RECOMMENDATION

Initiate discussion of a potential partnership for Information Technology (IT) services and options and identify the subsequent course of action.

SUMMARY

The purpose of the discussion is to begin a conversation on IT options and possible future timelines.

DISCUSSION

Brea IT was established in 1987 and began providing computer support services to other municipalities in 1993. Brea IT understands the intricacies of local government agencies and has expertise in strategic planning, programming, customized reporting, and training. They recognize the varying needs of work in a government setting. (e.g., Police and Public Works Departments' 24-hour operations, 911 emergency response, etc.).

Information technology services between cities can offer many benefits, such as enhanced citizen services, cost savings, improved effectiveness by standardizing procedures and expertise that can streamline operations and improve service delivery, and increased cooperation as collective IT services can facilitate valuable innovation and collaboration. Shared IT services can leverage strengths, reduce costs, and benefit IT operations effectiveness and efficiencies.

Thoughtful planning, strategic decision-making, and collaboration are key to successfully sharing IT services between cities. As a result, this discussion intends to initiate a conversation on IT options and potential timelines. Areas for potential collaboration, challenges, and a framework for comprehensively implementing shared IT services will be explored to achieve optimal results.
