis. After the district gathers input, an initial draft of the plan will be shared with the Board of Education, and additional revisions will be made as needed. The final plan is due to the state by June 30, 2016. Brea residents are encouraged to get involved with local schools to share thoughts about how to best meet the diverse needs of students. Approved amendment for professional legal services between the City of Brea and Richards, Watson & Gershon, Inc. to comply with the Attorney General's legal opinion regarding compensation limits for bond counsel services.

Tracks Design Services

Approved amendment to the Professional Services Agreement with David Evans and Associates, Inc. to provide additional design services and construction administration for The Tracks at Brea trail project in an amount not to exceed \$58,700.

Environmental Services Agreement

Approved a Professional Services Agreement with Kimley-Horn for preparation of an environmental assessment of a proposed mixed-use development.

Water Easement
