Centennial Celebration Planning Begins



Brea will officially hit the century mark on February 23, 2017. There have been several reports to City Council about planning that is underway. As a countdown for the birthday year begins, it is already evident that celebrations will multiply throughout 2017. The Brea Centennial Steering Committee is a mix of citizens representing various community organizations, along with City staff liaisons.

Subcommittees are forming for several new very special events, including a parade and picnic, history tours, exhibits, shows and a fall gala. Several new cultural arts happenings will reflect highlights from the past. Other favorite annual events on Brea's busy social calendar will echo the centennial theme. Plus, non-profit community groups have indicated early interest in boosting 100th birthday awareness as they calendar their own annual events. As 2017 dates fill in, the official Centennial logo will begin to appear in many places. There will be opportunities for sponsorships and community involvement to execute Centennial events.

More information will be shared as details firm up. Once events take shape, there will be specific needs for event volunteers, funding and in-kind support. A dedicated City webpage, cityofbrea.net/centennial, will relay ongoing updates.

Brea War Memorial



Annual Budget Supports Projects, Reflects Priorities

The Brea City Council reviewed and approved the Fiscal Year 2016-17 Budget at their June 21 meeting. The annual budget is the financial plan to guide all spending consistent with a fiscally conservative organizational policy. This has served the City well over several decades, even in volatile economic times.

Brea's new budget maintains relatively flat expenditures by utilizing innovative methods to sustain core City services. It also reflects a generally improving economic outlook. Population growth has been at a strong and steady pace for several years as residents are added and new neighborhoods approach build-out. While this creates new opportunity, it also brings increased service demands.

Currently, the City is underway with a major outreach effort. Brea Envisions will provide important public input that may inform updates to certain General Plan elements, as well as the Parks, Recreation, and Human Services Master Plan. Additionally, information gleaned from the community will help guide a future Cultural Arts Master Plan. Community values identified through Brea Envisions will also help guide future projects, amenities, and of course, budget priorities.

Over the past year, Brea City Council has made a number of important decisions that have budget implications. Council made a commitment to allocate more of its water charges to fixed costs rather than commodity (usage) costs. This allocation change helps stabilize the Water Utility Fund and reduces its reliance on the

sale of water to maintain infrastructure. Among significant projects and services to which fiscal commitments were made:


- Building a new Downtown Parking Structure (\$10.7 million)
- Enhancements to Laurel Elementary/Lagos de Moreno Park (\$1.2 million)
- Contribution toward addressing unfunded pension liabilities (\$6 million)
- Contribution toward a county-wide homeless shelter (\$100,000)
- Commitment toward the continuation of animal care services with the County of Orange and a contribution toward the construction of a new animal shelter (\$38,000 annually for the next ten years)

Going forward, the City will closely watch trends such as the shift to online shopping which hurts local sales tax revenue, a major funding source. As property valuations climb and total households increase, there will be other adjustments to the General Fund ahead. Meanwhile, the City is mindful of larger economic factors such as cost-of-living increases and pension responsibilities.


The FY 2016-17 budget is balanced due to a solid foundation of fiscally conservative practices and tough strategic decisions. Brea maintains a healthy reserve balance of almost 16% of its annual expenditures, which exceeds the City's General Fund Reserve policy of 8-10%.

Property Efficiency Upgrades Keep PACE

The science of energy and water efficiency keeps advancing with many new products that reduce utility usage. These include items such as dual glazed windows, solar panels, water smart irrigation systems and tank-less water heaters.

For several years it has been possible to finance such improvements through an optional assessment placed on the property tax bill. The City of Brea does not endorse specific contractors or financial firms. It does authorize qualified lenders to use the tax bill payment option. As with any major financial transaction, consumers might want to consider this along with other available financing tools. As always, it is wise to compare bids from responsible, approved participating contractors.

