Register into the mass notification system to be contacted via phone, email or text should an emergency threaten your Brea home or business. For those already registered, be sure to update any contact information that has changed. Go to AlertOC.com.

Only phone company landline phones are included automatically in this system. Log in to add your cell phone, work phones and email. You can register everyone in the family to be sure you all stay informed during emergencies.



Become Firewise at Your Home

Make your home and its surroundings safer from wildfire by using these tips.

- Keep lawn and landscape healthy. Remove dead plants. Water wisely and adapt for drought with California friendly plants that stay strong in the heat.
- Prune trees so low limbs are 6 to 10 feet from the ground. Remove dead or hanging branches.
- Remove leaf clutter and pine needles from gutters, decks and patios.
- Create a fire-free, 20-foot zone around your home by using nonflammable landscape materials and higher moisture plants.
- Enclose eaves and bird stops.
- Store firewood piles, propane tanks and other flammable items at least 30 feet away from the house, deck or porch.

Is Your Smoke Alarm Working?

More Americans have smoke alarms than ever before, but nearly half don't work. Without a working smoke alarm as an early warning device, fire can spread unnoticed through the home blocking escape routes and filling

rooms with deadly smoke. Make sure you're protected. When you change your clocks from daylight-savings time (November 5-6), change the batteries in your smoke alarms too.

“Run, Hide, Fight”

In light of recent terrorist threats, interest in self-protection rises. Unfortunately, there is no fail safe advice for every situation. However, experts at Homeland Security circulate these recommendations for active shooter situations.

Run - Have an escape route in mind. Leave belongings behind. Keep hands visible.

Hide - Stay out of view. Block entry to a hiding place. Silence cell phone.

Fight - If in imminent danger, a last resort is to throw items and act with physical aggression.

State Drought Orders Ease, but Conservation Still Expected

In June, the State of California modified water cutbacks it imposed in 2015. The State Water Resources Control Board updated regulations giving urban water suppliers the ability to set their own standards based on a "stress test" of supply reliability. The City of Brea's primary water supplies come from the Main San Gabriel Basin via the Cal Domestic Water Company and from the Municipal Water District of Orange County. The City of Brea calculated its conservation goal based on projected shortfalls in the Main San Gabriel Basin if this region continues to receive little or no rain, plus predicted reliability from MWDOC. The City of Brea, in its tradition of responsible and honest environmental stewardship, will pursue a 15% conservation goal in these continuing drought conditions. This allows not only for more predictable supplies, but also more stable water rates.

The majority of Brea's water is supplied through Cal Domestic Water Company, the ground water in the Main San Gabriel Basin, and supplemented by purchases through Municipal Water District of Orange County and the Metropolitan state-wide system. The cost per acre-foot of water for Brea, a stockholder in Cal Domestic, is very favorable and is a key control for moderating rates. The cost for imported water is significantly higher. Therefore, if Brea shifted into a higher percentage mix between these two sources, larger rate increases could be triggered.

Brea has determined that its best plan was to maintain a healthy balance through sustainable conservation practices. These already resulted in an overall 18% reduction due to a highly responsive public. While there remains an option to increase purchases through Cal Domestic or MWDOC, the City has chosen to support predictable supplies and more stable water rates for its valued customers.

New Construction Reflects Brea's Strong Economy

It is easy to observe construction activity around town as new investment in the community remains strong. Here are some of the major developments in the works.

- On the east side of town, La Floresta has opened the commercial corner of their master planned community. Next to the Village area, 204 apartments and eight live-work units are being built with completion anticipated in Fall of 2017. The final area is under planning review. It will incorporate age-qualified housing with stacked flats, detached condos and some small lot single-family units. Townhomes will be built to complete the west side of the street near Birch Hills Golf Course.
- To the northwest, Central Park Village has submitted plans for 35,000 square feet of medical offices. 'The Element' condominiums are already well under construction. Next, new apartment housing will be constructed on the property between Site Drive and Tamarack. Western National Group will own and operate these 206 new units along with their other six Brea properties.
- Centrally located, a proposed mixed-use project to be called Brea Place is also under review. To be located near the corner of Birch Street and State College Boulevard, it will encompass two apartment buildings for a total 750 units plus a full-service hotel. Special attention will be paid to active streetscape, connectivity to The Tracks at Brea Trail and to retain a Thursday Farmer's Market within the site.

- Downtown keeps evolving with increased focus on leisure pursuits. A new Improv has been proposed with a second design concept in development that would incorporate the current Old Navy building in a one-story venue. The re-design includes a 560-seat theatre, plus an open concept street dining.
- Progress has been made toward adding an east-side parking structure behind the Buffalo Wild Wings and old Tower Records building. Site grading is anticipated for October, design completion in November with a quick construction start to follow in December. Completion is anticipated in October 2017. At this point, the parking structure is being designed to be four stories, one ground level with three levels up, for a total of 478 parking stalls, a net increase of 300 stalls from the existing surface lot. The entire budgeted amount to build the structure is \$10.3 million with a variety of City funds directed to this project.
- Reinvestment has resulted in two significant industrial sites undergoing a transformation. The 17-acre plot at 1225 West Imperial Highway will host a 367,194 square foot building housing two tenants, one of which handles commercial refrigeration and kitchen equipment for caterers. On a 7-acre site, at 3333 East Birch Street, a new 215,000 square foot building for industrial uses is under construction.

