Brea Launches a Redesigned City Website

The official website of the City of Brea has just re-launched with improved functionality backing up a fresh and bright appearance. Go to cityofbrea.net and check out the new look!

[Cityofbrea.net](http://cityofbrea.net) is organized with multiple choices immediately revealed under each of three main headers. **Your Government** collects official documents and articles related to oversight of the City of Brea. **Our Community** is a blend of information about living or working in Brea and the full range of public activities offered here. **City Services** gets

down to business by organizing around departments responsible for various categories of work. As site users click through selections, a list of left-hand links carries through with expanded choices related to a particular topic.

Tell Us remains as an open invitation to contact the City. Messages are dispersed to the appropriate internal department and are tracked for response. **Notify Me** is a way to sign up for automatic updates on topics of interest. There is also an option for site users to create a personal dashboard for items referred to frequently. Also of note is that some departments will keep their own calendar or news items displayed on their pages.



During the past decade, as people have become more accustomed to doing business online, Brea gradually outgrew its earlier web software. Now users can find more direct links than ever before for making reports or filing forms. As this new website's content gets refined, more powerful navigation will make it easier to find information as it comes online.

Brea Wildcatters Park Opens

Wildcatters Park, Brea's newest outdoor attraction, opens on July 1 welcoming residents to the foothills. Located at the northwest corner of Valencia Avenue and Santa Fe Road, it is a bonus from the new Blackstone neighborhood.

This 16-acre park adds another baseball field and overlapping foot-ball/soccer field to Brea's inventory. There is also a basketball court, children's playground with shade structures, various open areas with picnic shelters, barbecues and turf, plus a .6 mile perimeter walking trail. Two restroom locations and a concession stand are also available to park users. Parking is available in two on-site lots with additional parking along Santa Fe Road.

The Brea Parks, Recreation & Human Services Commission, along with youth sports groups, participated through the planning stages of the park, which is named with a nod to the late 1800s and early settlers there. A "wildcatter" is an oil person who drills exploratory wells in an area not known to be productive. The new Wildcatters Park will surely be productive by creating recreational opportunities for the entire community.

Brea Continues with Balanced Budget for 2013-14

The Brea City Council recently approved a new budget for Fiscal Year 2013 -2014. Building upon the past five years of planned organizational restructuring, the City has protected all core services through very difficult times. And even while maintaining what is essentially a flat budget, Brea still is moving key projects ahead.


This month, the new Wildcatters Park in the Blackstone neighborhood opens for public use. Nearby, a one-acre dog park is currently under construction with areas segregated for small and large dogs. The new budget also includes significant commitments to maintaining Brea's quality infrastructure. It identifies 41 CIP projects worth \$25 million. Among these are sewer and water main replacements, traffic signal synchronizations and street refurbishment. Funding streams rely on federal, state and county grants, which Brea always maximizes to the benefit of taxpayers. A good example of this is the "Tracks at Brea" project, which has attracted about \$6 million in grants for land purchases and soil remediation. This project continues despite the elimination of redevelopment as a funding mechanism.

Looking ahead, another project called Envision 2035 gets underway in the new fiscal year. This will be a comprehensive outreach to help set a future direction for Brea. In addition, the process will result in tangible, required updates to both the city's General Plan and Master Plan for Parks, Recreation and Human Services, plus a draft for a Cultural Arts Master Plan.


Among recent challenges, the City continues a transition into a Brea-only police department. The City is looking ahead for regional opportunities that could help contain law enforcement support costs among a group of north county agencies. Employees throughout the Brea organization are making increased contributions toward retirement costs. And as a next step to the internal re-organization over the past few years, succession planning is an active topic. Looking ahead during FY 2013-14, City staff will use a variety of tools such as looking strategically at vacancies, seeking entrepreneurial efforts, and consolidating functions to structurally balance budgets and maintain high reserves.

Water = Power: Double Your Summer Savings Effort





Record Number Earn Mayor's Youth Award

Volunteerism and service to the community are long-standing traditions here in Brea. The Mayor's Youth Community Service Award program was designed to help instill a life-long habit of giving for the greater good of the community.

This year, 41 juniors and 59 seniors volunteered a total of 23,694 hours of community service and have received this year's City of Brea Mayor's Youth Community Service Award. To see the full list of recipients, go to cityofbrea.net.



Brea Reaches ELP Summit with Platinum Tier

The City of Brea has climbed to the peak of the proverbial SCE Energy Leader Partnership mountain in the first quarter of 2013 by elevating to the ELP Platinum tier! Brea is only the third City within all of SCE territory, and the first Community Energy Partnership City, to achieve this major accomplishment. The Council accepted the award from Southern California Edison representatives at their June 18 meeting.

Brea reached Platinum by achieving energy consumption reductions of more than 30% in their municipal buildings since 2006. The City's efforts have cut energy use by over 9 million kWh, avoiding almost as many greenhouse gas emissions, and saving close to \$1.4 million! Recent municipal project highlights include street light upgrades which accounted for 1.2 million kWh savings and a Civic Center installation of energy efficient lighting and controls which accounted for more than 300,000 kWh savings.

Thanks to the City's marketing and outreach efforts, Brea's Lake Park Community boosted the number of home energy efficiency upgrades through the SCE/SCG Comprehensive Manufactured Home Energy Efficiency Program by a CEP-record 13%. Additionally, the City has implemented an ambitious Energy Action Plan and adopted strong Demand Response programs.



The Lake Park community at Central and Puente is not only beautiful outside, many of the residences are saving money inside with participation in SCE energy efficiency programs.

Other municipal energy projects will continue and over time business and community member efforts are expected to multiply inspired by the City's success as an energy leader.



Take a Hike in the Hills

Get active and take an outdoor hike on the Olinda Oil Museum Trail to retrace steps of the oil settlers who were here over 100 years ago. Set your own pace and head into the hills on this moderate one-mile loop where you can enjoy spectacular panoramic views on a clear day. Fire Station 4 To Augment Canyon Protection

Carbon Canyon will have a new Fire Station 4 serving as an outpost for the urban-wild land interface this fall. Land purchase is completed on a 14,000 square foot parcel at the northern end of the Olinda Village Center. Plans are finalized and the contract is set for construction to begin early summer.



A 1,500 square foot modular building will be paired with an accessory "butler building" for fire apparatus to create the new Fire Station 4. It will house live and work space for the assigned crews. The station will also incorporate numerous energy saving and earth-friendly features fitting the natural environment of Carbon Canyon.

This long-awaited community improvement will be an important complement to residents' voluntary efforts to maintain safe surroundings. Following construction, the CERT emergency preparedness container will be moved onsite nearby the professional responders. The Brea Fire Department looks forward to moving into this highly functional new space in the canyon.