If you are solicited by a contractor participating with a PACE lender, they should never infer that their particular business has been city-approved. Unfortunately, some try this approach. The City of Brea does not endorse private businesses and has only given approval to this type of financing, not to any particular contractor.



Save Water with a Sprinkler Spruce Up

Experts estimate that as much as half of outdoor water is wasted due to evaporation, wind, runoff and poor maintenance. Inefficient irrigation systems are also costing owners' big money. A leak as small as the tip of a pen could waste 6,300 gallons of water in a month. Just a single broken or missing sprinkler head could cost \$90 in wasted water over a six-month season.

Therefore, it's well worth it to spend a little time, or even to hire a professional, to check your system for optimum efficiency. The EPA WaterSense program recommends a four-step process.

1. **Inspect** the system for clogged, broken or missing links.
2. **Connect** points where sprinkler heads go into pipes or hoses.
3. **Direct** spray to only apply water onto landscape; never paved surfaces.
4. **Select** a proper timing schedule and duration. If your controller is not labeled WaterSense, it might be overdoing it.



As a reminder — Brea's Phase 2 water use guidelines are now in effect.

- Irrigate only on Mondays and/ or Thursdays
- Never water between 10 a.m. and 4 p.m.
- Sprinklers can run for no longer than 15 minutes total duration per circuit. (You can stop/start if using a cycle & soak method.)

If you observe overflow on to sidewalks or streets and can't alert the property owner, you can report a water waster online at cityofbrea.net using the selection under the "How do I?" button. A City representative will then make contact to help troubleshoot the problem.

New Park Space, Old Problem

The newest section of the Tracks at Brea Trail is getting a lot of use. Hundreds of people are enjoying this connector just as they do the many other parks and recreational spaces throughout Brea.



BOUSD Facility Work Amps Up Over Summer Vacation

While students are out enjoying their summer vacation, the Brea Olinda Unified School District (BOUSD) will be hard at work with various summer projects to ensure students are given the best possible learning environments when they return to school this fall. It's no secret that Brea schools enjoy the reputation of an outstanding school system. That does not happen by accident. However, many local schools need basic health and safety improvements because they were built decades ago, including two schools that are nearly one hundred years old.

Many are not aware that the State of California no longer provides funding to local school districts for facilities. Governor Brown has indicated that such needs must be addressed with local funds. As such, the District has identified over \$290 million in projects that are needed to maintain current facilities and provide additional facilities.

The District will begin to address these repairs over this summer:

- Replace identified carpeting and flooring at Laurel Elementary, Mariposa Elementary and Brea Olinda High School
- Restore and replace a small portion of aging and leaking roofs at multiple school sites
- Paint the interior/exterior of Laurel Elementary and the exterior of Country Hills Elementary

- Replace damaged exterior siding and concrete repairs to address standing water and flooding at Country Hills Elementary
- Replace the original 1989 Brea Olinda High School track due to safety concerns,
- Replace the asphalt at Laurel and Mariposa Elementary
- Remove the old locker area at Brea Junior High and replace it with a lunch shelter and seating for students.

While the above list is a great place to start, facility needs at Brea schools far outweigh the limited budget. Over the past several months, the District received extensive input from the community about school needs. A recently commissioned independent community survey of residents in the Brea Olinda Unified School District showed residents are interested in providing additional funding for repair and upgrades. BOUSD is appreciative of the support this community provides to Brea schools and will continue to work over the coming months to develop a plan addressing school needs and ensure Brea students are prepared for the 21st Century and beyond.

Brea Housing Rehabilitation Program Improves Appearances

Home can be a source of pride and stability, but without good maintenance it can become a problem. Necessary repairs are sometimes unaffordable, but if eligible, local homeowners can receive financing to support their rehab work.

Brea's Housing Rehabilitation Program helps assure that local housing stays in good shape by offering financial assistance for needed improvements. Federal funding is allocated through the County of Orange and can be made available to qualifying Brea homeowners. This encourages reasonable home refurbishments that are sometimes not possible for those with a limited income.