BOUSD School Bus Safety Goes High Tech With New Tracking

The Brea Olinda Unified School District prides itself on continuously making decisions with student safety as its highest priority. As such, the District is introducing GPS and student tracking from Zonar Systems, throughout its fleet of buses just in the time for the new school year.

"When it comes to our students, we take pride and care in meeting their transportation needs, said Superintendent, Brad Mason. Our proactive use of the Zonar System will enhance our ability to more thoroughly monitor the safety of our students."

Zonar provides GPS fleet tracking, Radio Frequency Identification Device (RFID) scanning and management solutions for large operations, such as a school district with many buses. With this system, designated district employees have access to see a live GPS feed. The feed displays bus locations, safety details, and other pertinent information in real-time.

Additionally, all bus drivers, even substitutes, must complete mandatory student checks with an electronic scanner at the end of each route or field trip. Routinely, all inspections and student checks are monitored by the

dispatch command center. With a handheld electronic scanner, driver's must also walk the entire length of the bus and scan designated points on the interior and exterior to start and complete their route. In addition to all of these safety measures, the district has also implemented the Zonar feature, Z Pass.

With the help of Zonar, the District obtained a grant for \$26,000 from the National Pupil Transportation Association (NPTA) to pay for equipment for all nineteen buses and six white fleet vehicles. Students will scan their bus passes when they enter and exit the bus allowing the district to know exactly when and where students were picked up and dropped off. In the unlikely event of a bus accident, designated transportation staff will know which students were on the bus so that parents can be contacted more efficiently.

Mason also heavily emphasized the importance and peace of mind that the system offers to the district in situations of parental or community concern.

Sharing the Property Tax Pie

At this time of year, the pile of bills for homeowners includes their latest property tax statement. Depending on the value of a particular home and the length of ownership, these bills vary widely. Before you pull out the checkbook, perhaps take a moment and consider how your property tax money will be distributed once it is sent into the County of Orange.

As illustrated, schools receive the greatest portion of proceeds, followed by the county, which provides such services as flood control, libraries, transportation, vector control, harbors and beaches. On average cities get about 21% as the share returned to them. This becomes their base for providing other essentials residents need and expect from cities such as public safety, sewer and water, local roads and community parks.

Using the example here, this homeowner pays less than \$70 a month towards the cost of living in Brea. Of course, the actual value of services provided to them will far exceed this amount. The high quality of life enjoyed here would not be possible if it were not for the fact that Brea has worked hard to develop additional income streams. Diversified commerce makes the city a business hub and sales tax has grown into a larger funding source than property taxes. City leaders constantly look ahead to keep balance in new development and assure that the burden of providing new infrastructure, safety and human services can be covered.






Coed Softball

Tracks at Brea Trail Makes Steady Progress

The Tracks at Brea Trail is hosting many visitors along the recently added Segment 3 between Brea Boulevard and State College. With Active Transportation Program (ATP) grants, more improvements are anticipated in the future. These would include a restroom, drinking fountain, fitness equipment, seating, bike rack and a butterfly garden.

Segment 5 is next to open this fall. It runs through the Birch Hills Golf Course and features an interpretive area about the Red Line electric railroad that once ran through Brea. Early in 2017, construction is expected to get underway for Segments 2 and 6. Located between Kraemer and Valencia, Segment 6 will get a boost from a recent, additional ATP grant for \$652,000. Plans are being completed for Segment 4, which is targeted for a mid-2017 start of construction.

The Tracks project has required long-term focus as millions of dollars in grants were acquired over time, real estate was transacted and complex soils mitigation work was executed. As the various segments are phased in, the public is reminded that it is important to be good stewards of this prized community amenity. Please stay on the pathways and do not disturb plants. In many places landscape is still being established. Common courtesy dictates that pet owners be responsible for pet waste. This and all trash needs to be properly disposed of in receptacles provided along the trail.

Mosquitos Pose Threat of West Nile Virus and Other Diseases

The City of Brea will be diligent to eliminate standing water on public properties where disease carrying mosquitoes might breed. However, private citizens must also remove hazards on residential and commercial properties.

The most effective way to reduce the chances of mosquito bites is to reduce places where mosquitoes can develop. Half of the mosquitoes produced in Orange County come from residential backyards. Check homes and workplaces for potential mosquito breeding sites. Anything that can hold water for a week can produce mosquitoes. You will be surprised at the number of places in your yard with standing water; even a tablespoonful or two that remains for a week is capable of producing mosquitoes.

An easy step to reduce the chance of a mosquito bite is to check window screens and make sure they fit and are in good repair. Window screens are the greatest single factor in reducing mosquito-borne diseases; more effective than any chemical ever used to control the mosquitoes themselves.


